Monday, September 15, 2025 - 6:00 PM

I. Call Public Meeting to Order

Mayor McCallum called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Present were Mayor Tim McCallum, Mayor Pro Tem Mark Moeller, and Councilmembers Sedric Thomas, Melba Jeffus, Anna Campbell, Dennis Lewis and Richard Henson. Also present were City Manager Mary Smith, Assistant City Manager Joey Boyd and City Attorney Frank Garza.

II. Invocation and Pledge of Allegiance - Mayor Pro Tem Moeller

Mayor Pro Tem Moeller delivered the invocation and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

III. Proclamations / Awards / Recognitions

Constitution Week Proclamation

Mayor McCallum called forth representatives from the Daughters of the American Revolution (DAR). Following the reading of the proclamation, DAR representatives, including Mrs. Marilyn King, briefly spoke, thanking the mayor and city for its support and encouraging everyone to take time to read through the U.S. Constitution.

2. American Legion Day Proclamation

Mayor McCallum then called forth members of the local American Legion post. He read and presented the proclamation. A representative from the Legion said a few, brief words.

Before moving on with the remainder of the agenda, the mayor briefly spoke, reminding everyone that "freedom isn't free," sharing that it is okay to defend one's ideals, but it is not okay to revert to violence. He then called for a brief moment of silence in remembrance of Charlie Kirk, a prominent, nationwide public speaker, who was recently shot and killed while speaking at an event at Utah Valley University.

IV. Appointment Items

1. Appointment with Planning & Zoning Commission representative to discuss and answer any questions regarding planning-related cases on the agenda.

Dr. Jean Conway, Chair of the city's P&Z Commission, came forth and briefed the Council on recommendations of the Commission relative to planning-related items on tonight's meeting

agenda. Indication was given that Commissioner Hagaman was also selected as the P&Z's Vice Chair. Council took no action following Dr. Conway's comments.

V. Open Forum

Mayor McCallum explained how Open Forum is conducted, asking if anyone would like to come forth and speak at this time.

Patty Griffin 2140 Airport Rd Rockwall, TX 75087

Mrs. Griffin came forth and shared that she has concern about parking along Airport Road, specifically the section of roadway that's located by the public baseball fields. She explained that the parking along this area is very dangerous, especially for pedestrians – including small children – who are crossing this roadway when games are taking place. She went on to share some examples of her own, personal experiences with driving along this roadway when children and families are utilizing the baseball fields, generally indicating some 'near misses' of almost hitting pedestrians with her vehicle while driving. She respectfully requested the city conduct a traffic and hazard analysis and explore alternative parking solutions to alleviate congestion. She went on to express several additional suggestions related to possible solutions the city may want to consider pertaining to these parking, pedestrian, and vehicular-related concerns.

Bob Wacker 309 Featherstone Rockwall, TX

Mr. Wacker shared that his granddaughter is in the Rockwall Heath band, and he has concerns that there may not be enough handicap parking at the high school football stadium. Regarding economic development, he'd like to see a little bit more accountability as far as what properties the REDC was involved in, what investments they've made and what the returns have been over the years. Thirdly, regarding the city budget, he shared that people do not realize how much the city has saved taxpayers over the years, and now it's time for a slight tax rate increase. He expressed that the city manager and staff are doing a great job and he seemed to speak in favor of the rate increase.

Ryan Joyce 2201 Sanderson Lane Rockwall, TX 75087

Mr. Joyce came forth, expressing he is addressing the Council this evening as a citizen. As a developer, he has repeatedly heard how Rockwall desires to be a really great community. He indicated that, in order to do so, certain things need to transpire. He went on to point out some tax rates he's researched that other, nearby cities have in place, and they are higher. He shared that what's being considered is about a penny, which is not much. He went on to provide high compliments regarding city staff, sharing that Rockwall has great staff, and he has worked with staff in thirty-four other cities around the metroplex. He believes Rockwall's staff is comprised of the best people to work with, they work harder than any other staff members in other cities, and Rockwall's staff is always willing to help. He went on to express that people move to Rockwall for 3 reasons –

(1) it's a great community; (2) it's got a high safety rate; and (3) it has a great school district. He shared he has no problem paying to have and maintain a great city, and he has no problem with the proposed tax rate.

Kevin Folsom 1115 Bayshore Drive Rockwall, TX

Mr. Folsom thanked the Council for bringing Jesus Christ into the meeting. He thanked Travis Sales, Parks Director, expressing he has done a lot of good things throughout the City, and he appreciates him and his efforts. He also thanked Mayor McCallum and Councilmember Jeffus for recently meeting in a nearby home to hear neighbors' concerns about the upcoming SH-66 boat ramp parking lot project. He went on to share that Rockwall has challenges pertaining to development, and he has been supportive of those. He briefly mentioned the 190 spur (roadway) project that was being proposed in the N. part of Rockwall as a possible way to alleviate some of the traffic concerns.

He then spoke in more detail regarding the area of Lakeshore at Willowbend (the upcoming additional parking at / near the SH-66 boat ramp) - he knows that a parking lot along the lakeside is inevitable; however, he expressed that he and some of his neighbors have concern about this, and they would like to be heard. He acknowledged his understanding that the city has secured a very large grant to help fund this project and that he knows the parking lot will be installed no matter what he and his neighbors have to say about it. He shared that neighbors missed an opportunity to speak about this parking lot that was previously approved by the City Council. He indicated that three other, nearby public boat ramps in adjacent cities have been closed over the last ten years. He went on to share several concerns about the impending parking lot and how he believes it will negatively impact those who live adjacent to it. He understands the parking lot is coming, no matter what, but he urged the Council to hear input from those who live nearby. He wonders what will be done to address the increased traffic that will occur back there, pointing out that a person in a motorized wheelchair is currently often seen traveling up and down this area. He made some suggestions about the layout, and shared that he and others would like the open space area to remain open and to have the parking lot relocated.

Stephanie Folsom 1115 Bayshore Rockwall, TX

Mrs. Folsom implored the Council to place this topic on a future Council meeting agenda to hear input from the neighbors who live near the parking lot that will be added near the SH-66 boat ramp. She is very concerned about the lakefront, open green space going away in favor of 40 concrete parking spaces. She explained she and her husband live directly in front of the green space. She explained that perhaps 2-3 times per year, some people do park in that open green space, but it is not enough to warrant turning it into a parking lot since she believes it will only be used 2-3 times per year. She went on to share that it's not in the best interest of the neighborhood or the community as a whole to turn this green space into a public parking lot.

Lindsay Orellana 101 Highcrest Lane

Rockwall, TX

Mrs. Orellana shared that she and her family just moved to this home, and it's located by the SH-66 boat ramp. She shared that not long ago, she met the mayor and Councilmember Jeffus at a meeting that was held at her neighbor's home, and she had a chance to review the plans at that time. Even though the parking lot plans have already been approved, she urged Council to hear the concerns of residents that have homes adjacent to the area. She shared that she has concerns about the only public open green space area along the lake being turned into a parking lot. She urged Council to limit the number of parking spots and, instead, dedicate some of the area for alternative amenities. For example, instead of four park benches with a walking trail, she suggested that Council consider some playground equipment. She urged Council to place this on an October meeting agenda, and she encouraged the Council to keep this space green and not gray.

Cameron Parker 205 W. Rusk St. Rockwall, TX 75087

Mr. Parker came forth on behalf of the Rockwall Police Department and the Rockwall Police Association. He expressed that regardless of what's led us to this point, we cannot continue to pass the buck. For a long time the city manager and department directors have been asked to do more with less. He shared that the City of Rockwall has 6.5 city employees per 1,000 residents, as compared to 8.72 average number of employees per 1,000 residents in other, metroplex market cities, and - this time - no new staff positions are even being requested. He went on to share information about the over 40% of active City of Rockwall employs who are below 5% of the average pay when compared to other market cities in the area, and the more than 27% of employees who are between the average market pay and 5% below it. He stressed the importance of competitive pay regarding salaries. He shared details of Police Department testing and vetting processes related to the hiring, training and employment process for new, sworn police officers, sharing how the pool of police applicants has significantly diminished over the last ten years. He stressed that if you're not paying at the top of the market, you're not going to attract the top candidates. He went on to share further details regarding challenges associated with recruiting applicants and getting them to oral boards, hired, trained, etc. Due to hiring challenges, the PD's patrol numbers remain stagnant annually while call volumes have continued to increase over the last five years. He shared that priority 1 calls (more serious ones requiring lights and sirens) have increased 61%, and priority 2 calls have increased 210%. Accident-related calls for service have increased 68% in the last five years. He highly stressed the importance of ensuring competitive pay because not doing so runs the risk of creating in our community longer response times and burned out first responders. He urged Council to pass the proposed increase tonight and ensure that all city employees - not just first responders are competitively paid.

Laurie Burks 205 W. Rusk Rockwall, TX

Ms. Burks came forth, sharing that she is a detective with the Rockwall Police Department, and she has been employed by the Rockwall PD for twenty-two years. She indicated she is speaking tonight on behalf of the staff of the Rockwall PD. She shared details about the difficulties in recruiting, hiring

and retaining sworn officers. She shared that years ago in 2003, we had as many as forty applicants showing up for police testing; however, now testing is being offered once per month and only about seven are showing up to test. Hiring is challenging, in part because not many are wanting to become police officers anymore. She expressed that the city manager has been doing a good job over the years to try and do what's best - not only for public safety employees - but also for staff employed citywide throughout the organization, but she questions how the city manager is supposed to effectively do that when the tax rate continues to be lowered each year. She pointed out that our tax rate is notably lower than other cities, with Wylie's tax rate being at .543 cents. She shared comments about market city salary studies, pointing out that making salary comparisons against other cities in the metroplex is not something solely reserved to our city - rather, it is how cities compete for employees, provide competitive pay, and retain employees. She shared that she heard at the last council meeting some councilmembers say their voters asked them to not vote for this small tax rate increase. She expressed she is not sure Council fully understands who their voters are, indicating that about 35% of city employees live within the City of Rockwall and are voters. She thanked those councilmembers who are doing what's right for our employees, especially when they realize doing the right thing, regardless of what may have been said to get elected, is hard.

Alysia Villarreal 205 W. Rusk St Rockwall, TX

Ms. Villarreal came forth and shared that she is one of the city's telecommunications supervisors (in Dispatch), and she and her team answer fire and police 911 and non-emergency calls for both our city and for the City of Heath. Also, she explained that our city is unique in that Dispatch handles all after hours calls for departments citywide. For example, after hours emergency water shut offs at residential homes; snakes and other animal services calls; damaged playground equipment with the Parks Department and the need for erecting a stop sign in the middle of the night through the Streets Department after a drunk driver took out the existing sign. She went on to share details about increased call volumes, lack of personnel, and ongoing challenges with employee retention. She shared that last year her department answered 41,697 emergency 9-1-1 calls, and the national standard is to have 97% of those calls answered within 15 seconds. Her department did so with 98% of the callas last year. She shared details about the terrible winter storm in 2021 when her department answered 2,100 administrative calls, 831 emergency 9-1-1 calls, with 99% of the calls being answered within four seconds. She pointed out that her department personnel wear many hats, and losing dispatchers to other cities such as Garland or Richardson could very easily happen since – in those other dispatch centers – dispatchers focus on one job instead of filling multiple roles. She went on to share that she personally has lived in Rockwall since 2012, and serving her own community has given her a great sense of purpose. She loves what she does and she shares the goal of being able to provide a safe place for everyone with high quality services for our citizens.

Michael Caffey 311 S. Fannin 305 E. Boydstun (fire station address) Rockwall, TX 75087

Mr. Caffey, Rockwall Firefighters Association, came forth and thanked Council for what they do, acknowledging it's a tough job. He remains confused as to how three Councilmembers remain

opposed to a one cent tax rate increase, pointing out that even this potential tax increase will not fully address employee pay. Even if salaries are adjusted 5% it will not get most employees even up to market, and it will not fortify our city services, which are just as important. He shared that to not approve this budget would essentially serve to indirectly defund public safety. If Council continues to lower or flatten the tax rate, the city will not be able to operate on a high level, which is what our citizens expect. He shared that our tax rate is the lowest, or for sure one of the lowest, and we continue to have less employees per capita when compared to other market cities. And, although we have not yet lost firefighters to other cities - he just found out new news that two existing firefighters are in a hiring process elsewhere, and two more are beginning a hiring process elsewhere. He pointed out additional needs of the Fire Department, including stations that were never meant to house firefighters overnight because they were built at a time when our department was heavily volunteer-based. Now, those stations need improvements, and a fire training facility is also a need, as the Lakepointe parking lot is not sufficient. He went on to share that he personally is a taxpayer here, and he understands the importance of conservative, fiscal responsibility. However, he believes that citizens want and deserve top notch public safety services, which are not accomplished through mediocre pay that, in many cases, is 'under market.' He expressed that Councilmember Campbell stated it best at the last council meeting when she said, "we do not want to be viewed as mediocre, and we do not want to weaken our public safety. Mr. Caffey went on to withdraw his previous comments that the fountain at The Harbor should not be repaired. He retracted that prior comment, acknowledging he did not realize how important that fountain is to many people. As such, he believes that retracting his prior comments and stance on that topic, that is proof that it is possible to change your mind and change your vote.

Councilmember Lewis moved to approve the entire Consent Agenda (#s 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, and 7). Mayor Pro Tem Moeller seconded the motion. The ordinance caption was read as follows:

The motion to approve the Consent Agenda passed by a vote of 7 ayes to 0 nays.

Mayor McCallum then reordered the agenda to address Action Item #1 next (appointments to the city's Youth Advisory Council (YAC)).

VII. Public Hearing Items

1. **Z2025-050** - Hold a public hearing to discuss and consider the approval of an **ordinance** for a <u>Text Amendment</u> to Article 11, <u>Development Applications and Review Procedures</u>, of the Unified Development Code (UDC) for the purpose of establishing requirements that relate to an applicant's failure to appear at a public hearing, and take any action necessary (1st Reading).

Planning Director, Ryan Miller provided background information concerning this agenda item, explaining this is a city-initiated request proposing a text amendment to Article 11 of the Unified Development Code, specifically addressing the failure of an applicant to appear at a scheduled public meeting. Over the past year, staff has observed several instances where applicants have failed to attend their scheduled public hearings before various boards such as Planning and Zoning, Historic Preservation Advisory Board, or the City Council. He explained that the absence of an applicant can

limit the ability of the decision-making body to ask questions, receive clarifications, and ultimately render deliberation and decisions regarding a case. So to address this issue, the city attorney has recommended the addition of some language regarding failure of an applicant to appear before the city council or other city boards and commissions. Mr. Miller shared that staff posted notice of this public hearing in the Herald Banner Newspaper, as required by state law, and the Planning & Zoning Commission has recommended approval of this item by a vote of 7 to 0.

Mayor McCallum opened the public hearing, but no one indicated a desire to speak. So, he closed the public hearing.

Mayor McCallum shared that he is the one who brought forth this topic, as he believes it is inconsiderate for applicants to not show up at public meetings, such as the Planning & Zoning Commission or Council meetings, when their item(s) is being discussed and considered.

Following brief, clarifying comments, Councilmember Henson moved to approve Z2025-050. Mayor Pro Tem Moeller seconded the motion. The ordinance caption was read as follows:

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROCKWALL, TEXAS, AMENDING THE UNIFIED DEVELOPMENT CODE [ORDINANCE NO. 20-02] OF THE CITY OF ROCKWALL, AS HERETOFORE AMENDED, BY AMENDING ARTICLE 11, DEVELOPMENT REVIEW PROCEDURES, AS DEPICTED IN EXHIBIT 'A' OF THIS ORDINANCE; PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY OF FINE NOT TO EXCEED THE SUM OF TWO THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$2,000.00) FOR EACH OFFENSE; PROVIDING FOR A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR A REPEALER CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

The motion to approve passed by a vote of 7 ayes to 0 nays.

2. **Z2025-051** - Hold a public hearing to discuss and consider the approval of an **ordinance** for a <u>Text Amendment</u> to Article 12, <u>Enforcement</u>, of the Unified Development Code (UDC) for the purpose of establishing an expiration date for building permits that are dormant or show little progress towards completion, and take any action necessary **(1st Reading)**.

Planning Director, Ryan Miller, provided background information regarding this agenda item. He explained that, under the requirements of the International Building Code (IBC) a building permit is valid for a period of six (6) months or 180 days. He shared brief details regarding sections of the International Building Code that outline the expiration period, the validity of a building permit, and when a permit can be suspended or revoked. He went on to explain that this ordinance will provide a tool to allow staff to administratively address building projects that have become stagnated. He explained that there have been some certain situations where projects have remained incomplete for an extended period of time, sometimes well over a year, while the adjacent property owners have basically been left living next to an ongoing or stagnant construction site. With this new ordinance, any building permit issued after October 6, 2025 will expire six months from the issuance, if no progress has been made as determined by the Chief Building Official. Also, building permits

issued before October 6, 2025 will expire two years from the date they were issued. He explained that there will be an appeal process in place. He further shared that staff posted notice of this public hearing in the Herald Banner as prescribed by law. In addition, the P&Z Commission has recommended approval of this item by a vote of 5 ayes to 2 nays.

Mayor McCallum then opened the public hearing, asking if anyone would like to come forth and speak at this time.

Bob Wacker 309 Featherstone Rockwall, TX

Mr. Wacker wonders if these new regulations will impact the upcoming apartments near the downtown square. Mr. Miller indicated that a building permit was just recently pulled for that project. It had been delayed, in part, due to having to work out some issues with Oncor.

There being no one else wishing to come forth and speak, Mayor McCallum closed the public hearing.

Mayor Pro Tem Moeller asked if the Building Official could potentially grant multiple extensions on building permits issued, beyond just one extension. Mr. Miller shared that, yes, it does allow for multiple extensions at the discretion of the Building Official. Mayor Pro Tem Moeller expressed a little concern about the potential for unlimited extensions potentially being granted.

Councilmember Lewis shared that a home in his own neighborhood once took three years to complete, so he is in support of these new regulations. He then moved to approve Z2025-051. Councilmember Campbell seconded the motion.

After brief comments of support by Mayor McCallum, the ordinance caption was read as follows:

The motion passed by a vote of 7 ayes to 0 nays.

3. **Z2025-052** - Hold a public hearing to discuss and consider the approval of an **ordinance** for a <u>Text Amendment</u> to Subsection 06.05, <u>Southside Residential Neighborhood Overlay (SRO)</u> <u>District</u>, of Article 05, <u>District Development Standards</u>, of the Unified Development Code (UDC) for the purpose of making changes to the boundary and development requirements

of the Southside Residential Neighborhood Overlay (SRO) District, and take any action necessary (1st Reading).

Planning Director, Ryan Miller, provided background information regarding this agenda item. On June 16, 2025, the City Council approved a motion to direct staff to review the Southside Residential Neighborhood Overlay (SRO) District and provide recommendations for updates to the district. This motion was approved by a vote of 6-0, with Council Member Campbell absent. Based on this direction staff performed a comprehensive review of the overlay district, and returned to the City Council with three (3) recommendations on August 18, 2025. The recommendations proposed by staff were as follows: (1) Recommendation 1. Adjust the boundaries of the Southside Residential Neighborhood Overlay (SRO) District to remove the commercially zoned properties; (2) Recommendation 2. Remove the reduced standards contained within the overlay district and allow the underlying zoning to regulate the density and dimensional requirements for properties; and (3) Recommendation 3. Initiate zoning to change the Multi-Family 14 (MF-14) District to Single-Family 7 (SF-7) District to make the zoning more uniform in the overlay district. After reviewing the recommendations, the City Council approved a motion to move forward with all three (3) recommendations. This motion was approved by a vote of 5-1, with Councilmember Campbell dissenting and Councilmember Lewis absent. Based on this direction, staff has initiated two (2) zoning cases, one (1) that covers Recommendations 1 & 2 (i.e. this case -- Case No. Z2025-052) and one (1) that covers Recommendation 3 (i.e. Z2025-061). The reason that the recommendations are being taken forward in two (2) cases is tied to the intent of the cases and how the cases are required to be notified in accordance with the requirements of the Unified Development Code (UDC) and the **Texas Local Government Code (TLGC).**

Mr. Miller explained that this district was originally established in 1996, and it covers approximately 44 acres, encompassing 145 parcels of land. About 75% of this area is zoned for single family 7. There are smaller portions that are zoned for non-residential uses, like Planned Development District 52, Commercial District, and then there's a small block of only 14. Many of the lots in this neighborhood are smaller, legally non-reforming parcels, and the overlay district's reduced standards were originally designed to accommodate these lots. However, after review, staff determined that the single family 7 standards provide sufficient regulation. He went on to explain that the overlay district should ultimately defer to the underlying zoning. The overlay would still retain the ability for property owners who can't meet these requirements for whatever reason to come before the Planning and Zoning Commission and the City Council to make a special request. Under those provisions, Council will have the authority to grant relief as opposed to the typical way that it's done in other districts where the Board of Adjustments, a quasi-judicial board, would be the one that would hear and consider granting the variances. He explained that the only way to repeal a BOA decision is to challenge it in court.

Mr. Miller went on to explain that on September 9, 2025, the city's Planning and Zoning Commission approved a motion to recommend approval of this item to the Council by a vote of 7 to 0. In addition, staff sent out a 15-day notice to the newspaper (Rockwall Herald Banner) in accordance with all applicable state laws and Section 02.03(A)(3) of Article 11, Development Applications and Review Procedures, of the Unified Development Code (UDC), a notice of public hearing to all property owners and occupants within the Southside Residential Neighborhood Overlay (SRO) District, and to all property owners and occupants within 500-feet of the district. At this time, staff has received one notice in support of the proposed zoning changes. Again, the purpose of the

amendment is to better align with the original intent of the establishment of the PD to protect and preserve the residential character of the Southside neighborhood.

Mayor McCallum opened the public hearing, asking if anyone would like to speak. There being no one wishing to come forth to speak at this time, so the mayor then closed the public hearing.

Councilmember Campbell commented, sharing that she previously was the one dissenting Council vote on this issue, as she has concerns about Recommendation No. 2 possibly having an adverse impact on existing residents in the Southside neighborhood. She requested that Council consider the recommendations as separate motions.

Councilmember Campbell moved to approve Recommendation #1 to adjust the boundaries of the Southside Residential Overlay District to remove the Commercial zoned properties. Mayor McCallum seconded the motion. The ordinance caption was read as follows:

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROCKWALL, TEXAS, AMENDING THE UNIFIED DEVELOPMENT CODE [ORDINANCE NO. 20-02] OF THE CITY OF ROCKWALL, AS HERETOFORE AMENDED, BY AMENDING SUBSECTION 06.05, SOUTHSIDE RESIDENTIAL NEIGHBORHOOD OVERLAY (SRO) DISTRICT, OF ARTICLE 05, DISTRICT DEVELOPMENT STANDARDS, EXHIBITS 'A' THROUGH 'E' OF THIS ORDINANCE; PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY OF FINE NOT TO EXCEED THE SUM OF TWO THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$2,000.00) FOR EACH OFFENSE; PROVIDING FOR A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR A REPEALER CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

The motion passed by a vote of 7 ayes to 0 nays.

Councilmember Campbell moved to deny Recommendation No. 2 - which is related to removal of the reduced standards contained within the overlay district and allow the underlying zoning to regulate the density and dimensional requirements for properties - due to possible additional hardships it may pose on current residents within the neighborhood. Councilmember Lewis seconded the motion so that it could be discussed further. He then asked Mr. Miller to further explain this particular recommendation. Mr. Miller went on to clarify that this recommendation would effectively do the following: It would require an increased lot area of 2,000 square feet, an increased lot width of 10 feet, an increased dwelling unit size of 200 feet (so moving to a minimum 1,100 square feet), and the abutting street setback would increase by five feet; the lot coverage would increase by five percent, so they'd be allowed to cover 45' of the lot as opposed to 40'. So, Mr. Miller explained, there is some benefit on both sides.

Councilmember Campbell went on to clarify her concerns further. For example, if — God forbid — a current resident experienced a hardship such as a fire, in order to rebuild, the resident would have to meet this new requirement; or, they would have to request special permission to rebuild if they wanted to rebuild a home that — for example — is less than 1,100 square feet.

Mayor McCallum went on to share that, although he respects Councilmember Campbell's sentiments expressed, one resident did indicate to be "in favor" of the proposal. Following additional discussion, the motion to deny Recommendation #2 failed by a vote of 2 ayes (Campbell and Lewis) and 5 nays (Thomas, Moeller, Jeffus, McCallum, and Henson).

Mayor McCallum then moved to approve Z2025-052, Recommendation #2. Councilmember Thomas seconded the motion, and the ordinance caption was read as follows:

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROCKWALL, TEXAS, AMENDING THE UNIFIED DEVELOPMENT CODE [ORDINANCE NO. 20-02] OF THE CITY OF ROCKWALL, AS HERETOFORE AMENDED, BY AMENDING SUBSECTION 06.05, SOUTHSIDE RESIDENTIAL NEIGHBORHOOD OVERLAY (SRO) DISTRICT, OF ARTICLE 05, DISTRICT DEVELOPMENT STANDARDS, EXHIBITS 'A' THROUGH 'E' OF THIS ORDINANCE; PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY OF FINE NOT TO EXCEED THE SUM OF TWO THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$2,000.00) FOR EACH OFFENSE; PROVIDING FOR A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR A REPEALER CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

The motion to approve Recommendation #2 passed by a vote of 5 aye to 2 nays (Campbell and Lewis).

The mayor then gave indication that "Recommendation #3" will be handled later on during tonight's meeting agenda.

4. Z2025-053 - Hold a public hearing to discuss and consider a request by Dub Douphrate of Douphrate and Associates on behalf of RHC 1 Properties, LLC for the approval of an **ordinance** for a *Specific Use Permit (SUP)* for a *Carwash* on a 2.008-acre tract of land identified as a portion of Lot 1, Block A, the Woods at Rockwall Addition, City of Rockwall, Rockwall County, Texas, zoned Commercial (C) District, situated within the Scenic Overlay (SOV) District, addressed as 2215 Ridge Road [*FM-740*], and take any action necessary **(1st Reading)**.

Planning Director, Ryan Miller, provided background information regarding this agenda item, which is concerning the property addressed as 2215 Ridge Road. He shared that on November 7, 1960, the City Council approved the annexation of the subject property by adopting Ordinance No. 60-04. [Case No. A1960-004]. According to the January 3, 1972 zoning map the subject property was zoned Multi-Family 1 (MF-1) District and Commercial (C) District. At some point between January 3, 1972 and May 16, 1983 the subject property was rezoned to Multi-Family 15 (MF-15) District and Commercial (C) District. At some point between May 16, 1983 and December 7, 1993 the subject property was rezoned to Commercial (C) District. This remains the current zoning designation of the subject property. On July 28, 2003, the City Council approved a plat for the subject property establishing it as Lot 1, Block A, The Woods at Rockwall addition. On February 6, 2017, City Council approved a Specific Use Permit (SUP) [Case No. Z2016-044] for a Full-Service Carwash by Ordinance No. 17-09, S-162. On December 18, 2017, the City Council approved a Site Plan [Case No. SP2017-039] for a Full-Service Carwash. On January 7, 2019, the City Council approved a Final Plat [Case No.

P2018-044] for the subject property for the purpose of establishing the necessary easements for the development of a Full-Service Carwash; however, this plat was never filed with Rockwall County. On May 28, 2021, the applicant was sent a letter notifying them of the expiration of their Specific Use Permit (SUP) [Ordinance No. 17-09, S-162], Site Plan, and Final Plat due to inactivity. Staff included the letter for reference within the informational meeting packet for Council's review.

The applicant has submitted an application, concept plan, and building elevations depicting the layout of a Full-Service Car Wash and Auto Detail. The carwash is proposed to consist of a single entrance tunnel that has three (3) lanes of queuing. Based on the concept plan, the carwash tunnel will be oriented so that the entrance of the tunnel will be parallel to Ridge Road [FM-740]. He also noted that the concept plan provided by the applicant is the same concept plan that was approved on February 6, 2017 by Ordinance No. 17-09, S-162. It's also the same site plan, but the previous approval of the site plan expired back in 2021 due to inactivity. Although a full service car wash / auto detailing business is permitted by right in a Commercial District, because this site is located within the Scenic Overlay District, its approval requires Council to consider approval of an Specific Use Permit (SUP). He pointed out that the building elevations, which are the same as previously submitted years back, may not meet current standards in the overlay district. So, the applicant is having to go through the site plan process through the Planning & Zoning Commission. He pointed out that the applicant is proposing a three-tiered screening along the southern property line adjacent to the existing office park in order to reduce any noise and visibility.

Mr. Miller went on to share that sixty-two notices were sent out to adjacent property owners and occupants located within 500' of the subject property and nearby HOAs were also notified. Staff has received one notice in opposition of the request. In addition, the city's Planning & Zoning Commission approved a motion to recommend approval of the Specific Use Permit (SUP) by a vote of 6-1, with Commissioner Conway dissenting.

Mayor McCallum opened the public hearing and called forth the applicant.

Dub Douphrate, the applicant came forth and provided his address as 2235 Ridge Road. He shared that several delays have arisen during this project, including about a three year delay caused by working through a lot of easement-related issues, drainage issues and cross access issues.

Councilmember Henson asked the applicant for clarification about future development of the land located above this site. Mr. Douphrate indicated that the land above this site cannot be developed due to its topography, so it will just remain 'as is.' However, he shared that they will have to put in detention for that whole area to meet the city's standards. They are in favor of that area above remaining in a vegetation state, perhaps as a designated conservation area.

Councilmember Henson shared that this is located really close to the existing Walmart, and it is located within the city's Scenic Overlay District. He wonders if there is anything - building-material wise - that could match or enhance the city's Scenic Overlay District. Mr. Douphrate shared that they will come back with a new set of elevation plans during the site plan process, and he believes those plans will be an enhancement over what was previously presented. Mr. Miller pointed out that, due to the initial timing of this proposed project, the city actually will be allowed to regulate building materials. Mr. Miller shard that a condition could be added to any approval this evening to stipulate that the applicant will be required to comply with all requirements of the city's Scenic Overlay

District.

Clarifying comments and brief discussion ensued related to the detention that will be required and how that relates to the existing detention pond area next to Walmart.

Mayor McCallum asked the City Engineer to speak on if a lot of the existing trees and vegetation will end up being lost. Ms. Williams, City Engineer, indicated that it's not yet known the number of trees and vegetation that will ultimately end up being lost. She shared that there is a way to save a lot of the trees, but the applicant and staff have essentially not yet had ample opportunity to fully evaluate this.

Councilmember Jeffus shared that this is in the Scenic Overlay District, and she really wishes that instead of a carwash on this site, she would much prefer to have a restaurant with patio seating so that patrons could enjoy the treed area.

Mayor McCallum asked if anyone would like to speak during this Public Hearing.

Mr. Bob Wacker – 309 Featherstone – came forth and shared that there seems to be a lot of 'unknowns,' so perhaps action on this item should be tabled to a later date after more information is known. He provided brief comments on the city's Comp Plan. He shared that he believes Planning Chair, Dr. Conway, was really trying to ensure that the Scenic Overlay District is preserved.

Mayor McCallum then closed the Public Hearing, as no one else indicated a desire to speak on this item at this time. He went on to share that resident Nell Welborn previously came forth a couple of months ago and spoke about her desire to try to preserve the trees and to remember that this lot is located within the city's Scenic Overlay District.

Mayor McCallum ultimately ended up making a motion to table this item and remand it back to the City's Planning & Zoning Commission to allow additional opportunity for topics such as Scenic Overlay District requirements, detention, building materials and the trees to be further discussed and considered. Mayor Pro Tem Moeller seconded the motion, which passed by a vote of 7 ayes to 0 nays.

5. Z2025-054 - Hold a public hearing to discuss and consider a request by Stephen B. Duncan for the approval of an **ordinance** for a *Specific Use Permit (SUP)* for a *Carport* and *Accessory Building* on a one (1) acre parcel of land identified as Lot 18, Block B, Saddlebrook Estates #2 Addition, City of Rockwall, Rockwall County, Texas, zoned Single-Family 16 (SF-16) District, addressed as 2389 Saddlebrook Lane, and take any action necessary **(1st Reading)**.

Planning Director, Ryan Miller, provided background information on this item, indicating that the applicant is seeking approval of an SUP in order to construct a carport and detached garage that will exceed the maximum size permitted by the city's Unified Development Code (UDC). The neighborhood was originally platted in 1985 and was annexed into our city in 1999. In 2001 it was zoned SF-16. In 2002, a 3,663 square foot single-family home and a 192 square foot accessory structure were constructed on the property. The applicant is now requesting a detached garage and carport that will be 1,898 square feet in size and will be located at the end of the existing driveway. It will replace the existing 192 square foot accessory building currently located on the property. The

height of the new structure is proposed to be 16' 6" tall and will have cedar elements in the rafters.

Staff mailed out 28 notices to property owners and occupants located within 500' of this property, and six notices were received back in favor of the request. Also, the Planning & Zoning Commission has recommended to the Council approval of this request by a vote of 7 to 0.

Mayor McCallum opened the public hearing and called forth the applicant. The applicant came forth, thanking Mr. Miller for all of his assistance and guidance throughout this process. There being no one else wishing to speak, the mayor then closed the public hearing.

Councilmember Lewis moved to approve Z2025-054. Councilmember Jeffus seconded the motion. The ordinance caption was read as follows:

The motion to approve passed by a vote of 7 ayes to 0 nays.

6. Z2025-055 - Hold a public hearing to discuss and consider a request by Lisa Deaton of Palm Development Partners, LLC on behalf of Donna Perry of East Shore J/V for the approval of an **ordinance** for a <u>PD Development Plan</u> for a <u>Medical Office Building</u> on a 1.4384-acre parcel of land identified as Lot 27, Block A, The Standard-Rockwall Addition, City of Rockwall, Rockwall County, Texas, zoned Planned Development District 68 (PD-68) for Commercial (C) District land uses, situated within the SH-205 Overlay (SH-205 OV) District, addressed as 1301 S. Goliad Street [SH-205], and take any action necessary **(1st Reading)**.

Planning Director, Ryan Miller provided background information regarding this agenda item. The applicant is requesting the approval of a PD Development Plan to allow the development of Medical Office Building on the subject property. The applicant has submitted a concept plan and conceptual building elevations depicting the establishment of a Medical Office Building on the subject property. Based on the provided concept plan, the proposed development will not take direct access off of S. Goliad Street [SH-205], rather access will be taken off Community Lane and a provided access easement along the south property line. In addition, the proposed Medical Office Building will be one (1) story, approximately 10,377 SF in size, and have 52 parking spaces. The applicant is also proposing a Private Sports Court with Dedicated Lighting. This sports court will be private and only for the use of the clients of the Medical Office. The applicant is proposing to place an 8' vinyl fence

around the sports court for screening purposes. While the UDC requires Commercial Districts to utilize wrought iron fencing, in similar type facilities such as daycares, vinyl fencing has been approved and used. So that is not atypical.

On August 22, 2025, staff mailed 42 notices to property owners and occupants within 500-feet of the subject property. Staff also notified the Waterstone Homeowner's Association (HOA), which was the only HOA within 1,500-feet of the subject property participating in the Neighborhood Notification Program. Additionally, staff posted a sign on the subject property, and advertised the public hearings in the Rockwall Herald Banner as required by the Unified Development Code (UDC). At the time this report was drafted, staff has not received any notices in regard to the applicant's request. On September 9, 2025, the Planning and Zoning Commission approved a motion to recommend approval of the PD Development Plan by a vote of 7-0.

The mayor opened the public hearing, calling forth the applicant to address Council at this time.

Lisa Deaton 23134 Hwy 22 Yuma, Tennessee

Ms. Deaton, the applicant indicated that this medical facility is a mental health counseling facility, and the court out back will be utilized for sports-related therapy. She shared that the facility will not have any overnight patients, only regular session type mental health therapy.

Mayor Pro Tem Moeller asked for clarification on any lighting that would potentially be present on the court portion of this property. Indication was given that a plan for the lighting has been submitted, and any and all lighting will have to first be reviewed and meet the city's standards before it's installed. Mr. Miller clarified that since this property is adjacent to residentially-zoned properties, the light that is emitted will have to have zero impact on the adjacent residential homes, and likely there will be cluster landscaping around the backside so that there isn't visibility from the residential area. Also, there will be underground detention.

Mayor McCallum asked if anyone else would like to speak at this time. There being no one else indicating such, he then closed the public hearing

Councilmember Thomas moved to approve Z2025-055. Mayor Pro Tem Moeller seconded the motion. The ordinance caption was read as follows:

The motion passed by a vote of 7 ayes to 0 nays.

7. Z2025-056 - Hold a public hearing to discuss and consider a request by Nahomi Anaya on behalf of Dustin Fox for the approval of an ordinance for a <u>Specific Use Permit (SUP)</u> for <u>Residential Infill in an Established Subdivision</u> for the purpose of constructing a single-family home on a 0.368-acre tract of land identified as a Lot 15, Block C, Harbor Landing, Phase 2 Addition, City of Rockwall, Rockwall County, Texas, zoned Planned Development District 8 (PD-8), addressed as 308 Harborview Drive, and take any action necessary (1st Reading).

Planning Director, Ryan Miller provided background information regarding this agenda item. The applicant is seeking approval of this SUP so as to construct a two-story, 3,995 square foot, two-story, single-family home on the subject property, which is currently a vacant tract. The Council is being asked to review the size, location and proposed architecture of the home when compared to adjacent, existing housing. A housing analysis has been provided by staff for Council to review. The proposed home meets all the applicable zoning requirements with the exception of the garage orientation and roof. Specifically the garage orientation, they're proposing a forward-facing garage, which - according to the Unified Velma Code is supposed to be recessed behind the front facade of the home by 20 feet - but in this case the proposed garage actually is one and one-half foot in front of the front facade of the home. And then the roof pitch is at a 212, while the residential district standards require a 312 roof pitch.

Mr. Miller shared that staff sent out notices to adjacent property owners and occupants located within 500' of the subject property, but no notices were received back (neither in favor or against). Also, the city's Planning & Zoning Commission voted 7 to 0 to recommend approval of this request to Council.

Mayor McCallum opened the public hearing and called forth the applicant to speak at this time.

Nahomi Anaya 5225 Maple Avenue Dallas, TX

Ms. Anaya shared that they would like to construct this residential home, and they are very near the point of successfully obtaining approval from the neighborhood HOA.

Mayor McCallum then closed the public hearing, as no one else indicated a desire to speak at this time.

Councilmember Lewis briefly commented that this proposed home does look very similar to other, existing homes. He then moved to approve Z2025-056. Councilmember Henson seconded the motion. The ordinance caption was read as follows:

The motion passed by a vote of 7 ayes to 0 nays.

8. Z2025-057 - Hold a public hearing to discuss and consider a request by Kiew Kam of Triangle Engineering, LLC on behalf of Conor Keilty, AIA of Structured REA-Rockwall Land, LLC for the approval of an **ordinance** for a *Specific Use Permit (SUP)* for a *Residence Hotel* on a 2.819-acre portion of a larger 4.767-acre parcel of land identified as Lot 6, Block B, Fit Sport Life Addition, City of Rockwall, Rockwall County, Texas, zoned Commercial (C) District, situated within the FM-549 Overlay (FM-549 OV) District, generally located east of the intersection of FM-549 and Fit Sport Life Boulevard, and take any action necessary **(1st Reading)**.

Planning Director, Ryan Miller provided background information regarding this agenda item. The subject property has remained vacant since its annexation into the City of Rockwall in 1997. On June 17, 2024, the City Council denied a Specific Use Permit (SUP) for a Residence Hotel [Case No. Z2024-023] without prejudice to allow the applicant to change the plan and resubmit the request. On December 2, 2024, the City Council approved a Specific Use Permit (SUP) for a Residence Hotel, which will expire on December 2, 2025. The applicant has not submitted a Site Plan for the Residence Hotel that was approved; However, recently, a new applicant approached staff about a different configuration for the Residence Hotel on the subject property. Since the proposed configuration would differ from the concept plan approved in the Specific Use Permit (SUP) ordinance, staff instructed the applicant to amend the approved Specific Use Permit (SUP). The applicant is now requesting a Specific Use Permit (SUP) for a Residence Hotel for the purpose of constructing a 14,204 SF LaQuinta Hampton Extended Stay Hotel on the subject property as well as a restaurant. The applicant has submitted a proposed parking plan that shows 147 spaces for both the hotel and restaurant, and what's been submitted in that regard does meet the city's UDC requirements. However, the submitted building elevations do not comply with the city's requirements. However, the applicant submitted revised building elevations just yesterday, and those have been put before Council this evening. In the revised elevations, the applicant has indicated staying to no more than 60' in height.

Mr. Miller went on to indicate that notices were sent out to adjacent owners and occupants within

500' of the subject property. However, no notices have been received back – neither 'for' or 'against' the request. Also, the Planning & Zoning Commission has recommended approval of this request to Council by a vote of 7 to 0.

Mayor McCallum opened the public hearing and called forth the applicant to speak at this time.

Kiew Kam of Triangle Engineering 1782 West McDermott Drive Allen, TX

The applicant came forth and shared that he would like to have a 96 room hotel and a free-standing restaurant (ultimately) at this location. He pointed out that he has now met all of the city's requirements and is not requesting any exceptions or variances at this time.

Councilmember Henson asked if this will, with certainty, end up being a LaQuinta. Mr. Kam shared that – yes – this is the brand hotel it will be. Henson also wonders what the restaurant will end up being. Mr. Kam indicated he is currently not sure about what the restaurant will end up being.

Councilmember Lewis asked if it will for sure be a LaQuinta, or if there's a chance it could end up being a Motel 6. The applicant shared that he cannot absolutely confirm that the deal has actually been signed.

Councilmember Jeffus shared that another hotel location within the city switched to an unsavory hotel brand, so she wants to know with certainty that this will be a LaQuinta. The applicant shared that the owner does own other LaQuinta properties, so he is confident it will be a LaQuinta.

Mayor McCallum shared that with some of the current "unknowns," he does have some heartburn.

Mayor McCallum asked if anyone in the audience would like to speak. He then closed the public hearing, as no one else indicated a desire to do so.

The applicant asked if Council could incorporate into its motion and vote the requirement that it will be a LaQuinta. City Attorney, Frank Garza, shared that the Council can include this in their motion at the request of the applicant, since the applicant has pro-actively indicated a willingness to commit to this aspect. Mayor McCallum wonders if the extended stay portion could be excluded. Mr. Miller shared that the 'extended stay' portion was already approved previously by Council in a prior granted SUP.

Councilmember Henson shared that he tends to not be in favor of potentially approving this because we do not know what the restaurant will ultimately be. Mr. Garza interjected, sharing that Council cannot require that the applicant specify the restaurant name at this time; however, Council can include in its motion that it should be required to be a LaQuinta since the applicant has specifically requested and agreed to this particular stipulation.

Following additional discussion, including comments from the city attorney, Mr. Miller shared that it would be a reasonable request to remand this back to the Planning & Zoning Commission to see and evaluate the plans for the extended stay units, including the proposed layout, which the applicant indicated that the units would have a refrigerator, microwave, etc. but no actual cooktops of cooking

appliances.

Mayor McCallum then made a motion to remand this back to the Planning & Zoning Commission. He encouraged the applicant to consider dropping the portion of the request that makes it an 'extended stay' hotel. Councilmember Henson then seconded the motion, which passed by a vote of 7 ayes to 0 nays.

9. **Z2025-058** - Hold a public hearing to discuss and consider a request by Leonard and Debra Lynskey for the approval of an **ordinance** for a <u>Specific Use Permit (SUP)</u> for an *Accessory Structure* that exceeds the maximum size on a 0.445-acre parcel of land identified as Lot 17, Block F, Saddle Star Estates South, Phase 2 Addition, City of Rockwall, Rockwall County, Texas, zoned Planned Development District 79 (PD-79) for Single-Family 8.4 (SF-8.4) District land uses, addressed as 2310 Sarah Drive, and take any action necessary **(1st Reading)**.

Planning Director, Ryan Miller provided background information regarding this agenda item, indicating that the applicant is seeking approval to construct a 23' x 30' (690 sq. foot) detached, covered porch in the rear yard of this home. He explained that all residential properties are permitted one detached covered porch that is a maximum of 500 square feet in size and set back a minimum of three feet from the rear property line and six feet from the site yard property and a minimum of six feet from any other buildings or structures. The proposed detached covered porch will be fully constructed out of cedar and have concrete piers with an asphalt shingle roof. All of the materials will match or be complementary to the primary structure. In this case, the applicant's request complies with all the requirements for a detached covered porch with the exception of the size, which is 190 square feet larger than the maximum permissible size. The subject property is surrounded on two sides by properties that are situated within the city's extraterritorial jurisdiction. In addition, the proposed structure is situated in the rear yard behind the primary structure, and has little to no visibility from public right. Based on this, the size and location of the proposed structure, this request does not appear that if approved it will have a negative effect on any of the adjacent properties or the essential character of the neighborhood. He went on to share that the City's Planning & Zoning Commission heard this case and approved a motion by a vote of 7 to 0 to recommend approval of this request to Council. Also, staff mailed out notices to owners and occupants located within 500' of the subject property, and two notices were received back in favor of the request.

The mayor opened the public hearing and called forth the applicant to address Council at this time. As the applicant was coming forth, he asked if anyone else has a desire to speak. No one indicated such.

The applicant then addressed Council, explaining the purpose of the accessory structure, explaining he has a very large family and more space is needed. He went on to respectfully request Council's approval, indicating he's already received approval from the HOA and from the Planning & Zoning Commission.

Mayor Pro Tem Moeller asked if the paved area will be a court. The applicant shared that – no – that will strictly be a paved area.

Following brief comments, Councilmember Thomas moved to approve Z2025-058. Councilmember

Campbell seconded the motion. The ordinance caption was read as follows:

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROCKWALL, TEXAS, AMENDING PLANNED DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT 79 (PD-79) [ORDINANCE NO. 20-35] AND THE UNIFIED DEVELOPMENT CODE (UDC) [ORDINANCE NO. 20-02] OF THE CITY OF ROCKWALL, ROCKWALL COUNTY, TEXAS, AS PREVIOUSLY AMENDED, SO AS TO GRANT A SPECIFIC USE PERMIT (SUP) FOR AN ACCESSORY STRUCTURE ON A 0.445-ACRE PARCEL OF LAND IDENTIFIED AS LOT 17, BLOCK F, OF THE SADDLE STAR ESTATES SOUTH, PHASE 2 ADDITION, CITY OF ROCKWALL, ROCKWALL COUNTY, TEXAS; AND MORE SPECIFICALLY DESCRIBED AND DEPICTED IN EXHIBIT 'A' OF THIS ORDINANCE; PROVIDING FOR SPECIAL CONDITIONS; PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY OF FINE NOT TO EXCEED THE SUM OF TWO THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$2,000.00) FOR EACH OFFENSE; PROVIDING FOR A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR A REPEALER CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

The motion to approve passed by a vote of 7 ayes to 0 nays.

10. Z2025-059 - Hold a public hearing to discuss and consider a request by William Andrew Solomon of KRE 15, LLC for the approval of an ordinance for a Zoning Change from an Agricultural (AG) District to a Planned Development District for Single-Family 1 (SF-1) District land uses on a 105.1004-acre tract of land identified as Tract 4 of the J. R. Marrs Survey, Abstract No. 152, City of Rockwall, Rockwall County, Texas, zoned Agricultural (AG) District, situated within the SH-276 Overlay (SH-276 OV) District, generally located on the south side of SH-276 west of the intersection of SH-276 and E. FM-550, and take any action necessary (1st Reading).

Planning Director, Ryan Miller provided background information regarding this agenda item. The applicant would like to construct a 54 lot residential subdivision that will consist of two (2) lot sizes (i.e. [A] forty-four 100' x 200' lots; and [B] ten 150' x 250' lots). The concept plan shows that the 105.285-acre subject property will be divided into 84.228-acres of land consisting of 54 residential lots, and 21.057-acres of open space. The development will have a gross residential density of 0.513 dwelling units per gross acre for the total development (i.e. 0.60 dwelling units on the net acre --105.85-acres - 15.89-acres of floodplain = 89.385-acres; 54 lots/89.385-acres = 0.60406 dwelling units per net acre). The minimum dwelling unit size (i.e. air-condition space only) will range from 3,000 SF to 3,250 SF with three car garages. With regard to the proposed housing product, staff has incorporated the anti-monotony standards from the Unified Development Code (UDC) and masonry requirements similar to other Planned Development Districts into the proposed Planned Development District ordinance. Specifically, the ordinance will require a minimum of 100.00% masonry; however, the Planned Development District ordinance will also incorporate provisions that allow up to 80.00% cementitious fiberboard utilized in a horizontal lap-siding, board-and-batten siding, or decorative pattern to allow a more Traditional Neighborhood Design product (also referred to as Gingerbread or Modern Farmhouse -- similar to what is allowed in the Somerset Park Subdivision). The proposed subdivision will be subject to the land uses and density and dimensional requirements stipulated for properties within a Single-Family 1 (SF-1) District unless otherwise specified in the Planned Development District ordinance. The proposed concept plan shows that the development will consist of 21.057-acres of private open space -- where 15.89- acres are floodplain -representing 20.00% (i.e. [15.89-acres of floodplain/2] + 13.36 = 21.057-acres/105.285-acres gross = 20.00%) of the site being dedicated to open space/amenity. This meets the total open space of 20.00% required by Article 10, Planned Development District Standards, of the Unified Development Code (UDC). In addition, the proposed development will incorporate a minimum of a 70-foot landscape buffer with an eight (8) foot meandering trail along SH-276. The concept plan also depicts the provision of an eight (8) foot trail system that will be provided throughout the development to connect the future residential lots with the private open spaces. All of these items have been included into the proposed Planned Development District ordinance and will be requirements of the proposed subdivision. The proposed Planned Development District conforms to the majority of the City's code requirements; however, it should be noted that the development standards contained within the Planned Development District ordinance deviate from the requirements of the Unified Development Code (UDC), the Municipal Code of Ordinances, and the Engineering Department's Standards of Design and Construction Manual in the following ways:

(1) Alleyways. The Engineering Department's Standards of Design and Construction Manual stipulates that "(a)lleys shall be provided in all residential areas and shall be paved with steel reinforced concrete..." The code does grant the City Council the ability to "... waive the residential alley requirement, if it is in the best interest of the City." [Page 14; Section 2.11 of the Standards of Design and Construction Manual]

Applicant's Response: In lieu of providing the required alleyways, the applicant is proposing to provide 100.00% *J-Swing* or *Traditional Swing* garages. As a compensatory measure the applicant is proposing to provide additional architectural elements into all garage configurations in the form of decorative wood doors or wood overlays on insulated metal doors with carriage style hardware.

With regard to the applicant's request for On-Site Sewage Facilities (OSSF), the City Rockwall has an Interlocal Agreement with Rockwall County for OSSF inspections. Per this agreement, Rockwall County will issue permits and perform OSSF inspections on new and existing septic systems per the County's Rules for Regulation of On-Site Sewage Facilities, which stipulates a minimum lot size of 1½-acres. According to Subsection 44-243(d) of Article IV, Sewers and Sewage Disposal, of the Municipal Code of Ordinances, "(n)o permit for the installation of an on-site sewage facility (OSSF) will be issued for property of less than 11/2-acre, unless an exception is granted by the City Council on the grounds that undue hardship will be created if said lot is not connected to an OSSF." Staff should note that Rockwall County has stated that they will not inspect OSSF's that are on lots less than 11/2acres. It should also be noted that the City Council has granted OSSF systems for developments (e.q. Planned Development District 76 [PD-76], Planned Development District 78 [PD-78], and Planned Development District 104 [PD-104]) proposing lots less than 1½-acre in size, but greater than one (1) acre when the developer proposes [1] the OSSF systems are designed by a licensed OSSF professional (i.e. licensed engineer, sanitarian, etc.), [2] stamped and signed copy of the OSSF plan indicating the full limits of the septic field be submitted to the City at the time of building permit on a lot-by-lot basis, and [3] all OSSF are inspected by a City approved inspector. In this case, the

applicant is requesting to install OSSF's on lots 1.00-acre and greater (with the majority of the lots being less than 1½-acre in size), and has included language generally in compliance with the aforementioned stipulations. In addition, the applicant has included language that will [1] ensure all Septic Systems shall be designed by a licensed On-Site Sewage Facility (OSSF) professional (e.g. licensed engineer, sanitarian, etcetera), [2] ensure that a stamped and signed copy of the Septic System plans indicating the full limits of the septic field shall be submitted to the city at the time of building permit on a lot-by-lot basis, and [3] all Septic Systems shall be inspected and approved by the City's chosen inspector. The applicant has stated the reason for the OSSF request is due to the availability of sewer.

On August 22, 2025, staff mailed nine (9) notices to property owners and occupants within 500-feet of the subject property, but no notices were received back by staff. Staff did not notify any Homeowner's Associations (HOAs), as there are not any HOAs within 1,500-feet of the subject property participating in the Neighborhood Notification Program. Additionally, staff posted a sign on the subject property, and advertised the public hearings in the Rockwall Herald Banner as required. The Planning and Zoning Commission approved a motion to recommend approval of the zoning change by a vote of 7-0, with the condition that all garages shall be a minimum of three (3) car, and Type A lots shall have a minimum home size of 3,000 SF and Type B lots shall have a minimum home size of 3,250 SF. Based on the conditions recommended by the Planning and Zoning Commission, staff has made the necessary changes to the case memo and the draft ordinance.

William Andrew Solomon, President of SMK Capital 4512 Legacy Drive Plano, TX

Mr. Solomon shared that the goal is to build quality, single-family homes that families that desire the Rockwall ISD school district would like to live in and continue to grow and prosper in. His company develops real estate in 20 different states. They have roughly six active entitlement projects right now across the Metroplex and also do work in Florida, Colorado, and half of America minus the west coast and New York.

The mayor asked if anyone would like to come forth and speak during the public hearing. There being no one indicating such, he closed the public hearing.

Mayor McCallum generally indicated he is a proponent of this proposal and he is very supportive of estate lots and low density, and this meets the definition of low density. The mayor and applicant discussed things such as timing of the project and anti-monotony. He expressed he'd like to see even more diversity in the homes to promote more of true, custom home building. The mayor indicated that the city's Planning & Zoning Commission seemed to talk the applicant out of providing amenities, including a community pool. While perhaps a community pool is not needed, he wonders if additional amenities could be included, such as perhaps public gazebos. General discussion ensued pertaining to amenities and how those relate to density and acreage as well as the long-term impact that can have on homeowners, especially within communities this small (a little over fifty homeowners).

Mayor McCallum expressed he would like to see the applicant return to the Planning & Zoning

Commission to further consider some aspects of the proposal, including amenities. Mr. Miller shared that this case would come back to Council at its first meeting in October if Council does remand it back to the P&Z Commission for further discussion and additional consideration.

Councilmember Henson asked if the applicant would consider an additional buffer along the SH-276 side. Mr. Miller shared that the buffer is already 70'. Councilmember Henson shard that 29' wide streets at the entryway of a neighborhood is something he does not personally like. He'd like to see a wider roadway at the entry point. He thanked the applicant for including cul-de-sacs, but he wants to ensure that fire trucks can adequately turn around in those areas. He also wonders if the applicant would consider half of the homes having side entry garages instead of all being j-swing garages. Mr. Miller shared that these homes will have longer than normal driveways. He prefers side entry garages because they get cars out from in front of homes. The applicant seemed to indicate he believes this is plausible.

Councilmember Jeffus sought and received clarification regarding open space. The applicant shared that about 18.5% falls into a floodplain. So, with this particular area, they tried to maximize as much green space as possible.

Following additional discussion, Mayor McCallum then moved to remand this case back to the Planning & Zoning Commission for further consideration, including recommendations expressed by Council. Councilmember Henson seconded the motion, which passed by a vote of 7 ayes to 0 nays.

At 9:22 p.m., Mayor McCallum recessed the public meeting, calling for a brief break. The mayor then reconvened the meeting at 9:27 p.m.

11. **Z2025-060** - Hold a public hearing to discuss and consider a request by Anthony Rendon on behalf of Marcelino Rendon for the approval of an **ordinance** for a <u>Specific Use Permit (SUP)</u> for an *Accessory Structure* on a 0.570-acre parcel of land identified as Lot 1 of the Hurst Addition, City of Rockwall, Rockwall County, Texas, zoned Single-Family 7 (SF-7) District, situated within the Old Town Rockwall (OTR) Historic District, addressed as 710 Hartman Street, and take any action necessary **(1st Reading)**.

Planning Director, Ryan Miller provided background information regarding this agenda item. This home is located within the Old Towne Historic District. The applicant is requesting a detached garage accessory structure that exceeds the overall maximum allowable square footage permitted within a Single-Family 7 (SF-7) District. The applicant will be removing the three, existing accessory structures when seeking a building permit. Currently situated on the subject property is a 1,548 SF single-family home that was constructed in 1949, a 270 SF detached carport constructed in 2021, and a 96 SF storage shed constructed in 2005. On August 21, 2025, the Historic Preservation Advisory Board (HPAB) approved a Certificate of Appropriateness (COA) for the proposed Detached Garage by a vote of 4-0, with Board Members Lewis, McNeely, and Gaskin absent. As a condition of this case, the Historic Preservation Advisory Board (HPAB) also approved a condition that the Detached Garage generally match the color of the primary structure because it does have some visibility from the front when you're driving past. This condition has been added to the draft ordinance prepared for this case. Mr. Miller shared that notices were sent out to adjacent property owners and occupants located within 500' of the subject property, and one notice was received back in favor of the

request. In addition, the Planning & Zoning Commission has recommended approval of this request to Council by a vote of 7 to 0.

The mayor called forth the applicant and also opened the public hearing, asking if anyone would like to speak at this time. There being no one indicating such, he then closed the public hearing and invited the applicant to address Council.

Mr. Rendon came forth and stated his address as 719 Fairfax Lane in Rockwall, TX. He then shared that the three existing sheds will be removed, and the one structure will be built. The purpose will be to add storage and also hopefully park vehicles inside of it. It will hopefully eliminate clutter and get the vehicles parked under cover.

Councilmember Lewis wants to ensure that there will be no asphalt poured and that, instead, it will be concrete. Mr. Miller assured that – yes, it will be concrete and that the city would not permit asphalt.

Councilmember Lewis then moved to approve Z2025-060. Councilmember Jeffus seconded the motion. The ordinance caption was read as follows:

The motion passed by a vote of 7 ayes to 0 nays.

12. 22025-061 - Hold a public hearing to discuss and consider a request by the City of Rockwall for the approval of an **ordinance** for a *Zoning Change* from Multi-Family 14 (MF-14) District to a Single-Family 7 (SF-7) District for a 2.56-acre parcel of land identified as [1] Lot 1A, 2A, 1B, 2B & 1C and a portion of Lots 3 & 4, Block H, Sanger Addition, [2] Lots 1 & 2, Block A, M & M Johnson Addition, [3] Lots 1 & 2, Block A, Rios Buffington Addition, and [4] Lots 1 & 2, Block A, RHDC Addition, City of Rockwall, Rockwall County, Texas, zoned Multi-Family 14 (MF-14) District, situated within the Southside Residential Neighborhood Overlay (SRO) District, bounded by E. Ross Street, Davy Crockett, Peters Colony, and E. Bourn Street, and take any action necessary (1st Reading).

Planning Director, Ryan Miller provided background information regarding this agenda item. On June 16, 2025, the City Council approved a motion to direct staff to review the Southside Residential Neighborhood Overlay (SRO) District and provide recommendations for updates to the district. This motion was approved by a vote of 6-0, with Councilmember Campbell absent. Based on this direction staff performed a comprehensive review of the overlay district, and returned to the City Council with three (3) recommendations on August 18, 2025. After reviewing the recommendations, the City Council approved a motion to move forward with all three (3) recommendations. This motion was approved by a vote of 5-1, with Council Member Campbell dissenting and Council Member Lewis absent. Based on this direction, staff has initiated two (2) zoning cases, one (1) that covers Recommendations 1 & 2 (i.e. Case No. Z2025-052) and one (1) that covers Recommendation 3 (i.e. this case -- Z2025-061). The reason that the recommendations are being taken forward in two (2) cases is tied to the intent of the cases and how the cases are required to be notified in accordance with the requirements of the Unified Development Code (UDC) and the Texas Local Government Code (TLGC). In reviewing the area zoned Multi-Family 14 (MF-14) District, staff was able to determine that this area was zoned Multi-Family 1 (MF-1) District since at least January 3, 1972. At some point between June 14, 1983 and July 11, 1985, this designation was changed from a Multi-Family 1 (MF-1) District to a Multi-Family 15 (MF-15) District, and finally changing to a Multi-Family 14 (MF-14) District between December 7, 1993 and April 5, 2005. Currently located within this 2.56-acre zoning district are ten (10) parcels of land with the following land uses: [1] two (2) vacant tracts of land, [2] four (4) single-family homes, [3] two (2) duplexes, [4] one (1) triplex, and [5] Gloria Williams Park/Pool. Currently, the majority underlying zoning within the Southside Residential Neighborhood Overlay (SRO) District is Single-Family 7 (SF-7) District, which represents a total of 33.08-acres or 75.27% of the total district. In addition, the requirements for the district specifically state that "(a)ny requirements not specifically stated in this section [i.e. the SRO District] shall comply with the Single-Family 7 (SF-7) District requirements." If approved, this zoning change -coupled with the changes to the district boundaries being proposed in Case No. Z2025-052 -- would make the zoning within the overlay district consistent for all properties. Staff should also note, that this zoning change would be consistent with the Future Land Use Map contained in the OURHometown Vision 2040 Comprehensive Plan, which currently designates this area for Medium Density Residential (MDR) land use. As with any zoning case, staff has sent out the requisite notices to property owners and residents within 500-feet of the subject property. This included 164 notices to property owners and occupants. In addition, staff also sent a letter explaining the zoning change to the ten (10) affected property owners within the subject area. A copy of staff's letter has been provided in the informational meeting packet. Staff has received one (1) emailed response from a property owner within the 500-foot notification area in favor of the proposed zoning change. In addition to the property owner notifications, staff also notified all Homeowner's Associations (HOA's) or Neighborhood Organizations -- participating in the Neighborhood Notification Program -within 1,500-feet about the proposed zoning change. This included the Highridge Estates Subdivision. On September 9, 2025 the Planning and Zoning Commission approved a motion by a vote of 7-0 to recommend Two-Family (2F) District zoning in lieu of the proposed Single-Family 7 (SF-7) District zoning. Staff should note that should the City Council choose to approve the Planning and Zoning Commission's recommendation of Two-Family (2F) District zoning, staff will make the requisite changes to the draft ordinance between the first and second reading of the ordinance.

Mayor McCallum opened the public hearing, asking if anyone would like to come forth and speak at this time.

David Honzell 414 E. Coachlight Trail Rockwall, TX 75087

Mr. Honzell came forth and pointed out his wife, Patricia, who is also present this evening. He explained that he and his wife purchased a property in this area seven years ago, strategically selecting it with a desire to construct a duplex. He shared that the property, when purchased, had a lot of junk on it, and he and his wife personally worked very hard on clearing it out and cleaning it up. They do desire to follow through with their original intent of constructing a duplex, and he and his wife are very passionate about individual property rights. He encouraged the Council to consider and respect those rights, which are outlined in and protected by the U.S. Constitution.

There being no one else wishing to speak, the mayor closed the public hearing.

Councilmember Campbell thanked Mr. Honzell for what he said. She expressed she is a conservative and she is also very passionate about the rights of property owners. While she is not for multifamily housing, she is for the rights of property owners. So, she went on to make a motion to recommend making this a two-family district zoning in lieu of the proposed SF-7 District Zoning. Councilmember Lewis seconded the motion so that discussion could ensue.

Mayor McCallum shared the he is absolutely pro property rights, and the rights of people who live here are important to him. He explained the various reasons why this proposal is being brought forth, and he shared that – regardless – if this motion passes, there will still be a donut. He shared that the city would not be taking away anyone's property rights. He presumes the speaker this evening desires to construct a rental home, and he pointed out that Council recently approved a replat for someone who's doing a great job of building single-family homes in this neighborhood and bringing new homeowners into the district. He went on to share that one person did respond to the public notices, and that one person expressed being in favor of this case. He went on to indicate he will vote against the motion on the floor this evening.

The ordinance caption was read as follows:

The motion failed by a vote of 2 ayes (Campbell and Lewis) to 5 nays (Jeffus, McCallum, Henson, Thomas, and Moeller).

Mayor McCallum then moved to approve Z2025-061 for SF-7 district. Councilmember Jeffus seconded the motion. The ordinance caption was read as follows:

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROCKWALL, TEXAS, AMENDING THE UNIFIED DEVELOPMENT CODE [ORDINANCE NO. 20-02] OF THE CITY OF ROCKWALL, AS HERETOFORE AMENDED, SO AS TO APPROVE A CHANGE IN ZONING FROM A MULTI-FAMILY 14 (MF-14) DISTRICT TO A SINGLE-FAMILY 7 (SF-7) DISTRICT FOR A 2.56-ACRE TRACT OF LAND IDENTIFIED AS [1] LOT 1A, 2A, 1B, 2B & 1C AND A PORTION OF LOTS 3 & 4, BLOCK H, SANGER ADDITION, [2] LOTS 1 & 2, BLOCK A, M & M JOHNSON ADDITION, [3] LOTS 1 & 2, BLOCK A, RIOS BUFFINGTON ADDITION, AND [4] LOTS 1 & 2, BLOCK A, RHDC ADDITION, CITY OF ROCKWALL, ROCKWALL COUNTY, TEXAS, AND BEING MORE SPECIFICALLY DESCRIBED EXHIBIT 'A' AND DEPICTED IN EXHIBIT 'B' OF THIS ORDINANCE; PROVIDING FOR SPECIAL CONDITIONS; PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY OF FINE NOT TO EXCEED THE SUM OF TWO THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$2,000.00) FOR EACH OFFENSE; PROVIDING FOR A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE: PROVIDING FOR A REPEALER CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

The motion passed by a vote of 6 ayes with 1 nay (Campbell).

Action Item #2 was addressed next by Council.

VIII. Action Items

1. Discuss and consider recommended appointments to the Rockwall Youth Advisory Council (YAC) for the 2025-26 school year, and take any action necessary.

Vincent Vento, who served as Chair of the YAC for the 2024-2025 school year, came forth and briefed Council on recent interviews held with applicants for this current 2025-2026 school year. He went on to ask Council to consider the recommended appointees, as presented in the memo within the informational meeting packet that Council has been provided.

Councilmember Campbell when on to make a motion to appoint the recommended slate of students, including the four new YAC members, as follows:

Ainsley Schmidt London Stahl Eva King and Sheldon Brown.

Councilmember Thomas seconded the motion. He thanked Mr. Vento for his leadership in how he helped lead the interviews and vetting process last week, letting him know he is proud of him and the other YAC members, and – as one of the YAC liaisons this school year – he looks forward to working with the students. Following brief, additional comments, the motion then passed by a vote of 7 ayes to 0 nays.

The mayor then indicated he will move to Public Hearing items. As he did so, Councilmember Lewis interjected, asking that the Mayor and Council consider reordering the agenda to address Action Items next instead (specifically the budget and tax rate related items). He would like to do so considering there are several city employees who are present, many of whom probably need to be up early in the morning and some of whom may need to leave to respond to emergency calls soon (police and fire staff in the audience). The mayor then moved to Action Item #4.

2. Discuss and consider approval of the Rockwall Economic Development Corporation (REDC) budget for fiscal year 2026 and amended budget for fiscal year 2025, as well as the 'Annual Work Plan' for FY2026, and take any action necessary.

City Manager, Mary Smith provided brief, introductory comments regarding this agenda item.

Mayor McCallum moved to approve the proposed budget with the following exception – he'd like to adjust the capital budget to <u>not</u> include the money for the pad sites and landscaping of the La Jolla and the Ridge Road projects. He clarified that money would remain for the detention pond at the Tech Park because that's necessary for that corner to be developed.

Kayne Pierce, Chair of the REDC Board, came forth and provided several comments, including giving indication that the REDC had difficulties with bidding on the detention pond and was only able to obtain one bid. Mayor McCallum provided additional comments, sharing that even some REDC board members had some concerns about having only received one bid. Councilmember Lewis asked for clarification regarding if the motion will include the detention pond portion. Mayor McCallum shared that – yes – the detention pond portion will remain as part of his motion for inclusion in the budget. Councilmember Lewis seconded the motion, which – after additional, brief comments – passed by a vote of 7 ayes to 0 nays.

3. Discuss and consider approval of the Rockwall Technology Park Association budget for fiscal year 2026 and amended budget for fiscal year 2025, and take any action necessary.

City Manager, Mary Smith shared that this proposal is significantly less than the prior year because they rebid the landscaping and that was really the only adjustment to the budget. Mayor McCallum then moved to approve the amended budget and the proposed budget, as presented. Councilmember Lewis seconded the motion, which passed by a vote of 7 ayes to 0 nays.

4. Discuss and consider approval of an **ordinance** amending the city budget for fiscal year 2025, and take any action necessary.

City Manager, Mrs. Smith, briefly commented that Council was previously provided with the

amendments in the informational budget notebooks, so this is just a quick clean-up item to approve those amendments.

Mayor McCallum then moved to approve the ordinance and associated amendments. Councilmember Lewis seconded the motion, and the ordinance caption was read as follows:

CITY OF ROCKWALL, TEXAS ORDINANCE NO. 25-56

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROCKWALL, TEXAS, AMENDING THE BUDGET OF THE CITY FOR THE FISCAL YEAR OCTOBER 1, 2024 THROUGH SEPTEMBER 30, 2025; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

The motion then passed unanimously by a vote of 7 ayes to 0 nays.

5. Discuss and consider approval of an **ordinance** adopting the proposed city budget* for fiscal year 2026, and take any action necessary.

Mrs. Smith shared that the ordinance is in the information meeting packet. Also, the required taxpayer impact statements have been provided, including being displayed on the screen this evening. She shared that the city attorney has informed that a roll call vote is needed for this agenda item, and the City Secretary will assist with that part once the time comes.

Councilmember Thomas moved to approve the ordinance adopting the budget for fiscal year 2026. Mayor Pro Tem Moeller seconded the motion.

The ordinance caption was read as follows:

CITY OF ROCKWALL ORDINANCE NO. <u>25-57</u>

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROCKWALL, TEXAS, APPROVING AND ADOPTING A BUDGET FOR THE CITY FOR THE FISCAL YEAR OCTOBER 1, 2025, THROUGH SEPTEMBER 30, 2026; PROVIDING THAT EXPENDITURES FOR SAID FISCAL YEAR SHALL BE MADE IN ACCORDANCE WITH SAID BUDGET; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

City Secretary, Kristy Teague, then asked each council member, one-by-one, to voice his or her vote by stating "aye," "nay" or "abstain." The results of the individual, roll call vote were as follows:

- Councilmember Thomas "aye"
- Councilmember Jeffus "nay"
- Mayor Pro Tem Moeller- "aye"
- Mayor McCallum "nay"
- Councilmember Campbell "aye"
- Councilmember Lewis "aye"
- Councilmember Henson "nay"

So the motion passed by a vote of 4 ayes (Thomas, Moeller, Campbell, and Lewis) and 3 nays (Jeffus, McCallum and Henson).

6. Discuss and consider approval of an **ordinance** levying ad valorem taxes* for the tax year 2025, and take any action necessary.

Councilmember Henson shared that he is confident in Rockwall's growing economy, and he does believe we should prioritize the police and fire departments and provide them with the raises that they deserve to be paid, and he believes we can do so without raising taxes. Councilmember Henson then moved to approve a tax rate of .24745, which is the identical rate of this past year. The motion was seconded by Councilmember Jeffus.

Councilmember Lewis indicated that we do have the best people (staff) within our city in all of the various city departments across the city – fire, police building inspections, water, sewer, dispatch – you name it – we have the best staff. He went on to share he will be voting against this motion.

Councilmember Henson restated his motion, as follows, as prescribed by state law:

I move that the property tax rate be increased by the adoption of a tax rate of .24745 cents, being the same as last year, per \$100 dollars of assessed value, which is effectively a 9.7%, which is effectively a 5.44% increase in the tax rate.

Councilmember Jeffus seconded Councilmember Henson's restated motion.

Councilmember Thomas thanked the members of council for all the hard work that's been put into this process. He went on to share that he will be coming out against this particular motion, explaining that we cannot responsibly fund government off of sales tax projections indicating astronomical growth. We've already factored in a 6% sales tax projected increase, which is not happening in a lot of other proposed budgets in other cities similar to our size of 50,000 population or more. He believes we should look at sales tax projections more conservatively and that a 6% projection is pretty aggressive in this current environment. He went on to indicate that, although the tax rate has been continually lowered, he is asking that we look at raising it this year to allow for us to invest in the roads and ensure employees are taken care of, including our first responders. He expressed a willingness to meet and discuss with anyone his viewpoints on this motion, this topic and his associated vote(s). He believes the City Manager has been responsible and has put forth a fiscally responsible budget, and he believes that what he is in support of represents a responsible increase so we can make necessary investments and keep us on track for the future. He pointed out that no new staff positions are being requested or added and there is no wish list of things being requested, but - rather - what's being requested is necessary. So he will vote against this currently proposed motion on the floor.

Councilmember Campbell shared we need to keep Rockwall safe, be responsive, and keep our city well maintained. She believes that, despite past tax rate decreases, it is now important that our city remain competitive. Councilmember Campbell thanked all city staff who are present this evening to show their support over this decision this evening. She stressed that city staff and the work they do are valuable. She has been involved in many text messages, phone calls, and one-on-one conversations about this topic. Overall, with few exceptions, the input she's receives has been to

support our community, support our first responders, and support our staff. She believes we cannot legitimately do that with the current tax rate in place now. So, she will be voting against the current motion.

Mayor Pro Tem Moeller shared that his whole career has been focused on public safety, so of course he supports public safety. He shared that he knows that, in order to do their jobs, staff needs resources. He indicated that former Councilmember Billy Morris shared that councilmembers have to determine if things that are proposed are 'wants' or 'needs.' He went on to share that – in this proposed budget – 'needs' are represented. No new staff positions are proposed. A good portion of the increase will be to fund roads, which are needed and important. He will not be supporting the current motion.

Mayor McCallum shared that he also formerly served with former councilmember Billy Morris, and he has heard those sentiments regarding needs versus wants previously expressed as well. He went on to share that he will not apologize for being a conservative, and he will never vote for a tax increase. He has an ambition vision for what the city needs to accomplish in the future. He is in support of public safety, and he believes that we will positively move police and fire forwards in the next several years. He indicated this is a particularly tough budget year. He and the city manager have spent some time together talking about how tough this budget is, and the city manager has done a great job. This is a particularly tough year. It's not the staff's fault that we're giving. We're going to be rebating some of this money back to Ikea. It's not the staff's fault that we have other tough budget priorities. But he trusts our city manager to make the tough decisions with a 5% increase in revenue to prioritize employees. He indicated he is in support of Councilmember Henson's motion and does not believe the rate should be raised.

The ordinance caption was read as follows:

CITY OF ROCKWALL, TEXAS ORDINANCE NO. 25-58

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROCKWALL, TEXAS, LEVYING THE AD VALOREM TAXES FOR THE YEAR 2025 AT A RATE OF \$.24745 PER ONE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$100.00) ASSESSED VALUATION ON ALL TAXABLE PROPERTY WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY AS OF JANUARY 1, 2025 TO PROVIDE REVENUES FOR THE PAYMENT OF CURRENT EXPENSES AND TO PROVIDE AN INTEREST AND SINKING FUND ON ALL OUTSTANDING DEBTS OF THE CITY; PROVIDING FOR DUE AND DELINQUENT DATES, TOGETHER WITH PENALTIES AND INTEREST; APPROVING THE 2025 TAX ROLL; PROVIDING FOR EXEMPTIONS OF PERSONS OVER SIXTY-FIVE (65) YEARS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

City Secretary, Kristy Teague, then asked each council member, one-by-one, to voice his or her vote by stating "aye," "nay" or "abstain." The results of the individual, roll call vote were as follows:

- Councilmember Thomas "nay"
- Councilmember Jeffus "aye"
- Mayor Pro Tem Moeller- "nay"
- Mayor McCallum "aye"
- Councilmember Campbell "nay"

- Councilmember Lewis "nay"
- Councilmember Henson "aye"

So the motion failed by a vote of 3 ayes (Jeffus, McCallum and Henson) and 4 nays (Thomas, Moeller, Campbell, and Lewis).

Councilmember Lewis moved that the property tax rate be increased by the adoption of a tax rate of .25750 cents per \$100 dollars of assessed value, which is effectively a 9.7%, which is effectively a 5.44% increase in the tax rate. Mayor Pro Tem Moeller seconded the motion.

City Secretary, Ms. Teague, then recorded the vocalized roll call vote as follows:

- Councilmember Thomas "aye"
- Councilmember Jeffus "nay"
- Mayor Pro Tem Moeller- "aye"
- Mayor McCallum "nay"
- Councilmember Campbell "aye"
- Councilmember Lewis "aye"
- Councilmember Henson "nay"

The motion passed by a vote of 4 in favor (Thomas, Moeller, Campbell and Lewis) with 3 against (Jeffus, McCallum, and Henson).

Mayor McCallum recessed the public meeting to call for a break at 7:26 p.m. Thereafter, he reconvened the meeting at 7:38 p.m., addressing Public Hearing item #1 next.

7. Discuss and consider the Hotel Occupancy Tax ("HOT") Subcommittee recommendations for funding allocations in fiscal year 2026, including authorizing the City Manager to execute associated funding arrangements, and take any action necessary.

City Manager, Mary Smith, shared some brief comments pertaining to this agenda item. Mrs. Smith shared, in part, that these recommendations include beginning the process of working to move the CVB functions ("Convention and Visitors Bureau") in house as a city department. Councilmember Lewis shared that while this line item for the Chamber is currently reflected at \$150,000, this amount could possibly increase at a later date. He shared that making this transition from the Chamber to the City could take longer than expected.

Councilmember Campbell thanked Darby and the Chamber as a whole, acknowledging that the chamber has played a vital role in the growth and success of the community as a whole. She is a strong supporter of the Chamber, its staff, its efforts and the Chamber Board, which all play a vital role in putting heads in beds, promoting tourism, and having our community be successful. She would like to see a hybrid type of situation related to the CVB aspect of the Chamber, specifically leaving a portion of the CVB function – like a desk front at the actual Chamber location – while also moving the CVB function over to the city. Councilmember Thomas expressed a lot of gratitude to the Chamber for all of its efforts over the years, sharing that he looks forward to a continued partnership. Mayor McCallum shared that it was important to allocate a portion of the funds to

ensure that the CVB functions continue. He went on to point out that the HOT Committee faced some tough choices, and not everything that was requested by all parties was able to be approved for funding.

Mayor McCallum went on to make a motion to accept the HOT Subcommittee recommendations for FY2026. City Manager, Mary Smith reminded Council that if any councilmember serves on a board for any of the organizations receiving funding, they will need to abstain from voting on those funding items.

Mayor McCallum then restated his motion, moving to approve the recommended funding allocations for fiscal year 2026, excluding the funds for Helping Hands and Meals on Wheels. Councilmember Lewis seconded the motion, which passed by a vote of 7 ayes to 0 nays.

Mayor Pro Tem Moeller went on to make a motion to approve the funding recommendation for Meals on Wheels and Helping Hands. The motion passed by a vote of 5 ayes with 2 abstentions (Lewis and Thomas).

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROCKWALL, TEXAS, AMENDING THE UNIFIED DEVELOPMENT CODE [ORDINANCE NO. 20-02] OF THE CITY OF ROCKWALL, AS HERETOFORE AMENDED, BY AMENDING ARTICLE 11, DEVELOPMENT REVIEW PROCEDURES, AS DEPICTED IN EXHIBIT 'A' OF THIS ORDINANCE; PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY OF FINE NOT TO EXCEED THE SUM OF TWO THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$2,000.00) FOR EACH OFFENSE; PROVIDING FOR A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR A REPEALER CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Rockwall, Texas adopted the Unified Development Code [*Ordinance No. 20-02*] on February 3, 2020 and the Unified Development Code (UDC) has been amended over the years to improve efficiency and ensure the safe, orderly and efficient development and expansion of the City of Rockwall in accordance with and pursuant to its Comprehensive Plan, Master Thoroughfare Plan, and Master Trail Plan; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that applicants of development cases that are scheduled to appear before the Planning and Zoning Commission, the Historic Preservation Advisory Board, the Board of Adjustment or the City Council that fail to attend the scheduled meeting/hearing where their application is being considered, be denied their application unless good cause is shown for their failure to appear;

WHEREAS, the Planning and Zoning Commission of the City of Rockwall and the governing body of the City of Rockwall in compliance with the laws of the State of Texas and the ordinances of the City of Rockwall have given the requisite notices by publication and otherwise, and have held public hearings and afforded a full and fair hearing to all property owners generally and to all persons interested in and situated in the city's corporate boundaries, and the governing body in the exercise of its legislative discretion, has concluded that the Unified Development Code [Ordinance No. 20-02] should be amended as follows:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROCKWALL, TEXAS:

- **SECTION 1. FINDINGS OF FACT.** The foregoing recitals are hereby found to be true and correct and are hereby adopted by the City Council and made a part hereof for all purposes as findings of fact.
- **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** That Article 11, *Development Applications and Review Procedures*, of the Unified Development Code [*Ordinance No. 20-02*] of the City of Rockwall, as heretofore amended, be and the same is hereby amended as specifically described in *Exhibit 'S'* of this ordinance;
- **SECTION 3. PENALTY OF FINE.** That any person, firm, or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be punished by a penalty of fine not to exceed the sum of *Two Thousand Dollars* (\$2,000.00) for each offense and each and every day such offense shall continue shall be deemed to constitute a separate offense;
- **SECTION 4. REMAINING PROVISIONS UNCHANGED.** That if any section, paragraph, or provision of this ordinance or the application of that section, paragraph, or provision to any person, firm, corporation or situation is for any reason judged invalid, the adjudication shall not affect any other section, paragraph, or provision of this ordinance or the application of any other section, paragraph or provision to any other person, firm, corporation or situation, nor shall adjudication affect any other section, paragraph, or provision of the Unified Development Code [*Ordinance No. 20-02*], and the City Council declares that it would have adopted the valid portions and applications of the ordinance without the invalid parts and to this end the provisions for this ordinance are declared to be severable;
- **SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE**. That this ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage.
- **SECTION 6. OPEN MEETINGS**. It is hereby officially found and determined that the meeting at which

this Ordinance is passed was open to the public as required and that public notice of the time, place and purpose of said meeting was given as required by the Open Meetings Act.

Article 11, Development Applications and Review Procedures, of the Unified Development Code (UDC)

CITY OF ROCKWALL | UNIFIED DEVELOPMENT CODE



SECTION 01 | GENERAL

SUBSECTION 01.01: PRE-APPLICATION MEETING

An applicant proposing to [1] establish a land use requiring a Specific Use Permit (SUP) on a property or properties, [2] the subdivision or assembly of property or properties, [3] the change in zoning classification of a property or properties, or [4] any other development related activity in the City of Rockwall is encouraged to request a Pre-Application Meeting with the Development Review Committee (DRC). Prior to a Pre-Application Meeting, the applicant should submit a Pre-Application Meeting Request form and provide a concept plan showing the proposed development activities in as much detail as possible. Based on the information provided by the applicant, the DRC will provide initial comments concerning the merits of the proposed development and inform the applicant of any additional requirements that will need to be addressed in the preparation of a development application.

SUBSECTION 01.02: SUBMISSION OF AN APPLICATION

- (A) <u>Authority to Submit an Application</u>. Unless otherwise stated in this Article, the following shall apply when submitting an application for a request:
 - (1) <u>Development Application</u>. All zoning, site plan, platting, and miscellaneous cases shall be initiated by the owner of the affected property or his/her authorized representative who files a Development Application and pays the appropriate fee.
 - (2) <u>Historic Preservation Advisory Board Application</u>. All Certificate of Appropriateness (COA), small matching grant, and building permit fee waiver requests shall be initiated by the owner of the affected property or his/her authorized representative who files a Historic Preservation Advisory Board Application.
 - (3) <u>Board of Adjustments Application</u>. All variance and special exceptions to be considered by the Board of Adjustments (BOA) shall be initiated by the owner of the affected property or his authorized representative or any aggrieved party who files the required application and pays the appropriate fee, or by any person aggrieved by the decision of an administrative officer with authority over any matter that can be appealed to the Board of Adjustments (BOA) per <u>Subsection 04.03</u>, <u>Jurisdiction</u>, of <u>Article 02</u>, <u>Development Review Authority</u>, by an officer of the City, or appropriate board/commission of the City.
- (B) <u>Ownership</u>. In the event that the ownership stated on an application is different than the ownership shown on the City's Certified Tax Roll, the Director of Planning and Zoning may require additional written proof of ownership be provided with an application.
- (C) <u>Submission Development Application</u>. All application requests to be considered by the Historic Preservation Advisory Board (HBAP), Board of Adjustments (BOA), Planning and Zoning Commission and/or the City Council, shall be initiated by filing an application with the Director of Planning and Zoning or his/her designee. All applications shall be required to be submitted on the official submittal date. Applications received on a date other than an official submittal date shall not be accepted and shall be returned to the applicant.

- (D) <u>Completed Application</u>. To ensure the submission of adequate information, the Director of Planning and Zoning is hereby empowered to maintain and distribute a list of specific submittal requirements that constitutes a completed application. Any application that does not provide all items required by the Director of Planning and Zoning shall be considered to be incomplete, and shall not be accepted by the City. These requirements may be modified by the Director of Planning and Zoning as deemed necessary.
- (E) Plans and Exhibits. All plans, surveys, plats, and/or other exhibits submitted as part of any application shall be prepared by a registered architect, engineer, landscape architect, surveyor, planner, or other design professional.

SUBSECTION 01.03: APPLICATION WITHDRAWAL

Any request for the withdrawal of an application must be submitted in writing to the Director of Planning and Zoning or his/her designee. If an application requires notice to be published in the newspaper and/or notifications of a public hearing sent to affected property owners, such request for withdrawal of an application must be placed on the public hearing agenda and acted upon by the applicable body. In all requests for withdraw, application fees will not be refunded except in cases where the Director of Planning and Zoning determines that an application was [1] submitted in error, or [2] the fee paid exceeds the amount due under the provisions of Section 10, Fee Schedule. In cases where the fee paid exceeds the amount due, only the amount of the overpayment may be refunded.

SUBSECTION 01.04: DENIAL OF AN APPLICATION

- (A) <u>Denial with Prejudice</u>. Unless otherwise stated in this Article, if an application for site plan, plat, miscellaneous case, Certificate of Appropriateness (COA), small matching grant, or building permit fee waiver is denied with prejudice by the Historic Preservation Advisory Board (HPAB), Planning and Zoning Commission, or City Council, a new application for the same request may not be submitted for the same lot or tract of land or any portion thereof for a period of one (1) year unless the request is deemed to be more restrictive or less intense than the previously denied request. A failure to indicate that a denial is with or without prejudice, in making a motion to deny, shall be consider a denial with prejudice.
- (B) Administrative Denial. Alternatively, should an applicant fail to address staff's comments before the resubmittal deadline prior to the Planning and Zoning Commission meeting, the application shall be considered to be admiratively denied. If an application is denied in this manner it shall be considered to be denied without prejudice, and there shall be no restrictions on when a new application can be resubmitted; however, new applications will be required to be submitted in accordance with the City's procedures for submitting development applications.
- (C) Failure to Appear. Failure of the applicant to appear before the City Council, Planning and Zoning Commission, Historic Preservation Advisory Board (HPAB), or Board of Adjustments (BOA) for any hearing without an approved delay from the Director of Planning and Zoning or his/her designee shall constitute sufficient grounds for the City Council, Planning and Zoning Commission, Historic Preservation Advisory Board (HPAB), or Board of Adjustments (BOA) to deny the application.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Rockwall, Texas adopted the Unified Development Code [*Ordinance No. 20-02*] on February 3, 2020 and the Unified Development Code (UDC) has been amended over the years to improve efficiency and ensure the safe, orderly and efficient development and expansion of the City of Rockwall in accordance with and pursuant to its Comprehensive Plan, Master Thoroughfare Plan, and Master Trail Plan; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that there is a need to strengthen the regulations regarding building permits in that some projects lay dormant or show little progress over the years; and,

WHEREAS, the Planning and Zoning Commission of the City of Rockwall and the governing body of the City of Rockwall in compliance with the laws of the State of Texas and the ordinances of the City of Rockwall have given the requisite notices by publication and otherwise, and have held public hearings and afforded a full and fair hearing to all property owners generally and to all persons interested in and situated in the city's corporate boundaries, and the governing body in the exercise of its legislative discretion, has concluded that the Unified Development Code [Ordinance No. 20-02] should be amended as follows:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROCKWALL, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. FINDINGS OF FACT. The foregoing recitals are hereby found to be true and correct and are hereby adopted by the City Council and made a part hereof for all purposes as findings of fact.

SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. That Article 12, *Enforcement*, of the Unified Development Code [*Ordinance No. 20-02*] of the City of Rockwall, as heretofore amended, be and the same is hereby amended as specifically described in *Exhibit* 'S' of this ordinance;

SECTION 3. PENALTY OF FINE. That any person, firm, or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be punished by a penalty of fine not to exceed the sum of *Two Thousand Dollars* (\$2,000.00) for each offense and each and every day such offense shall continue shall be deemed to constitute a separate offense;

SECTION 4. REMAINING PROVISIONS UNCHANGED. That if any section, paragraph, or provision of this ordinance or the application of that section, paragraph, or provision to any person, firm, corporation or situation is for any reason judged invalid, the adjudication shall not affect any other section, paragraph, or provision of this ordinance or the application of any other section, paragraph or provision to any other person, firm, corporation or situation, nor shall adjudication affect any other section, paragraph, or provision of the Unified Development Code [*Ordinance No. 20-02*], and the City Council declares that it would have adopted the valid portions and applications of the ordinance without the invalid parts and to this end the provisions for this ordinance are declared to be severable;

SECTION 5. EFFECTIVE DATE. That this ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage.

SECTION 6. OPEN MEETINGS. It is hereby officially found and determined that the meeting at which this Ordinance is passed was open to the public as required and that public notice of the time, place and purpose of said meeting was given as required by the Open Meetings Act.

Article 12, Enforcement, of the Unified Development Code (UDC)

CITY OF ROCKWALL | UNIFIED DEVELOPMENT CODE



SECTION 01 | PENALTIES

SUBSECTION 01.01: COMPLIANCE AND FINES

Any person who violates or fails to comply with the requirements of the Unified Development Code (UDC) or who builds or alters any building in violation of any plan or statement submitted and approved hereunder, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be liable to a fine of not more than \$2,000.00. Each day such violation shall be permitted to exist shall constitute a separate offense. The owner of any building or premises or part thereof, where anything in violation of the Unified Development Code (UDC) shall be placed or shall exist shall be guilty of a separate offense and upon conviction thereof shall be fined as herein provided.

SUBSECTION 01.02: OTHER ACTIONS

Nothing herein contained shall prevent the City from taking such other lawful action as is necessary to prevent or remedy any violation.

SECTION 02 | STOP WORK ORDER

SUBSECTION 02.01: STOP WORK ORDER

When the City determines that there has been non-compliance with any material term, condition or requirement of the Unified Development Code (UDC), the City may order any person having a proprietary interest in the property or any person engaged in the development or construction on the property to cease and desist from engaging in any further development or construction activities on the site. The Stop Work Order shall be in writing and shall be posted on the site. The order shall specifically state the nature of the non-compliance and the acts prohibited

The City may bring suit in a court of competent jurisdiction to restrain and enjoin any person attempting or allowing development or construction without a permit or other authorization or who fails to cease and desist from further development or construction after notice of a stop work order has been posted in accordance with this Article.

When the City determines that there has been non-compliance with the Unified Development Code (UDC) which constitutes a health or safety hazard, a stop work order shall be issued and shall remain in effect until there has been compliance with the Unified Development Code (UDC). This Article shall not override the county health director or designee's ability to suspend, or reinstate food or child care permits in conformance with state and federal laws.

SUBSECTION 02.02: APPEAL PROCESS

Appeal of a *Stop Work Order*, suspension or revocation may be made to the City Council or the appropriate board or commission, by any person aggrieved, by giving written notice no later than three (3) days after the stop work order is posted, or notice of the suspension or revocation is received. The notice shall state:

- (A) The name and address of the person making the appeal;
- (B) The facts surrounding of particular appeal;
- (C) The nature of the Stop Work Order, suspension or revocation; and
- (D) The reasons why the ruling should be set aside.

The City Council or appropriate board or commission shall hear the appeal at its next regularly scheduled meeting following receipt of the

notice of appeal provided that the appeal is received at least three working days prior to that meeting. The City Council or appropriate board or commission shall either affirm or reverse the decision appealed no later than seven (7) days after the close of the hearing.

An appeal brought under this section shall not stay the Stop Work Order, suspension or revocation.

SECTION 03 | OCCUPANCY, BUILDING, AND USE PERMITS

SUBSECTION 03.01: BUILDING PERMITS REQUIRED

- (A) <u>Building Permit Required</u>. No building or other structure shall be erected, moved, added to, or structurally altered without a permit issued by the Chief Building Official, as required by <u>Chapter 10</u>, <u>Building and Building Regulations</u>, of the <u>Municipal Code of Ordinances</u>. A building permit shall not be issued except in conformity with the provisions of the Unified Development Code (UDC), unless otherwise authorized by the Board of Adjustment (BOA) in the form of a variance as provided by the Unified Development Code (UDC).
- (B) <u>Building Permit Expiration</u>. The purpose of this section is to provide an expiration date for building permits that are approved by the City of Rockwall.
 - (1) <u>Building Permits Issued After October 6, 2025</u>. Any building permit issued by the City of Rockwall on or after October 6, 2025, shall expire in six (6) months from October 6, 2025, if at the time of issuance, the permit did not have an expiration date and no progress has been made towards the completion of the project as determined by the Chief Building Official.
 - (2) <u>Building Permits Issued Before October 6, 2025</u>. Not with standing any other provision of this Article, any building permit issued on or before October 6, 2025, shall expire in two (2) years from October 6, 2025, if at the time of issuance, the permit did not have an expiration date and the building is not substantially complete as determined by the Chief Building
 - (3) Extension of a Building Permit. Any extension of a building permit must be requested in writing prior to the expiration date of the building permit, and such request must be accompanied by evidence that substantial progress has been made towards completion of the project. The Chief Building Official shall have sole discretion as to any extension of a building permit.
 - (4) <u>Appeal of an Extension Request</u>. If the Chief Building Official denies an extension, the applicant of the extension request shall have ten (10) days to file an appeal with the Board of Adjustments (BOA) on the grounds of an Appeal of an Administrative Decision as defined in Subsection 04.03(A)(1) of Article 02, Development Review Authority, of this Unified Development Code (UDC).

SUBSECTION 03.02: CERTIFICATES OF OCCUPANCY FOR NEW, ALTERED, OR NON-CONFORMING USES

(A) It shall be unlawful to use, occupy, or permit the use or occupancy of any building or premises or both, or part thereof, hereafter created, erected, changed, converted or altered or enlarged in its

Any person, firm, or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be punished by a penalty of fine not to exceed the sum of *TWO THOUSAND DOLLARS* (\$2,000.00) for each offence and each and every day such offense shall continue shall be deemed to constitute a separate offense.

SECTION 6. If any section or provision of this ordinance or the application of that section or provision to any person, firm, corporation, situation or circumstance is for any reason judged invalid, the adjudication shall not affect any other section or provision of this ordinance or the application of any other section or provision to any other person, firm, corporation, situation or circumstance, and the City Council declares that it would have adopted the valid portions and applications of the ordinance without the invalid parts and to this end the provisions of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

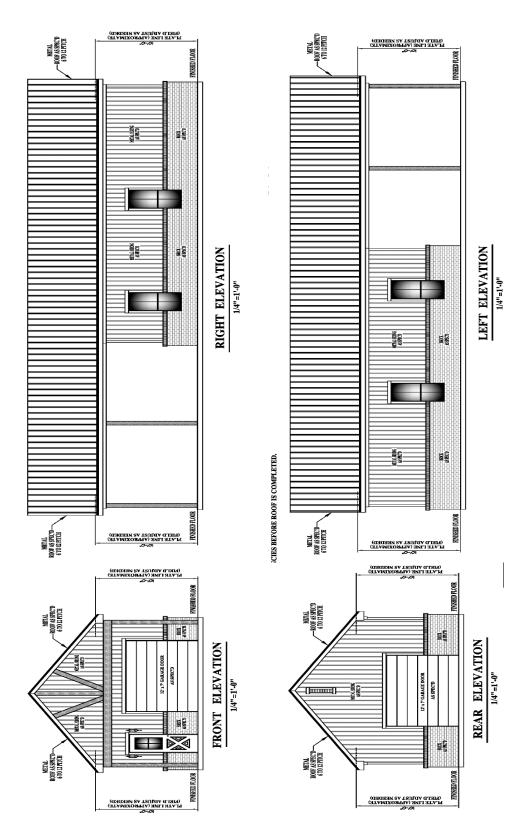

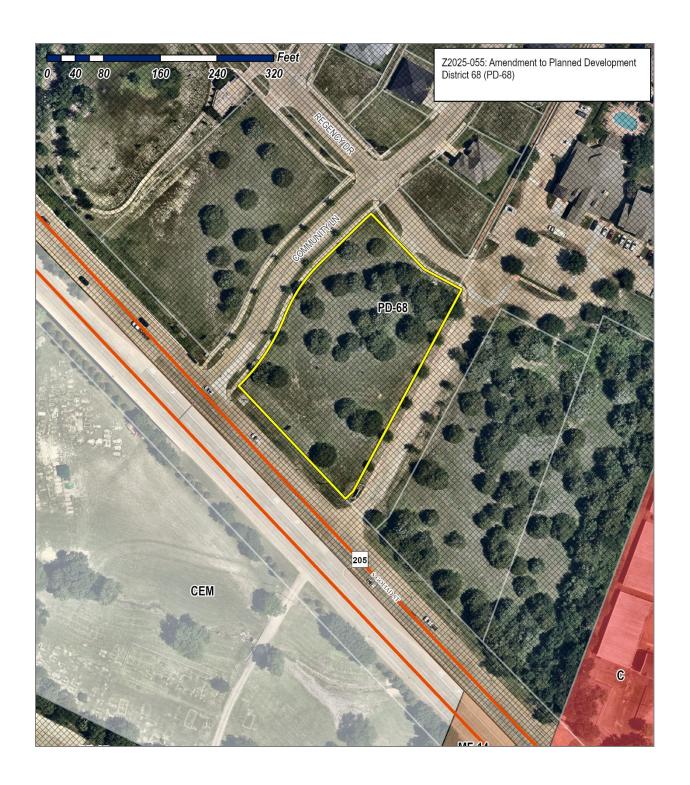


Exhibit 'B': Concept Plan

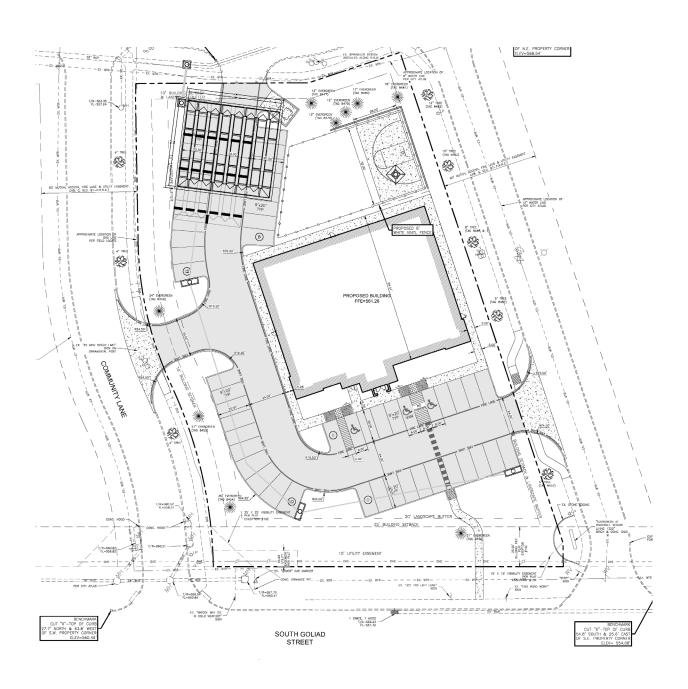
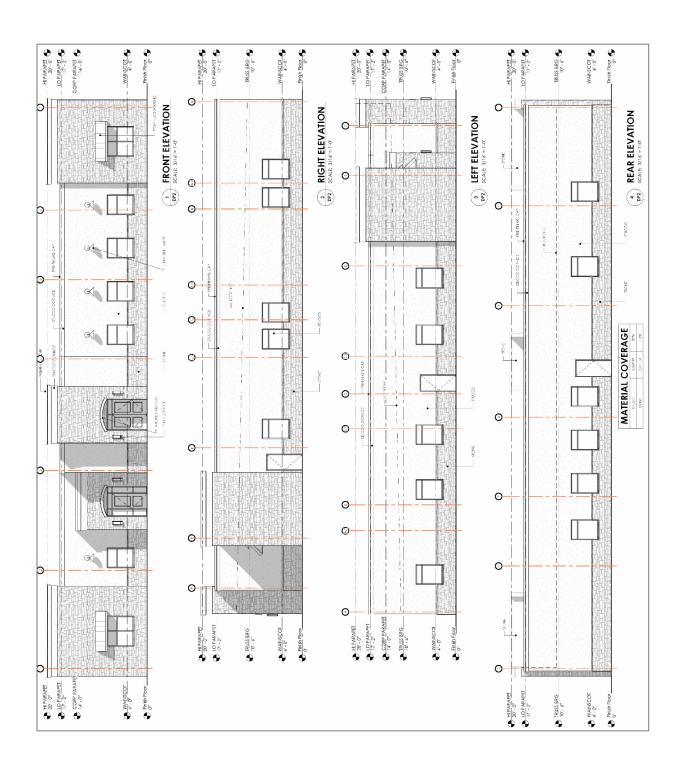


Exhibit 'C':Conceptual Building Elevations

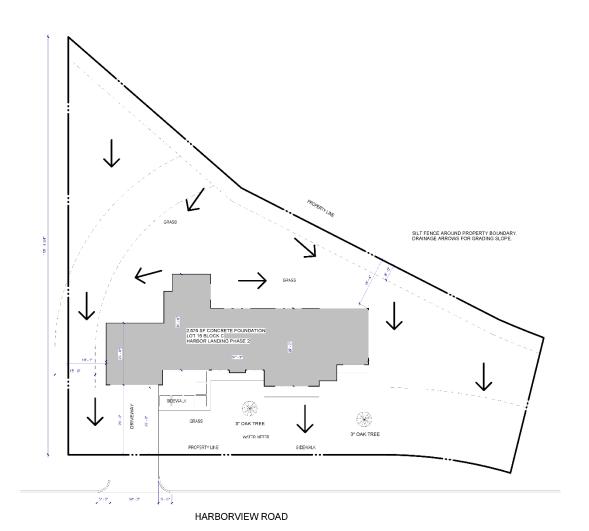
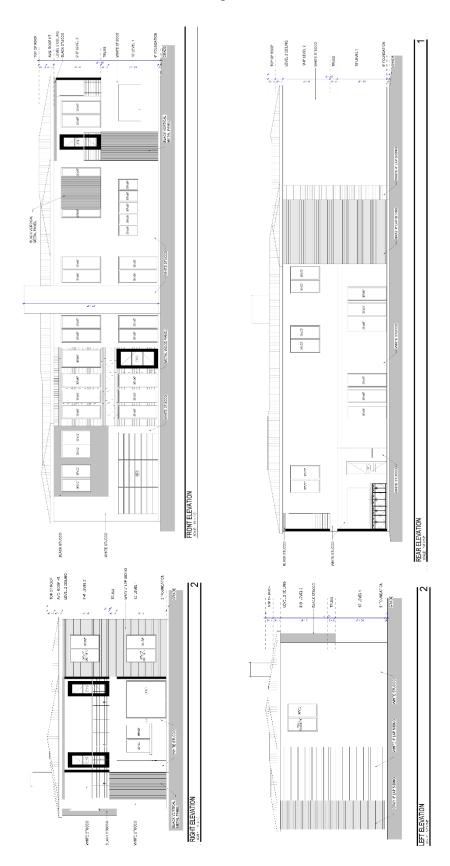


Exhibit 'C':

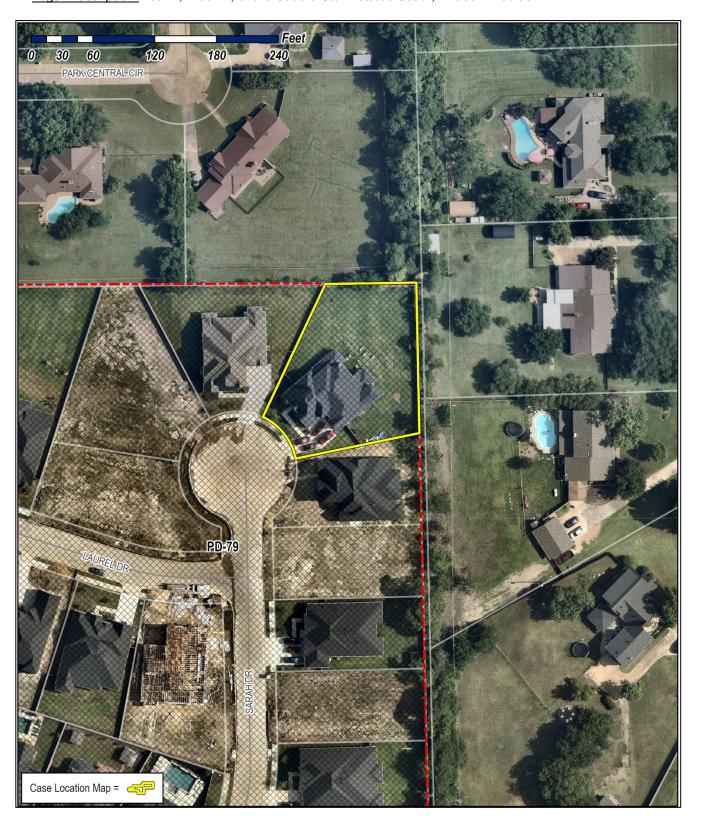


Exhibit 'B' Site Plan

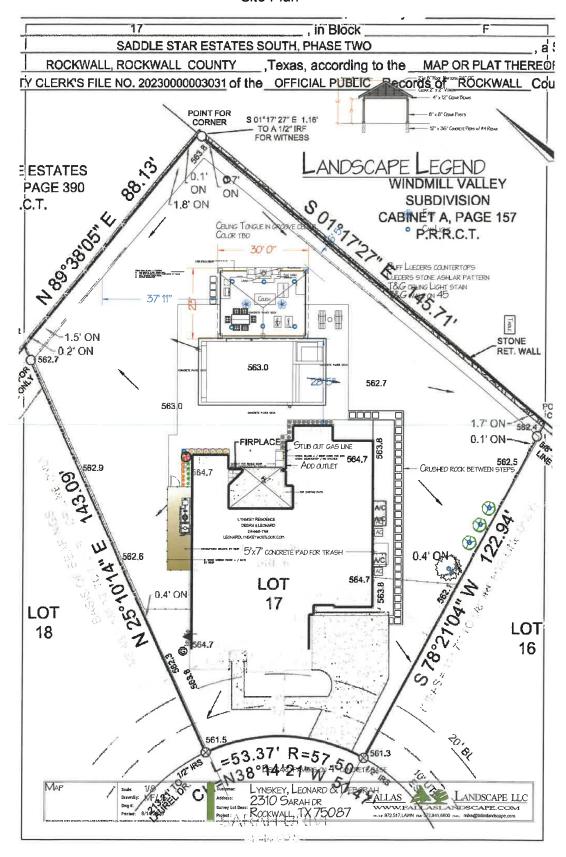
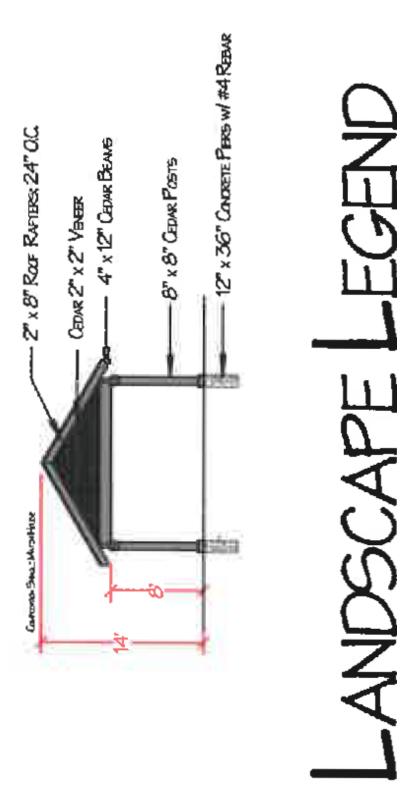


Exhibit 'C':

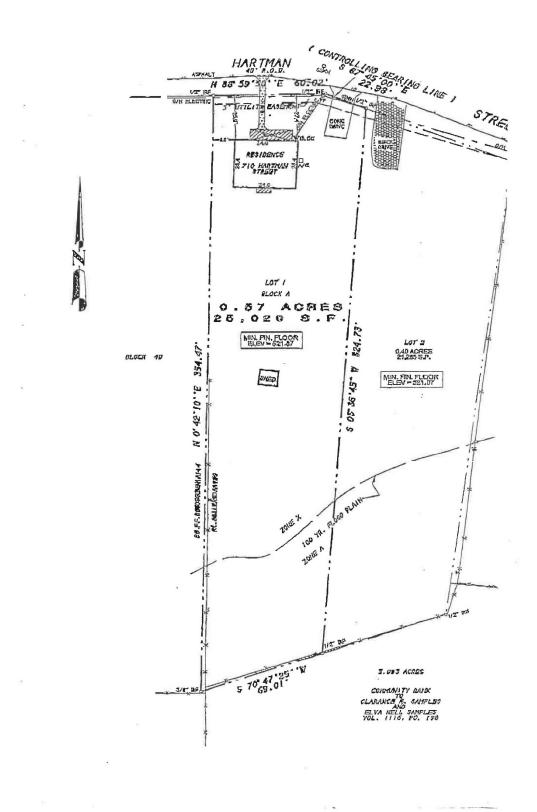
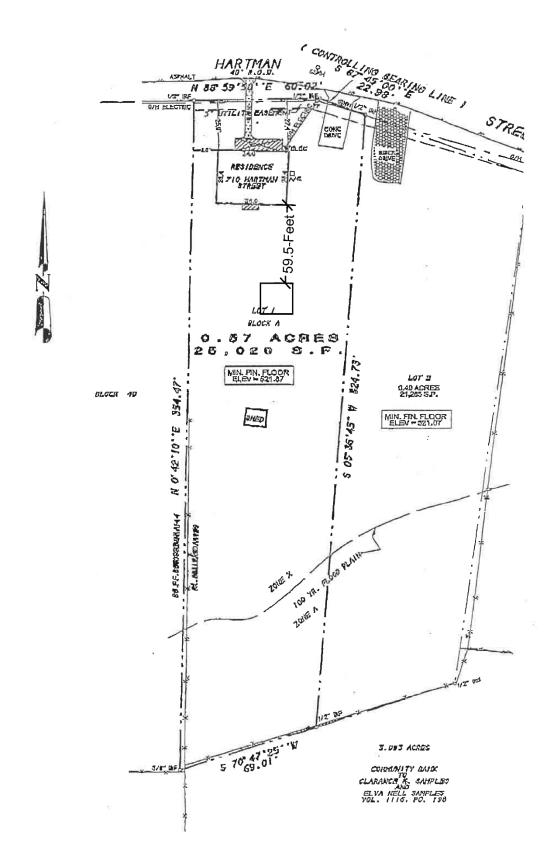


Exhibit 'B':

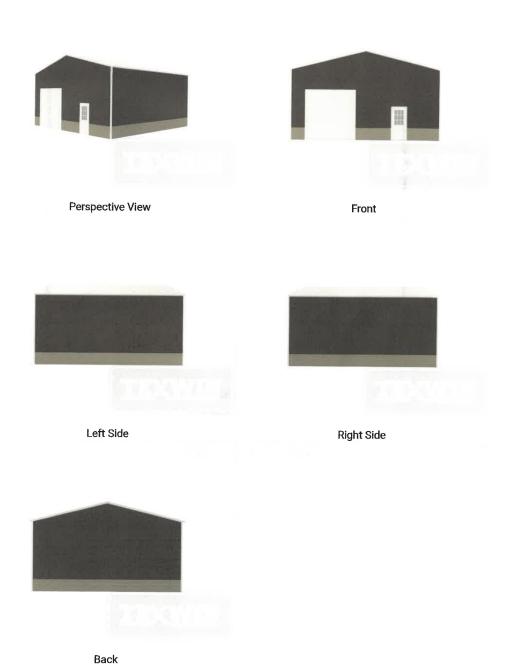

STAR Transit Contract for Fiscal Year 2026

Included for City Council review and consideration is the agreement between the City of Rockwall and STAR Transit for transportation services in the City for fiscal year 2026.

The key points of the agreement are:

- The term of the agreement is: October 1, 2025 through September 30, 2026.
- The City and STAR agree that no fixed route service may be provided under the terms of this Agreement, that no funds from this Agreement will be utilized to support a fixed route service, and that STAR Transit will not request funds or in kind support from the City if STAR Transit elects to operate a fixed route in the City of Rockwall under funding outside of this Agreement.
- Service will be provided five (5) days per week, Monday through Friday, calculated as 250 service days for the fiscal year.
- The monthly rate charged for transit service is \$10,968.75.

The City Council is asked to consider approval of the contract with STAR Transit in the amount of \$131,625 and authorize the City Manager to execute the agreement on behalf of the City of Rockwall. Funds are available in the Administration Operating Budget for this service.

INTERLOCAL COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT

BETWEEN

STAR TRANSIT

AND

CITY OF ROCKWALL, TEXAS

This Interlocal Cooperative Agreement ("Agreement") is between STAR TRANSIT ("STAR Transit") and the CITY OF ROCKWALL, Texas ("CITY"), a political subdivision of the state of Texas, each organized and existing under the laws of the State of Texas, and acting by, through and under the authority of their respective governing bodies. STAR Transit and the CITY may each be referred to as a "Party" to this Agreement and may be collectively referred to as "Parties" in this Agreement.

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, STAR Transit is a Rural Transit District established pursuant to the authority of Chapter 458, Texas Transportation Code, as amended, with its headquarters in Terrell, Texas, and currently provides transit services within several area jurisdictions; and

WHEREAS, the CITY is a local government entity of the State of Texas; and

WHEREAS, the CITY has requested STAR Transit provide services and is authorized to execute this Agreement with STAR Transit for the purpose of providing for the operation and management of public transportation services for the benefit of the citizens of the CITY; and

WHEREAS, STAR Transit, its officers and supervisory employees are trained and experienced in the operation and management of public transportation and is authorized to execute this Agreement with the CITY for the purpose of providing services as specified herein; and

WHEREAS, the Agreement is made pursuant to and under the authority of the Interlocal Cooperation Act of 1971, as amended, and codified in Chapter 791 of the Texas Government Code (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, STAR Transit and the CITY are local governments as defined in §791.003 of the Act, and each are empowered by §791.011 of the Act to contract with each other to provide governmental functions and services including public and elderly transportation; and

WHEREAS, STAR Transit publishes an annual cost of service letter with its Fiscal Year operating cost schedule no later than June 1 each year and utilizes an hourly rate to adjust amounts payable by its local partners, including CITY, each year; and,

WHEREAS, the purpose of this Agreement is to provide a variety of public transit services to the benefit of residents and businesses in the CITY, the "Public Transit Services".

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants contained herein, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the Parties hereby agree as follows:

ARTICLE I

Incorporation of Recitals

The foregoing recitals are hereby incorporated into the body of this Agreement and shall be considered part of the mutual covenants, consideration and promises that bind the Parties.

ARTICLE II

Term

This Agreement shall be effective upon execution by both Parties with services already in progress due to previous arrangements between the Parties and the initial term shall begin on October 1, 2025 and end on September 30, 2026. If not otherwise terminated in accordance with the termination provisions of Article V of this Agreement, this Agreement extends for subsequent twelve (12) month periods starting on the first (1st) day of October each year.

ARTICLE III

Rights, Duties and Responsibilities of STAR Transit

- 3.1 <u>Board of Directors.</u> STAR Transit is designated to supervise the performance of this Agreement and to operate the Public Transit Service within the CITY's jurisdictions and subdivisions. Such operations shall be overseen solely by the STAR Transit Board of Directors. STAR Transit shall be responsible for the safe, efficient, and effective operation of all services provided.
- Management Scope. STAR Transit agrees to manage, supervise and operate the Public Transit Services in an efficient and economical manner. STAR Transit shall operate all properties, equipment, facilities, routes, and services now or hereafter existing for the purposes of this Agreement. STAR Transit shall provide full and complete management services for the Public Transit Service and any specific duties and obligations set forth shall not be construed as limitations. STAR Transit shall perform the active direction of the Public Transit Services, including transportation, maintenance, schedule preparation, dispatching, communications, accounting, public relations, and safety. All such services may be provided at the principal office of STAR Transit in Terrell, Texas or at such other place, or places as STAR Transit shall determine.
- 3.3 <u>Administrative Functions.</u> STAR Transit shall administer all properties, equipment, buses, vehicles, facilities, maintenance, gasoline, repairs, replacements, services, expenditures, and resources necessary for safe, efficient, and effective operations. STAR Transit shall employ, train, furnish, and supervise the personnel necessary for the operation of the Public Transit Services. STAR Transit shall oversee all aspects of employment including employee recruiting, selection, training, wages and benefits. STAR Transit shall perform all aspects of general administrative oversight including technical guidance, payroll, accounts payable, purchasing, contracting, finance and other administration necessary for the proper operation of the system.
- 3.4 <u>Transit Vehicle Operators.</u> Every vehicle providing Public Transit Service under this Agreement shall be operated by an operator duly licensed by the State of Texas to operate vehicles of the type and size being operated by such operator and such operator shall be appropriately dress in a uniform selected by STAR Transit.

- Routes, Schedules, Fares. The Public Transit Services shall be operated with routes and schedule established by STAR Transit with input from CITY. In no case shall the Public Transit Services operate on a Saturday, Sunday, regular annual holidays as designated by the STAR Transit Board of Directors, or days on which STAR Transit deem conditions are unsafe or otherwise inappropriate for service in accordance with Section 7.4. STAR Transit shall have authority to make modifications to any routes without the necessity of obtaining CITY approval. In no case shall the Public Transit Services require a service beginning prior to 5:00 AM or ending after 9:00 PM. Fares for riders shall be established by the STAR Transit Board of Directors and such fares shall be consistent throughout the STAR Transit system. The Parties agree that no fixed route service may be provided under the terms of this Agreement, that no funds from this Agreement will be utilized to support a fixed route service, and that STAR Transit will not request funds or in kind support from CITY if STAR Transit elects to operate a fixed route in the City of Rockwall under funding outside of this Agreement.
- Transit Vehicles. STAR Transit shall use only such vehicles as are appropriate to provide the Public Transit Service. All vehicles shall be fully compliant with the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, U.S. Code §12101, et. seq., as amended and relevant regulations applicable thereto, licensed for passenger operations by the State of Texas and equipped with a two-way communication system. STAR Transit shall provide or cause to be provided all mechanical and other repairs, maintenance and upkeep necessary to maintain vehicles in good working order and in a clean, sanitary and safe condition.
- 3.7 Operating Cost Charge to CITY. STAR Transit shall charge for services and CITY agrees to compensate STAR Transit for services based on the following:
 - A. Service Days: Service up to five (5) days per week, Monday through Friday; set and calculated as two hundred fifty (250) service days each Fiscal Year. This number of Service Days shall be charged each Fiscal Year regardless of actual calendar service days or events as noted in Section 7.4. This number of charged Service Days may be adjusted only by Amendment to the Contract duly approved by CITY and the STAR Transit Board of Directors.
 - B. Daily Hours: A total of thirty (30) hours of in-service time including pre- and post-trip time on average each operating day. Average Daily Hours may be adjusted, in writing, by mutual agreement of the parties, no more often than once per every one hundred and twenty (120) calendar days.

- C. Hourly Cost: For the first STAR Transit Fiscal Year, average cost per hour shall be charged at fifty-eight dollars and fifty cents (\$58.50). Each Fiscal Year thereafter, during the term of this Agreement, the average cost per hour shall be charged at the current STAR Transit Public Transit Hourly Rate. The STAR Transit Board of Directors shall publish an annual cost of service letter with its upcoming Fiscal Year operating cost schedule no later than the first (1st) day of June each year and utilize that hourly rate to adjust amounts payable by CITY.
- D. Annual Operating Cost. Each Fiscal Year, the annual operating cost shall be calculated by multiplying Service Days (Line A) by Daily Hours (Line B) and by Hourly Cost (Line C).
- E. Operating Off-Sets. STAR Transit expects a net sixty percent (60%) operating cost subsidy on the Public Transit Service from a combination of Federal, State, Regional, and Private Contract sources. So long as such subsidy is in place, it shall be used as an off-set to reduce the Annual Operating Cost charged to CITY. The Operating Off-Set may be adjusted only by Amendment to the Agreement duly approved by CITY and the STAR Transit Board of Directors.
- F. Monthly Charge to CITY. The Monthly Charge to CITY shall be the Annual Operating Cost (Line E) multiplied by any Operating Off-Set (Line F) divided by twelve (12). For the first Fiscal Year, the Monthly Charge to CITY is set at ten thousand nine hundred and sixty-eight dollars and seventy-five cents (\$10,968.75). Payment for all services shall be due fifteen (15) days in advance of service. STAR Transit shall invoice CITY for each service month no earlier than fifteen (15) days prior to each service month. For future Fiscal Years, starting with the cost for operations to be performed in October 2026, STAR Transit shall invoice, and CITY agrees to pay, based on the up-to-date monthly calculation as described herein.
- G. Subsequent Fiscal Years. In following STAR Transit Fiscal Years, the monthly charge to CITY shall be calculated by STAR Transit with the identical methodology utilizing any updated parameters. This calculation and the resulting monthly rate will be provided by STAR Transit in writing to CITY prior to the first (1st) day of June each year.
- H. Additional Services. Any month in which the CITY requests average daily hours for non-holiday weekdays exceeding the average daily hours established in Section 3.7 (B) shall be a month in which STAR Transit shall increase the monthly charge in the next available billing cycle by the total number of increased hours (or partial hours) of service multiplied by the current charter rate as established by the STAR Transit Board of Directors. Any other special services requested by CITY and scheduled by STAR Transit, which is not covered under the specific monthly service terms of this Agreement, or under subsequent duly approved Amendments or modifications, shall be billed to CITY on the next available invoice by STAR Transit at the current charter rate as established by the STAR Transit Board of Directors.

- 3.8 <u>Capital Cost Charge to CITY.</u> The parties concur that the CITY will not participate in capital expenditures.
- 3.9 Marketing. STAR Transit will provide the CITY with service information for posting on the CITY Website and advertise the services on the STAR Transit homepage. As part of its regular outreach programs, STAR Transit will market the Public Transit Service in a variety of media and locations likely to attract potential riders. STAR Transit shall maintain rights to final approval of all marketing materials.
- 3.10 Reporting. STAR Transit will provide the CITY a monthly summary of ridership data within thirty (30) days after the last day of the preceding month, an annual summary of ridership after the end of the STAR Transit Fiscal Year, a copy of the adopted Annual Budget, and a copy of the approved annual audit.
- 3.11 <u>Contract Management.</u> STAR Transit will pursue and apply for grant funding opportunities which may be applicable to and beneficial to the Agreement. STAR Transit will be responsible for complying with the obligations and responsibilities under all grants and all accompanying certifications, assurances, and agreements made or given by the Federal Transit Administration, Texas Department of Transportation, or any other applicable entity. STAR Transit will be responsible for complying with all applicable laws, rules, regulations and guidelines associated with STAR Transit services. STAR Transit will provide any documents needed to support Federal, State, or Regional grant administration or other data or audit requirements to the appropriate entity in a timely manner. Grant funding shall be used to offset monthly charges to the CITY if applicable to service provided within the CITY.
- 3.12 <u>Permits.</u> STAR Transit shall secure or cause to be secured, at its cost and expense, all permits and other governmental authorizations, which may be required to fulfill this Agreement.

ARTICLE IV

Rights, Duties and Responsibilities of the CITY

- 4.1 Payment for Service. CITY shall pay all invoices provided by STAR Transit under this Agreement within thirty (30) days of receipt. Such payments shall constitute a current expense of the CITY and shall not in any way be considered or construed to be a debt of the CITY's in contravention of any constitutional, statutory, or charter provision. Any CITY paying for STAR Transit's services must make those payments with current revenues available and the CITY hereby affirms that funds to pay said payments to STAR Transit are available for the current Fiscal Year.
- 4.2 <u>Parking.</u> CITY shall permit STAR Transit to access or temporarily park, vehicles, as necessary, in the public parking areas of CITY facilities under the condition that such access does not exceed one (1) hour per episode.
- 4.3 <u>Promotions.</u> The CITY shall promote services via CITY facilities, municipal resident water bill, CITY Social Media Outlets, News Releases, CITY Website and additional promotional opportunities that become available during the duration of the Agreement. The CITY shall facilitate, as needed and within CITY budget constraints, the efforts of STAR Transit to market the Public Transit Services. CITY shall make all CITY generated marketing materials available for review and approval by STAR Transit.

ARTICLE V

Termination

- Program Conclusion. During the initial term, but no later than June 30, 2026, either party may provide written notice of termination to be effective on September 30, 2026. During subsequent twelve (12) month terms, either party may provide written notice of termination no later than June 30 for the following Fiscal Year commencing on the first (1st) day of October.
- 5.2 <u>Mutual Agreement</u>. This Agreement may be terminated immediately at any time by a written agreement signed by both Parties setting forth the agreed termination date.

- Termination due to Default. Termination due to Default must be preceded by (1) written notice stating specific provision violated in this Agreement, (2) a thirty (30) day period for cure and (3) a second notice of failure to cure and final termination. A Party shall be in default of this Agreement if such Party fails to timely keep or perform any term, provision, covenant, or condition to be kept or performed by such Party under the terms of this Agreement and/or any other agreement now or hereafter existing between the Parties and such failure continues for thirty (30) days after written notice by the non-defaulting Party to the defaulting Party (a "Default"). Upon the occurrence of a Default, the non-defaulting Party shall have the right to terminate this Agreement by written notice to the defaulting Party and shall further have the right to exercise any and/or all other rights and/or remedies available to such Party at common law, by statute, in equity or otherwise pursuant to the laws of the State of Texas. In addition, CITY may terminate due to default if performance standards are not met or if CITY deems the operation of the service by STAR Transit is unreliable, unsafe or of poor quality.
- 5.4 Termination by Operation or Breach of Law. In the performance of this agreement, STAR Transit shall comply with all state, federal and local laws, regulations and standards. If the purpose or intent of this agreement is prevented or is contrary to any other law, including but not limited to section 458.012, Texas Transportation Code, this agreement shall be deemed null and void and of no force and effect. If the operation of the service by STAR Transit is in violation of any law or regulation that does not frustrate the purpose or intent of this agreement, or if repeated violations occur, the CITY may terminate the service immediately upon notice. Any pre-paid amounts for monthly service shall be immediately refunded to CITY.

ARTICLE VI

Responsible Party Provisions

- 6.1 <u>Legal Liability.</u> As a designated political subdivision, STAR Transit is a "governmental unit" as that term is defined in Chapter 101 of the Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code. Therefore, the extent of STAR Transit's liability for actions arising out of the operation of a public transportation system shall be governed by Chapter 101 of the Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code.
- 6.2 <u>Limitation of Liability.</u> To the extent authorized by the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, the Parties agree that each Party shall be responsible for its own acts and omissions and the acts

and omissions of its agents, representatives and employees in the performance of this Agreement. It is expressly understood and agreed by the Parties that neither Party shall be held liable for the acts or omissions of the other Party's agents, representatives, or employees in the performance of this Agreement. Both parties shall hold harmless, indemnify and defend the other from and against any claims, damages, losses or liability of any character, type, or description, including all expenses of litigation, court costs, and attorney's fees, for injury or death to any person, injury or loss to any property, or economic loss, received or sustained by any person or persons, or property, directly or indirectly arising out of, or occasioned by the acts, omissions or conduct of the indemnifying party, without waiving the party's governmental, sovereign or other immunities or defenses available under Texas law and without waiving any defenses of the parties under Texas law.

- 6.3 <u>Insurance</u>. Each party shall maintain its own insurance in sufficient amounts to cover any occurrence or claim related to its responsibilities in delivering the Public Transit Services.
- 6.4 <u>Immunity</u>. In the execution and performance of this Agreement, the Parties do not waive, and neither Party shall be deemed to have waived, any immunity or defense that would otherwise be available to each Party as a local governmental entity and/or political subdivision of the State of Texas. Nothing in this Agreement shall be deemed or construed to created any right or interest in any person not a party to this Agreement, and there are no third-party beneficiaries hereof.
- 6.5 Survival. All provisions of this Article shall expressly survive the termination of this Agreement.

Article VII

Miscellaneous

- 7.1 <u>Captions.</u> The descriptive captions of this Agreement are for convenience of reference only and shall in no way define, describe, limit, expand or affect the scope, terms, conditions, or intent of this Agreement.
- 7.2 <u>Compliance with Laws.</u> STAR Transit and its officers, agents and employees shall comply with all applicable federal, state and local health, safety, disability, environmental and other laws, ordinances, rules and regulations in the performance of the Public Transit Service.

- 7.3 Powers. STAR Transit has all the powers of CITY necessary to operate its services. By way of illustration, but not for limitation, STAR Transit has the power to contract, to acquire and own real and personal property, and to accept and expend funds from government, legal entities and individuals. STAR Transit does not have the power to tax, to obligate CITY, to assess CITY, or to adopt ordinances or laws.
- Force Majeure. STAR Transit shall not be liable to CITY for any failure, delay, interruption of service caused by acts of God, fire, snow, ice, flooding, tornado, utility outages, riots, civil commotion, labor disruptions, sabotage, sovereign conduct, acts of terror, pandemic, or any other cause beyond the reasonable control of STAR Transit and not attributable to any neglect or negligence on the part of STAR Transit. In the event of such occurrence, the time for performance of such services shall be suspended until such time that such inability to perform shall be removed. STAR Transit shall make all reasonable efforts to mitigate the effects of any such suspension or interruption of service and CITY shall not be entitled to any compensation for any such event.
- 7.5 Severability. The sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, and phrases of this Agreement are severable and, if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, or section of this Agreement should be declared invalid, illegal, or unenforceable by the final judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity shall not affect the validity or enforceability of any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, and sections of this Agreement and such remaining provisions shall remain in full force and effect and shall be construed and enforced as if the invalid provision had never been included in the Agreement.
- Notices. Any notice required or permitted to be given under the terms of this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be considered properly given if mailed by United States mail, certified mail, return receipt requested, in a postage paid envelope addressed to the Party at the address set forth below, or by delivering same in person to the intended addressee by hand delivery or by a nationally recognized courier service such as Federal Express or United Parcel Service. Notices mailed by certified mail as set forth above shall be effective upon deposit in the United States mail. Notice given in any other manner shall be effective only if and when received by the addressee. For purposes of notice, the addresses of the Parties shall by as set forth below; provided, however, that any Party shall have the right to change such Party's address for notice purposes by giving the other

Party at least thirty (30) days prior written notice of such change of address in the manner set forth herein:

- 7.7 <u>Entire Agreement.</u> This Agreement, together with all attachments hereto, sets forth the entire Agreement between the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof, and all prior discussions, representations, proposals, offers, and oral or written communications of any nature are entirely superseded hereby and extinguished by the execution of this Agreement.
- 7.8 <u>Modification.</u> This Agreement may only be revised, modified, or amended by a written document signed by STAR Transit and the CITY. Oral revisions, modification, or amendments are not permitted.
- 7.9 <u>Waiver.</u> All waivers, to be effective, must be in writing and signed by the waiving party. No failure by either Party to insist upon the strict or timely performance of any covenant, duty, agreement, term, or condition of this Agreement shall constitute a waiver of any such covenant, duty, agreement, term, or condition. No delay or omission in the exercise of any right or remedy accruing to either Party upon a breach of this Agreement shall impair such right or remedy or be construed as a waiver of any such breach or a waiver of any breach theretofore or thereafter occurring.
- 7.10 <u>Authority.</u> Each Party represents and warrants to the other that this Agreement has been authorized by the governing body of such Party and that each such Party has the full power and authority to

enter into and fulfill its obligations under this Agreement. Each person signing this Agreement represents that such person has the authority to sign this Agreement on behalf of the Party indicated.

- 7.11 <u>Assignment.</u> This Agreement shall not be assigned or transferred by either Party without prior written consent of the other Party, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld.
- 7.12 <u>Independence</u>. The Parties are acting herein as independent contractors and independent employers. Nothing herein shall create or be construed as creating a partnership, joint venture or agency relationship between any of the Parties and no Party shall have the authority to bind the other in any respect. Nothing in this Agreement prevents STAR Transit from pursue contracting opportunities to provide any services with other public and private entities within the CITY or outside the CITY.
- 7.13 <u>Effective Date.</u> This Agreement shall not be effective unless and until it is executed by both STAR Transit and the CITY. "Effective Date" as used herein shall mean the later of the two dates this Agreement is executed by STAR Transit and the CITY.

SUBJECT: Contract with Meals On Wheels Senior Services

Margie VerHagen, Executive Director of Meals On Wheels Senior Services, requested funding for nutritional / senior service programs provided in Rockwall in the amount of \$60,000. This amount was approved in the operating budget for this fiscal year. Attached for the City Council's review and consideration is a contract with Meals On Wheels for FY 2026.

The City Council is asked to consider approval of the proposed contract and authorize the City Manager to enter into an agreement with Meals On Wheels Senior Services for nutritional and senior service programs in the City of Rockwall.

AGREEMENT FOR NUTRITIONAL PROGRAMS FOR THE ELDERLY AND DISABLED

STATE OF TEXAS §
COUNTY OF ROCKWALL § KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

THIS AGREEMENT is entered into by the CITY OF ROCKWALL, COUNTY OF ROCKWALL, TEXAS (hereinafter referred to as "City"), a municipal corporation, acting by and through Mary Smith, City Manager, its duly authorized representative and MEALS ON WHEELS SENIOR SERVICES, a nonprofit Texas corporation, acting by and through Margie VerHagen, its duly authorized representative. The parties do hereby covenant and agree as follows:

Section 1. Grant. For and in consideration of compliance by Meals On Wheels Senior Services with covenants and conditions herein set forth, and the ordinances and regulations of the City, the City hereby contracts with Meals On Wheels Senior Services to provide certain nutritional programs to the elderly and disabled within the corporate limits of the City.

Meals On Wheels Senior Services shall conduct operations in accordance with all federal, state and local laws that exist at the time of the execution of this agreement and any additional laws, regulations, or requirements that may become effective during the term of this agreement. In addition, Meals On Wheels Senior Services agrees to conduct operations in accordance with the description of services outlined in Attachment "A" attached hereto and made a part hereof for all purposes. Meals On Wheels Senior Services shall be responsible for obtaining any permits or licenses required to fulfill its obligations under this agreement.

- Section 2. Payment. City agrees to pay Meals On Wheels Senior Services the sum of Sixty Thousand Dollars and No/Cents (\$60,000.00) for the provision of certain nutritional / service programs to the elderly and disabled. Said payments shall be made on the following dates: December 31, 2025 for 1st Quarter, March 31, 2026 for 2nd Quarter, June 30, 2026 for 3rd Quarter, and September 30, 2026 for 4th Quarter upon Receiving a Quarterly Report and Invoice.
- **Section 3.** Term. This agreement is to take effect and continue and remain in full force and effect for a period to expire on September 30, 2026.
- **Section 4.** <u>Scope and Nature of Operation</u>. It is expressly agreed and understood that Meals On Wheels Senior Services shall provide the services as outlined in Attachment "A" continuously during the contract period.
- Section 5. Surety and Cancellation. If at any time, the City Council determines that Meals On Wheels Senior Services has failed to perform, or performed in an unacceptable manner, any of the terms, covenants or conditions herein set forth, the City may revoke and cancel this agreement. The City Council shall be the sole judge of whether Meals On Wheels Senior Services has failed to perform. Meals On Wheels Senior Services shall be given written notice at least 10 days prior to consideration by the City Council of such action. Should the City Council revoke this agreement, Meals On Wheels Senior Services shall be responsible for reimbursing the City on a pro-rata basis any unearned funds paid by the City.

- Section 6. Complaint Handling by Meals On Wheels Senior Services. Meals On Wheels Senior Services shall, at its own expense, provide a locally accessible telephone number and will answer calls from 9:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. daily, Monday through Friday, excluding such holidays as may be approved by the City, for the purpose of handling complaints and other calls regarding services provided by Meals On Wheels Senior Services. Meals On Wheels Senior Services shall maintain a log of all complaints and disposition of the complaints. This log shall be submitted to the City on a monthly basis. All complaints shall be given prompt and courteous attention and when possible, shall be resolved within a 24-hour period.
- **Section 7.** <u>Vehicular Identification</u>. There are no vehicle identification requirements at this time. Provided that such markings or identification becomes necessary during the term of this agreement, the parties agree to implement such markings, and if so, will be the responsibility of Meals On Wheels Senior Services.
- **Section 8.** Reporting. Meals On Wheels Senior Services shall provide quarterly reports to the City detailing the following:

Nutritional Programs for the Elderly and Disabled

- a. Number of users average daily and monthly totals
- **b.** Type of services provided
- **c.** Complaint logs
- **Section 9.** <u>Books and Records.</u> Meals On Wheels Senior Services agrees to maintain adequate books and records relating to their performance under the provisions of the Agreement. The City may request from Meals On Wheels Senior Services specific periodic reports containing information deemed necessary by the City. The records of Meals On Wheels Senior Services applicable to the performance of this agreement shall and will be available when wanted for inspection by the City at any time during normal working hours upon 10 days written request.
- Section 10. Indemnification Insurance. Meals On Wheels Senior Services assumes risk of loss or injury to property or persons arising from any of its operations under this agreement and agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the City from all claims, demands, suits, judgments, costs or expenses, including expenses of litigation and attorney's fees, arising from any such loss or injury. It is expressly understood that the foregoing provisions shall not in any way limit the liability of Meals On Wheels Senior Services. Meals On Wheels Senior Services shall require that all drivers carry at all times, in the vehicle, insurance certificates of financial responsibility.
- **Section 11.** Assignment. No assignment, transfer, subletting, conveyance or disposition of this agreement or any right occurring under it shall be made in whole or in party by Meals On Wheels Senior Services without the prior written consent of the City Council. In the event Meals On Wheels Senior Services assigns, transfers, sublets, conveys, or disposes of this agreement without the prior consent of the City Council, the City may, at its discretion, terminate this agreement.
- **Section 12.** <u>Venue</u>. This agreement shall be considered consummated in Rockwall County, Texas. All actions brought hereunder shall be brought in Rockwall County, Texas.

Section 13. <u>Modification</u>. This agreement constitutes the entire agreement and understanding between the parties hereto, and it shall not be considered modified, altered, changed, or amended in any respect unless modified by approval of the City Council as provided herein.

Section 14. Right to Require Performance. The failure of the City at any time to require performance by Meals On Wheels Senior Services of any provisions hereof shall in no way affect the rights of the City thereafter to enforce the same. No waiver by the City of any breach of any provisions hereof shall be taken or held to be a waiver of any provision itself.

Section 15. <u>Illegal Provisions</u>. If any provision of this agreement shall be declared illegal, void or unenforceable, the other provisions shall not be affected and shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 16. <u>Notices.</u> Any notice required or permitted to be delivered hereunder shall be in writing and shall be deemed to be delivered, whether or not actually received, when deposited in the United States Mail, postage prepaid, certified mail, return receipt requested, addressed to a respective party at the addresses set forth below:

SUBJECT: Oncor Electric Delivery Rate Request – Denial Resolution

The information below is provided by the Steering Committee of Cities Served by Oncor and its General Counsel.

Purpose:

On June 26, 2025, Oncor Electric Delivery Company LLC ("Oncor" or "Company") filed an application with cities retaining original jurisdiction seeking to increase system-wide transmission and distribution rates by about \$834 million or approximately 13% over present revenues. The Company asks the City to approve a 12.3% increase in residential rates and a 51.0% increase in street lighting rates. If approved, the impact of this requested increase on an average residential customer would be about \$7.90 per month.

In a prior City Council action at the July 7, 2025 meeting, Oncor's rate request was suspended from taking effect for 90 days, the fullest extent permissible under the law. This time period has permitted the City, through its participation with the Steering Committee of Cities Served by Oncor ("Steering Committee"), to determine that the proposed rate increase is unreasonable. Consistent with the recommendations of the experts engaged by the Steering Committee, Oncor's request for a rate increase should be denied.

Accordingly, the purpose of the Resolution is to deny the rate change application proposed by Oncor. Once the Resolution is adopted, Oncor will have 30 days to appeal the decision to the Public Utility Commission of Texas ("PUC") where the appeal will be consolidated with Oncor's filing (PUC Docket No. 58306) currently pending at the PUC.

All cities with original jurisdiction will need to adopt the Resolution by October 29, 2025.

Explanation of "Be It Resolved" Sections:

- 1. This paragraph finds that the Company's application is unreasonable and should be denied.
- 2. This section states that the Company's current rates shall not be changed.
- 3. The Company will reimburse Cities for their reasonable rate case expenses. Legal counsel and consultants approved by the Steering Committee will submit monthly invoices that will be forwarded to Oncor for reimbursement.
- 4. This section merely recites that the resolution was passed at a meeting that was open to the public and that the consideration of the Resolution was properly noticed.
- 5. This section provides Oncor and counsel for the Steering Committee will be notified of the City's action through a copy of the approved and signed resolution.

WHEREAS, the City is a member of the Steering Committee of Cities Served by Oncor ("Steering Committee"), a coalition of similarly situated cities served by Oncor that have joined together to efficiently and cost effectively review and respond to electric issues affecting rates charged in Oncor's service area; and

WHEREAS, on or about June 26, 2025, Oncor filed with the City an application to increase system-wide transmission and distribution rates by about \$834 million or approximately 13% over present revenues. The Company asks the City to approve an 12.3% increase in residential rates and a 51.0% increase in street lighting rates; and

WHEREAS, the Steering Committee is coordinating its review of Oncor's application and working with the designated attorneys and consultants to resolve issues in the Company's filing; and

WHEREAS, through review of the application, the Steering Committee's consultants determined that Oncor's proposed rates are excessive; and

WHEREAS, the Steering Committee's members and attorneys recommend that members deny the Application; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROCKWALL, TEXAS:

Section 1. That the rates proposed by Oncor to be recovered through its electric rates charged to customers located within the City limits, are hereby found to be unreasonable and shall be denied.

- **Section 2.** That the Company shall continue to charge its existing rates to customers within the City.
- **Section 3.** That the City's reasonable rate case expenses shall be reimbursed in full by Oncor.

Section 4. That it is hereby officially found and determined that the meeting at which this Resolution is passed is open to the public as required by law and the public notice of the time, place, and purpose of said meeting was given as required.

Section 5. INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT FOR FIRE PROTECTION SERVICES

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into by and between the County of Rockwall, Texas, hereinafter referred to as "County" and the City of Rockwall, Texas, hereinafter referred to as "City" or "Rockwall".

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, pursuant to §352.001(b)(3) of the Texas Local Government Code, a county is authorized to execute interlocal agreements with any city, town or village within such county to provide fire protection services to the citizens of any such county residing outside the corporate limits of any city, town or village; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Chapter 791 of the Texas Government Code, the City is authorized to execute interlocal agreements with a county to provide governmental services and functions such as fire protection; and

WHEREAS, the City is the owner of certain trucks and other equipment designed for and capable of being used in the protection of persons and property from and in the suppression and fighting of fires; and

WHEREAS, the County desires to obtain such services for its citizens residing in unincorporated areas of the County, and the City is willing to provide such services as hereinafter set forth and provided.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is mutually agreed by and between the parties hereto as follows:

- **Section 1.** That the recitals set forth above are true and correct and incorporated herein.
- **Section 2.** Definitions. The following words shall have the following meanings when used in this Agreement:
 - a) "Call" means each response by the City of Rockwall Fire Department to rescues, auto accidents, actual fire, false alarms, fires to be found extinguished on arrival of the City's fire unit or units, potential fire situations or emergencies.

- b) "Chief Administrative Officer" means the Mayor or City Manager of the City.
- c) "District" means the area within the boundaries of Rockwall County, Texas, for which the City of Rockwall Fire Department has permanent responsibility for first alarm response to fires in such district. This includes Public Protected Classification, outside protected areas, and Fire Districts defined by the Texas Department of Insurance.
- d) "Employed" means a fire fighter who is paid a salary by the City, or volunteer fire fighter.
- e) "Fire Chief" means the Fire Chief of the City or his duly authorized designees.
- f) "Fire Fighter" means a fire fighter of the City.
- g) "Requesting Party" means the entity requesting fire protection assistance from the City for fire services for residents of the County, but not living within any city's incorporated limit.
- Section 3. The parties hereto hereby agree that the City will provide fire equipment and services to points in the County which are outside the corporate limits of any city in the County, but inside the boundary limits known as First Alarm County District for the City. Areas outside such boundary shall be known as the Second Alarm County District for the City, and a closer fire department shall be notified for first response.
- Section 4. In consideration of such service, the County will pay to the City the sum of fifty-four thousand nine hundred twenty-seven (54,927) dollars for calls outside the corporate limits of any city in the County subject to annual funding approval by the Rockwall County Commissioner's Court during the regular budget process. Said payment shall be made on an annual basis upon written request from the City to the Rockwall County Auditor and will be payable within thirty (30) days after receipt of such, by the Auditor's Office.
- Section 5. County hereby gives and grants to the City full and complete authority to operate its fire fighting vehicles on and over public roads, highways, and other thoroughfares of the County and other public places.
- Section 6. City shall, at its own cost and expense, purchase and keep in force at all times insurance for the minimum amount of liability under the Texas Tort Claims Act. City agrees to provide copies of such policy or policies of insurance and/or other evidence satisfactory to the County Auditor of Rockwall County, Texas.
- Section 7. The Fire Chief shall be the sole judge of the amount and type of equipment and number of personnel dispatched to calls made pursuant to this Agreement. Said Fire Chief, or his designee, shall be in charge of the firefighting techniques used in response to any calls.

For each call made pursuant to this Agreement, the Fire Chief shall prepare a report showing the date, location, and description of the call. True copies of such reports shall be on file with the Fire Chief and available for review by the County Auditor or Commissioner's Court of the County.

Section 8. City hereby agrees to render services to other Fire Districts within the County if backup emergency assistance is requested. The City's fire fighters shall report to the Requesting Party's Officer In Control at the location to which they have been assigned, and shall be under the command of the Requesting Party's Fire Chief and will be released when their services are no longer required.

Calls for assistance may be aborted only by (1) another Fire Department at the scene; (2) an officer of the Sheriff's Department at the scene; (3) a State Department of Public Safety Officer at the scene; (4) the responding department's Fire Chief or designee; (5) or Dispatch.

- Section 9. While any fire fighter, regularly employed as such by the City, is in the service of the Requesting Party, such fire fighter shall be a fire fighter of the Requesting Party and be under the command of the Requesting Party's Chief, with all the powers of a regular fire fighter of the Requesting Party, as fully as if such fire fighter were within the territorial limits of the governmental entity where such fire fighter is regularly employed. A fire fighter's qualifications for employment by the governmental entity by which he or she is regularly employed shall constitute such fire fighter's qualifications for such position within the territorial limits of the Requesting Party, and no other oath, bond or compensation need be made.
- Section 10. Each party to this Agreement expressly waives the right to recovery from the other party for reimbursement of wages, disability, pension payments, damages to equipment and clothing, medical expenses, travel, food and lodging expenses.
- Section 11. Any fire fighter or other person who is assigned, designated or ordered by the Fire Chief of the party which regularly employs such, to perform duties pursuant to this Agreement, shall receive the same wages, salary, pension, compensation and all other rights for such service, including injury benefits, death benefits, and worker's compensation benefits, as if the service had been rendered within the territorial limits of the party where such fire fighter is regularly employed. Moreover, all wage and disability payments, including worker's compensation benefits, pension payments, damage to equipment and clothing, medical expenses, and expenses of travel, food and lodging, shall be paid by the party which regularly employs such person in the same manner as if the service had been rendered within the territorial limits of the party where such fire fighter is regularly employed.
- Section 12. In the event that any person performing fire fighting services pursuant to this Agreement shall be cited as a party to any civil lawsuit, state or federal, arising out of the performance of those services, such fire fighter shall be entitled to the same benefits that he or she would be entitled to receive if such civil action had arisen out of the performance of such person's

duties as a member of the department where and in the jurisdiction of the party where such person is regularly employed.

- Section 13. Each party to this Agreement expressly waives all claims against the other party for compensation arising from loss, damage, personal injury or death occurring as a consequence of the performance of this Agreement.
- **Section 14.** Third party claims against parties hereto shall be governed by the Texas Tort Claims Act or other appropriate statutes, charters and ordinances of the parties.
- **Section 15.** It is expressly understood and agreed that by executing this Agreement, neither party waives, nor shall be deemed hereby to waive, any immunity or defense that would otherwise by available to it, against claims arising in the exercise of governmental powers and functions.
- Section 16. This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective heirs, executors, administrators, legal representatives, successors and assigns.
- **Section 17.** This Agreement shall be governed by and constructed in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas. Venue shall be in Rockwall County, Texas.
- **Section 18.** If any one or more of the provisions contained in this Agreement shall, for any reason, be held to be invalid, illegal or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity or illegality shall be construed as if such invalid, illegal or unenforceable provision had never been contained herein, and shall not render the entire Agreement invalid.
- Section 19. This Agreement constitutes the entire Agreement and understanding between parties. Any modification, change or amendment to this Agreement shall be in writing and approved by both parties.
- **Section 20.** This Agreement shall become effective as of October 1, 2025 and shall continue through September 30, 2026.

Consider a request by John McKinney of M & J Ranch Trail Holdings, LLC for the approval of a <u>Final Plat</u> for Lots 23 & 24, Block A, Rainbo Acres Addition being a 4.986-acre parcel of land identified as a portion of Lot 18 of the Rainbo Acres Addition, City of Rockwall, Rockwall County, Texas, zoned Commercial (C) District, addressed as 365 Ranch Trail, and take any action necessary.

PLAT INFORMATION

- ☑ <u>Purpose.</u> The applicant is requesting the approval of a <u>Replat</u> for a 4.986-acre tract of land [i.e. A portion of Lot 18 of the Rainbo Acres Addition] for the purpose of dedicating easements for the development of the Office Building on the subject property and creating one (1) additional lot [i.e. Lots 23 & 24, Block A, Rainbo Acres Addition].
- ☑ <u>Background.</u> On October 25, 1962, a final plat was filed with Rockwall County that establish the subject property as Lot 18 and the south portion of Lot 19, of the Rainbo Acres Addition. The subject property was annexed into the City of Rockwall on May 17, 2004 [Case No. A2004-001] by Ordinance No. 04-34. At the time of annexation the subject property was zoned Agricultural (AG) District. On December 2, 2013, the City Council approved a rezoning request [Case No. Z2013-030] for the subject property changing the zoning from an Agricultural (AG) District to a Commercial (C) District. The Planning and Zoning Commission has previously approved two (2) site plans [Case No. SP2019-003 & SP2019-043], however the subject property has remained vacant since the time of annexation. On March 14, 2023, the Planning and Zoning approved a site plan [Case No. SP2023-007] to allow the construction of an Office Building on the subject property. Following this approval, the Planning and Zoning Commission approved amended site plan [Case No. SP2024-022] that amended the building elevations for the approved Office Building.
- ☑ Conformance to the Subdivision Ordinance. The surveyor has completed the majority of the technical revisions requested by staff, and this plat -- conforming to the requirements for plats as stipulated by the Chapter 38, Subdivisions, of the Municipal Code of Ordinances -- is recommended for conditional approval pending the completion of final technical modifications and submittal requirements.
- ☑ <u>Conditional Approval.</u> Conditional approval of this <u>Replat</u> by the City Council shall constitute approval subject to the conditions stipulated in the <u>Conditions</u> of <u>Approval</u> section below. - ☑ <u>Background.</u> The subject property was originally platted as Lot 910-A with the Rockwall Lake Properties Development No. 2 Addition, which was filed with Rockwall County on April 23, 1968. On February 17, 2009, the subject property -- along with the rest of the Lake Rockwall Estates Subdivision -- was annexed into the City of Rockwall by Ordinance No. 09-07. On September 21, 2009, the City Council rezoned the Lake Rockwall Estates Subdivision from an Agricultural (AG) District to Planned Development District 75 (PD-75) [Ordinance No. 09-37] for Single-Family 7 (SF-7) District land uses. 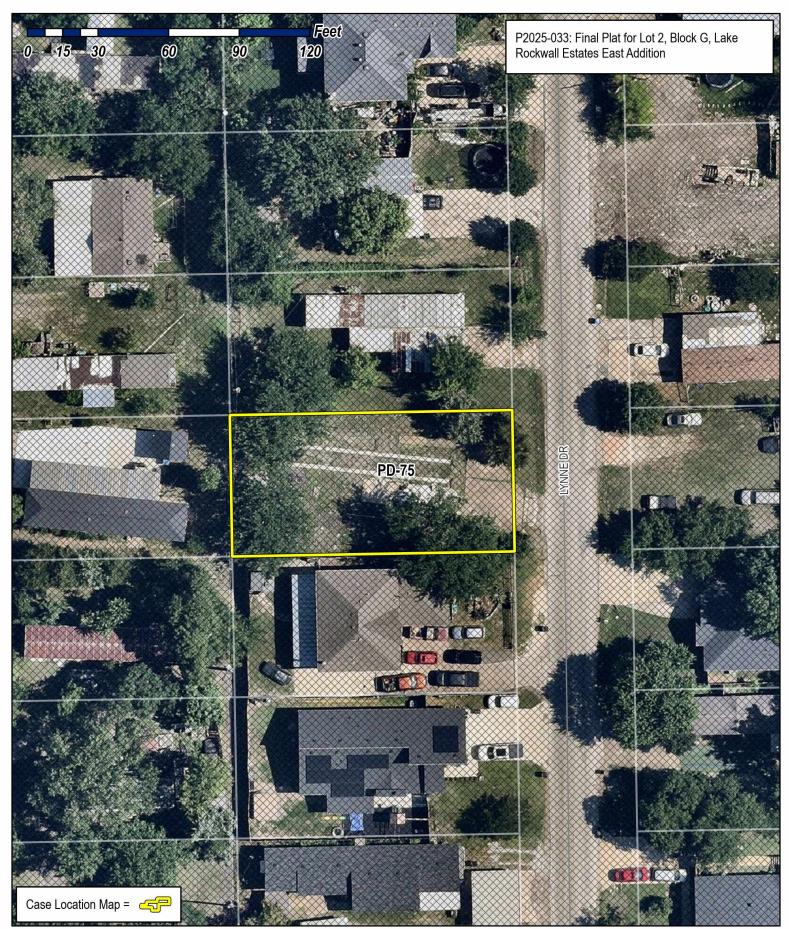

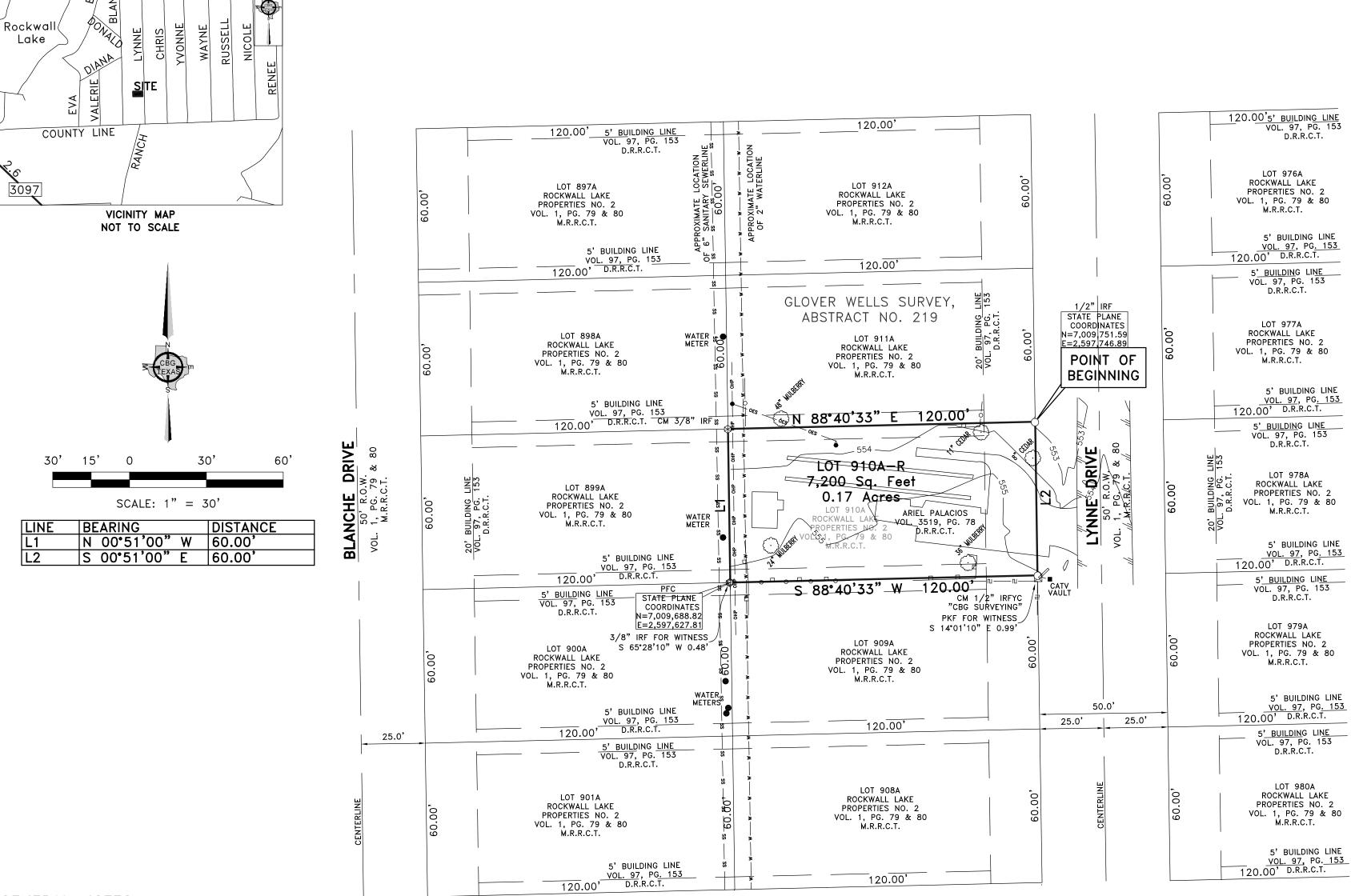

- Background. The subject property was annexed on September 16, 1974 by Ordinance No. 74-23 [Case No. A1974-003]. At the time of annexation, the subject property was zoned Agricultural (AG) District. On November 4, 1974, the City Council approved a zoning change from an Agricultural (AG) District to Planned Development District 10 (PD-10) [Ordinance No. 74-32] for Townhouse and Cluster Homes on the subject property. On February 19, 1996, the City Council approved an amendment to Planned Development District 10 [Ordinance No. 96-03], which superseded the previous ordinance [Ordinance No. 74-32] and re-designated the subject property for Commercial (C) District land uses. On August 3, 2020, the City Council approved an amendment to Planned Development District 10 (PD-10), which consolidated all of the regulating ordinances into one (1) regulating ordinance [Ordinance No. 20-30]. The subject property has remained vacant since annexation. On November 26, 2024, the Planning and Zoning Commission approved a site plan [Case No. SP2024-043] for a medical office building on a portion (i.e. Lot 1, Block A, Rockwall Medical Office Building Addition) of the subject property. On May 27, 2025, the Planning and Zoning Commission approved a Site Plan [Case No. SP2025-017] for a medical office building on a different portion of the property (i.e. Lot 2, Block A, Rockwall Medical Office Building).

The Planning and Zoning Commission recommended approval of this case on September 9, 2025 by a vote of 6-1, with Commissioner Conway dissenting. Following this recommendation, on September 15, 2025, the City Council voted 7–0 to remanded *Case No. Z2025-053* back to the Planning and Zoning Commission. The City Council's stated purpose for this action was to allow the applicant additional time for the applicant to: [1] revise the building elevations to comply with the *General Overlay District Standards* contained in Article 05, *District Development Standards*, of the Unified Development Code (UDC), and [2] provide an exhibit showing the locations of the detention areas and the trees that will be preserved/removed after the development of the subject property. Based on this direction, the applicant provided staff with updated building elevations that comply with the *General Overlay District Standards* and an exhibit showing the site plan (*including the proposed detention ponds*) overlaid onto an aerial of the site showing the existing tree locations. These exhibits have been included in the attached packet. In addition, staff included the building elevations in the draft ordinance and conformance to these elevations is required as an operational condition of this case.

On September 30, 2025, the Planning and Zoning Commission reviewed the newly submitted information requested by the City Council, but failed to approve a motion to recommend approval of *Case No. Z2025-053* by a vote of 2-5, with Commissioners Conway, Hagaman, Roth, Bentley, and Schoen dissenting. SUMMARY

Hold a public hearing to discuss and consider a request by Dub Douphrate of Douphrate and Associates on behalf of RHC 1 Properties, LLC for the approval of a <u>Specific Use Permit (SUP)</u> for a *Full-Service Carwash* on a 2.008-acre tract of land identified as a portion of Lot 1, Block A, the Woods at Rockwall Addition, City of Rockwall, Rockwall County, Texas, zoned Commercial (C) District, situated within the Scenic Overlay (SOV) District, addressed as 2215 Ridge Road [*FM-740*], and take any action necessary.

BACKGROUND

On November 7, 1960, the City Council approved the annexation of the subject property by adopting *Ordinance No. 60-04*. [Case No. A1960-004]. According to the January 3, 1972 zoning map the subject property was zoned Multi-Family 1 (MF-1) District and Commercial (C) District. At some point between January 3, 1972 and May 16, 1983 the subject property was rezoned to Multi-Family 15 (MF-15) District and Commercial (C) District. At some point between May 16, 1983 and December 7, 1993 the subject property was rezoned to Commercial (C) District. This remains the current zoning designation of the subject property. On July 28, 2003, the City Council approved a plat for the subject property establishing it as Lot 1, Block A, The Woods at Rockwall addition. On February 6, 2017, City Council approved a Specific Use Permit (SUP) [Case No. Z2016-044] for a Full-Service Carwash by Ordinance No. 17-09, S-162. On December 18, 2017, the City Council approved a Site Plan [Case No. SP2017-039] for a Full-Service Carwash. On January 7, 2019, the City Council approved a Final Plat [Case No. P2018-044] for the subject property for the purpose of establishing the necessary easements for the development of a Full-Service Carwash; however, this plat was never filed with Rockwall County. On May 28, 2021, the applicant was sent a letter notifying them of the expiration of their Specific Use Permit (SUP) [Ordinance No. 17-09, S-162], Site Plan, and Final Plat due to inactivity. Staff has included this letter for reference within the packet.

PURPOSE

The applicant -- Dub Douphrate of Douphrate and Associates -- is requesting the approval of a Specific Use Permit (SUP) to allow a Full-Service Car Wash and Auto Detail to be established on the subject property.

ADJACENT LAND USES AND ACCESS

The subject property is generally located at 2215 Ridge Road. The land uses adjacent to the subject property are as follows:

North:

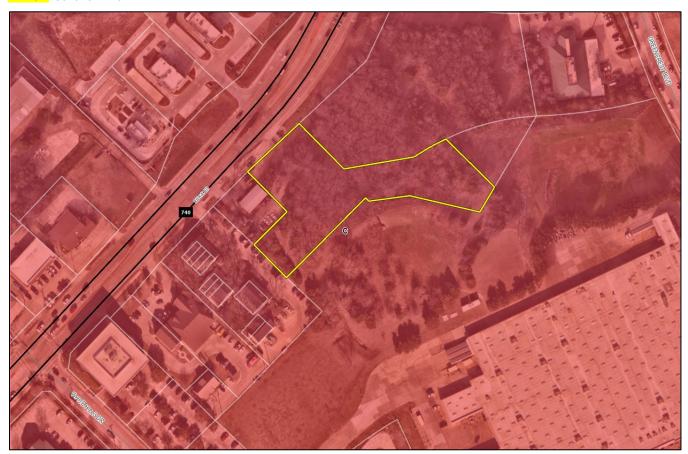
Directly north of the subject property is a 2.47-acre parcel of land (*i.e.* Lot 3, Block A, The Woods at Rockwall), which is currently vacant and zoned Commercial (C) District. Beyond this is the intersection of W. Yellow Jacket Lane and Ridge Road [FM-740]. Both of these roadways are identified as an A4D (*i.e.* Arterial, four [4] lane, divided roadway) on the Master Thoroughfare Plan contained in the OURHometown Vision 2040 Comprehensive Plan. Beyond this is a 1.129-acre parcel of land developed with a commercial/retail strip center zoned Commercial (C) District. Beyond this is Old Country Road, which is identified as a R2 (*i.e.* residential, two [2] lane, undivided roadway) on the Master Thoroughfare Plan contained in the OURHometown Vision 2040 Comprehensive Plan. Beyond this is an undeveloped 9.24-acre tract of land zoned Commercial (C) District.

<u>South</u>: Directly south of the subject property is a 25.9263-acre parcel of land developed with a *Grocery Store* (*i.e. Walmart Superstore*) zoned Commercial (C) District. Beyond this is the frontage of IH-30, which is identified as a TXDOT6D (*i.e. Texas Department of Transportation principle arterial, six* [6] lane roadway).

East: Directly east of the subject property 2.47-acre parcel of land (i.e. Lot 3, Block A, The Woods at Rockwall), which is currently vacant and zoned Commercial (C) District. Beyond this is a 1.1988-acre parcel of land developed with a Medical Office (i.e. Rockwall Surgery Center) zoned Commercial (C) District. Beyond this is Greencrest Boulevard, which is identified as a Minor Collector on the Master Thoroughfare Plan contained in the OURHometown Vision 2040 Comprehensive Plan. Beyond this is a 35.295-acre parcel of land developed with a High School (i.e. Rockwall High School) zoned Commercial (C) District.

<u>West</u>: Directly west of the subject property is Ridge Road [FM-740], which is identified as a M4D (i.e. major collector, four [4] lane, divided roadway) on the Master Thoroughfare Plan contained in the OURHometown Vision 2040 Comprehensive Plan. Beyond this is the Sky Ridge Addition, which consists of six (6) parcels of land zoned Commercial (C) District. Beyond this is 2.95-acre parcel of land developed with a House of Worship (i.e. Great Faith Church) zoned Commercial (C) District.

CHARACTERISTICS OF THE REQUEST

The applicant has submitted an application, concept plan, and building elevations depicting the layout of a *Full-Service Car Wash and Auto Detail*. The proposed carwash will consist of a single entrance tunnel that has three (3) lanes of queuing. Based on the concept plan, the carwash tunnel will be oriented so that the entrance of the tunnel will be parallel to Ridge Road [*FM-740*]. Staff should note, the concept plan provided by the applicant is the same concept plan that was approved by February 6, 2017 by *Ordinance No. 17-09, S-162*.

CONFORMANCE WITH THE CITY'S CODES

According to the *Permissible Use Charts* contained in Article 04, *Permissible Uses*, of the Unified Development Code (UDC) a *Full-Service Car Wash and Auto Detail* requires a Specific Use Permit (SUP) in the Scenic Overlay (SOV District) District. In addition, Subsection 02.03.(H)(4), *Conditional Land Use Standards*, of Article 04, *Permissible Use Charts*, of the Unified Development Code (UDC) also provides the following requirements relating to regulating the land use:

- (a) Entrances and exits to the car wash shall not directly face any public right-of-way. On corner sites, car wash entrances or exits shall not open toward the street with the highest traffic volume.
- (b) The car wash shall be set back a minimum of 50-feet from any street frontage.

In this case, the submitted concept plan conforms to the conditional land use standards required for a *Full-Service Car Wash* and *Auto Detail*. With the approval of the original Specific Use Permit (SUP) [*Ordinance No. 17-09, S-162*], the City Council made a motion that added a condition of approval that the applicant provide additional landscape screening along the southern property line adjacent to Lot 1, Block A, Lakewood Park Addition. Staff has included this condition of approval within the *Draft Ordinance* as well and provided an exhibit showing the increased landscaping. Staff should note that the submitted building elevations do not appear to meet the minimum material standards of the Scenic Overlay (SOV) District and will need to be reviewed by the Architectural Review Board (ARB) and Planning and Zoning Commission at the time of site plan; however, these elevations were the same elevations that were approved with the original site plan [*i.e. SP2017-039*].

STAFF ANALYSIS

The subject property is located within the Scenic Overlay (SOV District) District, which requires a Specific Use Permit (SUP) for a *Full-Service Car Wash and Auto Detail*. The intent of this overlay is to ensure that development along the City's primary commercial corridors reflects high-quality architectural and site design standards, given their visibility and role as major entry points into Rockwall. According to Subsection 02.02, *Specific Use Permit* (SUP), of Article 11, *Development Applicants and Review Procedures*, of the Unified Development Code (UDC), "(t)he purpose of a Specific Use Permit (SUP) is to allow discretionary consideration of certain uses that would typically be considered incompatible within certain locations of a zoning district, but may become compatible with the addition of special provisions, conditions or restrictions." It shall be the discretion of the City Council -- *pending a recommendation from the Planning and Zoning Commission* -- to determine if the subject property is a compatible site for a *Full-Service Car Wash and Auto Detail*.

The applicant's request is identical to the Specific Use Permit (SUP) approved in 2017 and subsequently expired in 2021 due to inactivity. Since that time, there have been no zoning changes or significant shifts in adjacent land uses that would materially alter the land use compatibility analysis. The immediate surroundings remain dominated by Commercial (C) District zoning, including high-intensity retail uses to the south (Walmart Superstore), medical office to the east, and smaller commercial developments to the north and west. This context provides a degree of compatibility with the proposed use, particularly given its orientation along Ridge Road [FM-740], a major collector roadway.

From a design perspective, the proposed concept plan complies with the conditional standards outlined in the Unified Development Code (UDC) for *Full-Service Car Washes*. Entrances and exits are oriented away from Ridge Road, and the required 50-foot setback is observed. The proposed queuing lanes provide sufficient on-site circulation to prevent stacking into the public right-of-way; however, as mentioned previously the building elevations do not fully conform with Scenic Overlay (SOV) District architectural material requirements. Although the applicant has resubmitted the previously approved elevations, any future Site Plan application will require review by the Architectural Review Board (ARB) and Planning and Zoning Commission to ensure compliance with current standards.

Operationally, the carwash has the potential to generate moderate levels of traffic, noise, and light spillover, particularly during peak operating hours. These impacts are mitigated in part by the site's adjacency to commercial developments and by the recommended three (3) tiered landscape screening along the southern property line. This landscaping condition was previously imposed by City Council in 2017 and is again recommended as part of this Specific Use Permit (SUP). It will serve to buffer the car wash from nearby properties and uphold the intent of the Scenic Overlay (SOV) District. Staff should note that a noise study will also be required as part of the Site Plan process.

With all that being said, this is a discretionary decision for the City Council pending a recommendation from the Planning and Zoning Commission. Should the City Council choose to approve the applicant's request, staff has included conditions of approval described below and outlined within the *Draft Ordinance* contained in your packet.

NOTIFICATIONS

On August 20, 2025, staff mailed 62 notices to property owners and occupants within 500-feet of the subject property. Staff also sent a notice to the Turtle Cove Homeowners Association (HOA), which is the only HOA's or Neighborhood Organization within 1,500-feet of the subject property participating in the Neighborhood Notification Program. Additionally, staff posted a sign on the subject property, and advertised the public hearings in the Rockwall Herald Banner as required by the Unified Development Code (UDC). At the time this report was drafted, staff had not received any returned notices in regard to the applicant's request.

CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL

If the City Council chooses to approve the applicant's request for a <u>Specific Use Permit (SUP)</u> for a <u>Full-Service Carwash and Auto Detail then</u> staff would propose the following conditions of approval:

- (1) The applicant shall be responsible for maintaining compliance with the operational conditions contained in the SUP ordinance and which are detailed as follows:
 - (a) The development of the *Subject Property* shall generally conform to the <u>Site Plan</u> as depicted in *Exhibit 'B'* of the Specific Use Permit (SUP) ordinance.
 - (b) The Carwash shall be setback a minimum of 50-feet from Ridge Road, and,
 - (c) The Subject Property shall incorporate and maintain three (3) tiered screening along the southern property line adjacent to Lot 1, Block A, Lakewood Park Addition.
 - (d) The development of the subject property shall generally conform to the *Building Elevations* contained in *Exhibit 'C'* of this ordinance; however, the proposed *carwash* shall be subject to all of the *General Overlay District Standards* as stipulated by Article 05, *District Development Standards*, of the Unified Development Code (UDC). Review for conformance to these requirements shall be completed with the site plan submittal. In addition, a recommendation by the Architecture Review Board (ARB) shall be required prior to approval of the building elevations by the Planning and Zoning Commission.
- (2) Any construction resulting from the approval of this <u>Specific Use Permit (SUP)</u> shall conform to the requirements set forth by the Unified Development Code (UDC), the International Building Code (IBC), the Rockwall Municipal Code of Ordinances, city adopted engineering and fire codes and with all other applicable regulatory requirements administered and/or enforced by the state and federal government.

PLANNING AND ZONING COMMISSION

On September 9, 2025, the Planning and Zoning Commission approved a motion to approve the <u>Specific Use Permit (SUP)</u> by a vote of 6-1, with Commissioner Conway dissenting.

CITY COUNCIL

On September 30, 2025, the City Council approved a motion to remand the <u>Specific Use Permit (SUP)</u> back to the Planning and Zoning Commission by a vote of 7-0.

PLANNING AND ZONING COMMISSION

On September 30, 2025, the Planning and Zoning Commission failed to approve a motion to recommend approval of the Specific Use Permit (SUP) by a vote of 2-5, with Commissioners Conway, Hagaman, Roth, Bentley, and Schoen dissenting.

No additional motion was made. Given that the Planning and Zoning Commission failed to approve a motion, this represents a recommendation of denial. According to Subsection 02.03(G), *Protest of a Zoning Change*, of Article 11, *Development Applications and Review Procedures*, of the Unified Development Code (UDC), if a zoning change "...is recommended for denial by the Planning and Zoning Commission, such zoning change or Specific Use Permit (SUP) shall require a supermajority vote (*i.e. a three-fourths vote of those members present*), with a minimum of four (4) votes in the affirmative required for approval."

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROCKWALL, TEXAS, AMENDING THE UNIFIED DEVELOPMENT CODE (UDC) [ORDINANCE NO. 20-02] OF THE CITY OF ROCKWALL, ROCKWALL COUNTY, TEXAS, AS PREVIOUSLY AMENDED, SO AS TO GRANT A SPECIFIC USE PERMIT (SUP) TO ALLOW A FULL-SERVICE CARWASH WITHIN THE SCENIC OVERLAY (SOV) DISTRICT ON A 2.008-ACRE PARCEL OF LAND IDENTIFIED AS A PORTION OF LOT 1, BLOCK A, THE WOODS AT ROCKWALL ADDITION, CITY OF ROCKWALL, ROCKWALL COUNTY, TEXAS; AND MORE SPECIFICALLY DEPICTED IN EXHIBIT 'A' AND EXHIBIT 'B' OF THIS ORDINANCE; PROVIDING FOR SPECIAL **CONDITIONS:** PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY OF FINE NOT TO EXCEED THE SUM OF TWO THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$2,000.00) FOR EACH OFFENSE; PROVIDING FOR A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR A REPEALER CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City has received a request from Dub Douphrate of Douphrate and Associates on behalf of RHC 1 Properties, LLC for the approval of a <u>Specific Use Permit (SUP)</u> for a *Full-Service Carwash* on a 2.008-acre parcel of land identified Lot 1, Block A, The Woods at Rockwall Addition, City of Rockwall, Rockwall County, Texas, zoned Commercial (C) District, situated within the Scenic Overlay (SOV) District, addressed as 2215 Ridge Road [*FM-740*], and being more specifically depicted in *Exhibit 'A'* and *Exhibit 'B'* of this ordinance, which herein after shall be referred to as the *Subject Property* and incorporated by reference herein; and

WHEREAS, the Planning and Zoning Commission of the City of Rockwall and the governing body of the City of Rockwall, in compliance with the laws of the State of Texas and the ordinances of the City of Rockwall, have given the requisite notices by publication and otherwise, and have held public hearings and afforded a full and fair hearing to all property owners generally, and to all persons interested in and situated in the affected area and in the vicinity thereof, the governing body in the exercise of its legislative discretion has concluded that the Unified Development Code (UDC) [Ordinance No. 20-02] of the City of Rockwall should be amended as follows:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROCKWALL, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. The Unified Development Code (UDC) [Ordinance No. 20-02] of the City of Rockwall, as heretofore amended, be and the same is hereby amended so as to grant a Specific Use Permit (SUP) to allow a Full-Service Carwash within the Scenic Overlay (SOV) District in accordance with Article 04, Permissible Uses, of the Unified Development Code (UDC) [Ordinance No. 20-02] on the Subject Property; and,

SECTION 2. That the Specific Use Permit (SUP) shall be subject to the requirements set forth in Subsection 04.01, *Commercial (C) District*, and Subsection 06.08, *Scenic Overlay (SOV) District*, of Article 05, *District Development Standards* of the Unified Development Code (UDC) [Ordinance

No. 20-02] -- as heretofore amended and may be amended in the future -- and with the following conditions:

2.1 OPERATIONAL CONDITIONS

The following conditions pertain to the operation of the *Full-Service Carwash* on the *Subject Property* and conformance to these conditions is required for continued operation:

- 1) The development of the *Subject Property* shall generally conform to the <u>Site Plan</u> as depicted in *Exhibit 'B'* of this ordinance.
- 2) The Carwash shall be setback a minimum of 50-feet from Ridge Road, and,
- 3) The Subject Property will incorporate and maintain three-tiered screening along the southern property line adjacent to Lot 1, Block A, Lakewood Park Addition.
- 4) The development of the subject property shall generally conform to the *Building Elevations* contained in *Exhibit 'C'* of this ordinance; however, the proposed *carwash* shall be subject to all of the *General Overlay District Standards* as stipulated by Article 05, *District Development Standards*, of the Unified Development Code (UDC). Review for conformance to these requirements shall be completed with the site plan submittal. In addition, a recommendation by the Architecture Review Board (ARB) shall be required prior to approval of the building elevations by the Planning and Zoning Commission.

2.2 COMPLIANCE

Approval of this ordinance in accordance with Subsection 02.02, *Specific Use Permits (SUP)* of Article 11, *Development Applications and Review Procedures*, of the Unified Development Code (UDC) will require the *Subject Property* to comply with the following:

- 1) Upon obtaining a *Certificate of Occupancy (CO)*, should the business owner operating under the guidelines of this ordinance fail to meet the minimum operational requirements set forth herein and outlined in the Unified Development Code (UDC), the City may (*after proper notice*) initiate proceedings to revoke the Specific Use Permit (SUP) in accordance with Subsection 02.02(F), *Revocation*, of Article 11, *Development Applications and Revision Procedures*, of the Unified Development Code (UDC) [*Ordinance No. 20-02*].
- **SECTION 3.** That the official zoning map of the City be corrected to reflect the changes in zoning described herein.
- **SECTION 4.** That all ordinances of the City of Rockwall in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance be, and the same are hereby repealed to the extent of that conflict.
- **SECTION 5.** Any person, firm, or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be punished by a penalty of fine not to exceed the sum of *TWO THOUSAND DOLLARS* (\$2,000.00) for each offence and each and every day such offense shall continue shall be deemed to constitute a separate offense.
- **SECTION 6.** If any section or provision of this ordinance or the application of that section or provision to any person, firm, corporation, situation or circumstance is for any reason judged invalid, the adjudication shall not affect any other section or provision of this ordinance or the application of

any other section or provision to any other person, firm, corporation, situation or circumstance, and the City Council declares that it would have adopted the valid portions and applications of the ordinance without the invalid parts and to this end the provisions of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

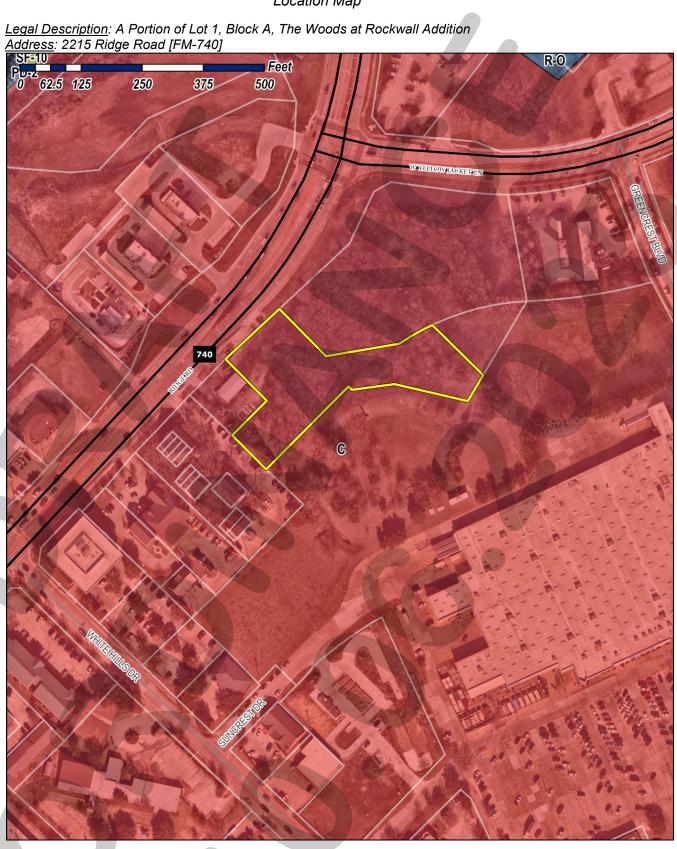

Site Plan

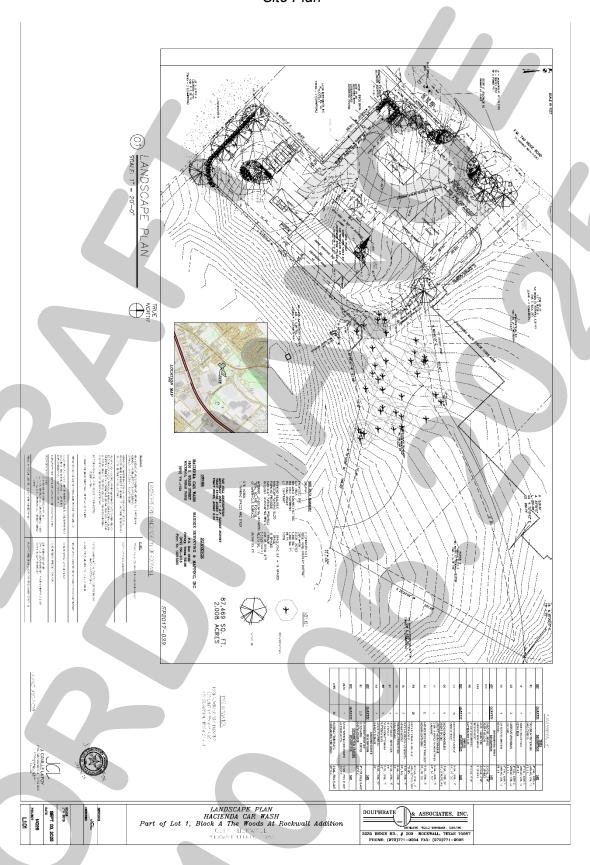


Exhibit 'C'Building Elevations

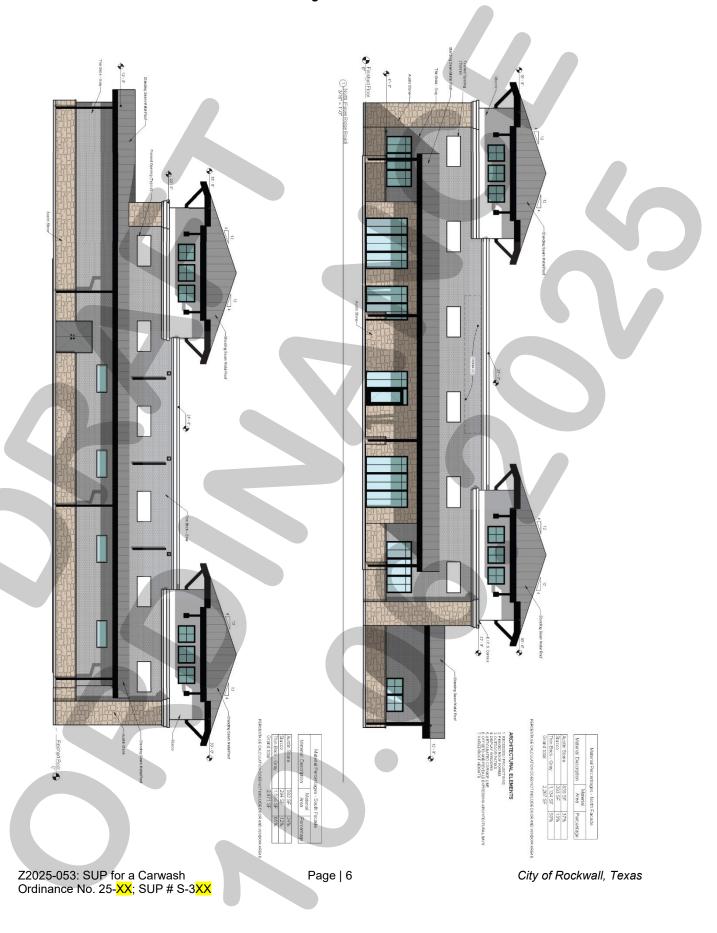

SUBJECT: Z2025-057; Specific Use Permit (SUP) for a Combination Limited Service/Residence Hotel

On September 30, 2025, the Planning and Zoning Commission approved a motion to recommend approval of *Case No. Z2025-057* by a vote of 4-3, with Commissioners Conway, Hagaman, and Schoen dissenting. This action was taken after the City Council remanded the case back to the Planning and Zoning Commission on September 15, 2025 by a vote of 7-0. The stated purpose of the City Council's action was to allow the applicant additional time to: [1] include language in the draft ordinance that requires the building elevations to comply with the *General Overlay District Standards* contained in Article 05, *District Development Standards*, of the Unified Development Code (UDC), and [2] -- per the applicant's proposal - provide a list of Affiliation Names that the *Limited Service Hotel/Residence Hotel* could be changed to in the future if the brand changes per the most recent *STR Chain Scale*. The applicant provided both of these items and staff has provided language in the draft ordinance that states "(i)n the event that the combination *Limited-Service Hotel* and *Residence Hotel* changes *Affiliation Name* as highlighted on the *STR Chain Scales* depicted in *Exhibit 'E'* of this ordinance [the Specific Use Permit (SUP) ordinance], the new *Affiliation Name* shall be of a *Scale ID* of 1-5 as stated on the most recent *STR Chain Scale* contained in this exhibit..." In addition, staff updated the draft ordinance with an operational condition that requires the future building elevations to adhere to the *General Overlay District Standards* of the Unified Development Code (UDC).

As the City Council will recall, the Planning and Zoning Commission originally recommended approval of this case on September 9, 2025 by a vote of 7-0. Should the City Council have any questions, staff will be available at the <u>October 6, 2025</u> meeting.

SUMMARY

Hold a public hearing to discuss and consider a request by Kiew Kam of Triangle Engineering, LLC on behalf of Conor Keilty, AIA of Structured REA-Rockwall Land, LLC for the approval of a <u>Specific Use Permit (SUP)</u> for a <u>Residence Hotel</u> on a 2.819-acre portion of a larger 4.767-acre parcel of land identified as Lot 6, Block B, Fit Sport Life Addition, City of Rockwall, Rockwall County, Texas, zoned Commercial (C) District, situated within the FM-549 Overlay (FM-549 OV) District, generally located east of the intersection of FM-549 and Fit Sport Life Boulevard, and take any action necessary.

BACKGROUND

The subject property was annexed by the City Council on July 21, 1997 by *Ordinance No.* 97-14 [Case No. A1997-001]. Based on the City's historical zoning maps, the subject property was zoned from an Agricultural (AG) District to a Commercial (C) District at some time between annexation and April 5, 2005. On May 17, 2021, the City Council approved a preliminary plat (*i.e. Case No. P2021-020*) showing the subject property as being a portion of a future 4.767-acre parcel of land identified as Lot 2, Block A, Fit Sport Life Addition. Following this approval, on August 2, 2021, the City Council approved a final plat (*i.e. Case No. P2021-043*) establishing the subject property as a portion of Lot 2, Block B, Fit Sport Life Addition. The subject property was replatted (*i.e. Case No. P2021-061*) as a portion of Lot 6, Block B, Fit Sport Life Addition by the City Council on December 6, 2021. The subject property has remained vacant since its annexation into the City of Rockwall. On June 17, 2024, the City Council denied a Specific Use Permit (SUP) for a *Residence Hotel* [Case No. Z2024-023] without prejudice to allow the applicant to change the plan and resubmit the request. On December 2, 2024, the City Council approved a *Specific Use Permit (SUP)* for a *Residence Hotel*, which will expire on December 2, 2025. The applicant has not submitted a Site Plan for the *Residence Hotel* that was approved; However, recently, a new applicant approached staff about a different configuration for the *Residence Hotel* on the subject property. Since the proposed configuration would differ from the concept plan approved in the Specific Use Permit (SUP).

PURPOSE

On August 15, 2025, the applicant -- *Kiew Kam of Triangle Engineering, LLC..* -- submitted an application requesting a Specific Use Permit (SUP) for a *Combination Limited Service/Residence Hotel* for the purpose of constructing a 14,204 SF LaQuinta Hampton Extended Stay Hotel on the subject property.

ADJACENT LAND USES AND ACCESS

The subject property is located east of the intersection of FM-549 and Fit Sport Life Boulevard. The land uses adjacent to the subject property are as follows:

North:

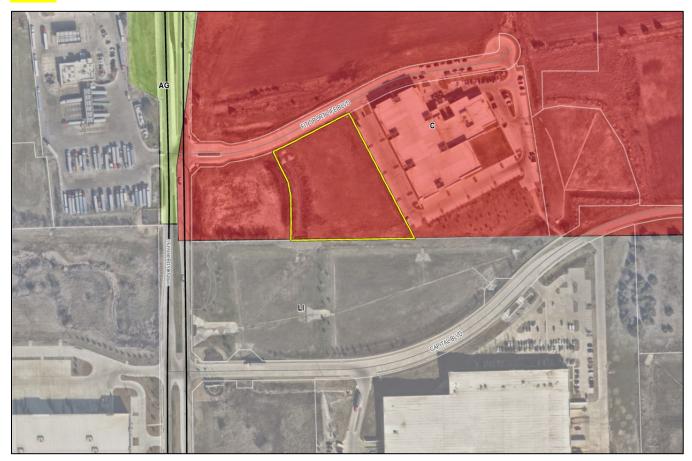
Directly north of the property is a 12.868-acre tract of land (*i.e. Tract 22-2*, of the R Irvine Survey, Abstract No. 120), zoned Commercial (C) District. Beyond this are the eastbound lanes of the IH-30 Frontage Road, followed by the main lanes of IH-30, and the westbound lanes of the IH-30 Frontage Road. Continuing north are two (2) vacant tracts of land (*i.e. Tract 10-3 [8.23-acres] and Tract 10 [14.8-acres] of the R. Irvine Survey, Abstract No. 120*) that are zoned Commercial (C) District. Beyond this are the corporate limits for the City of Rockwall.

South: Directly south of the subject property is a vacant tract of land identified as Lot 1, Block B, Rockwall Technology Park, Phase IV Addition. This land is zoned Light Industrial (LI) District, is owned by the Rockwall Economic Development Corporation (REDC), and currently serves as the regional detention system for Phase 2 of the Rockwall Technology Park. Continuing south, and adjacent to this tract of land, is Capital Boulevard, which is identified as a R2U (i.e. residential, two [2] lane, undivided roadway) on the Master Thoroughfare Plan contained in the OURHometown Vision 2040 Comprehensive Plan. Beyond this are two (2) large industrial facilities (i.e. Pratt Industries and Lollicup), which are zoned Light Industrial (LI) District. Beyond this is Discovery Boulevard, which is identified as a M4U (i.e. major collector, four [4] lane, undivided roadway) on the City's Master Thoroughfare Plan contained in the OURHometown Vision 2040 Comprehensive Plan.

<u>East</u>: Directly east of the subject property is a 6.3770-acre parcel of land identified as Lot 5, Block B, Fit Sport Life Addition and zoned Commercial (C) District. This property is developed with a sports facility (*i.e. AmeriSports*). Beyond this is a 20.51-acre tract of land (*i.e. Tract 22, of the R. Irvine Survey*) zoned Commercial (C) District. North of this tract of land is a 4.317-acre tract of land (*i.e. Tract 22-01 of the R. Irvine Survey*), which is occupied by Big-Tex Trailers and that is zoned Light Industrial (LI) District.

<u>West</u>: Directly west of the subject property is the remainder of a 1.948-acre portion of the larger 4.767-acre parcel of land (*i.e. Lot 6, Block B, Fit Sport Life Addition*), which is being developed with a *Retail Store with Gasoline Sales* (*i.e. 7/11*). This remainder lot is zoned Commercial (C) District. Beyond this is Corporate Crossing, which is identified as a A4D (*i.e. major arterial, four [4] lane, divided roadway*) on the City's Master Thoroughfare Plan contained in the OURHometown Vision 2040 Comprehensive Plan. Beyond this is a 6.1917-acre parcel of land (*i.e. Love's Country Store*) followed by two (2) vacant tracts of land (*i.e. Tract 9-9 [1.898-acres] and Tract 9-11 [1.30-acres of the J Lockhart Survey, Abstract No. 134]*), and a 3.0654-acre parcel of land identified as Lot 1, Block 1, Ya-Hoo Subdivision (*i.e. Photo Technologies*). All of these properties are zoned Light Industrial (LI) District.

CHARACTERISTICS OF THE REQUEST

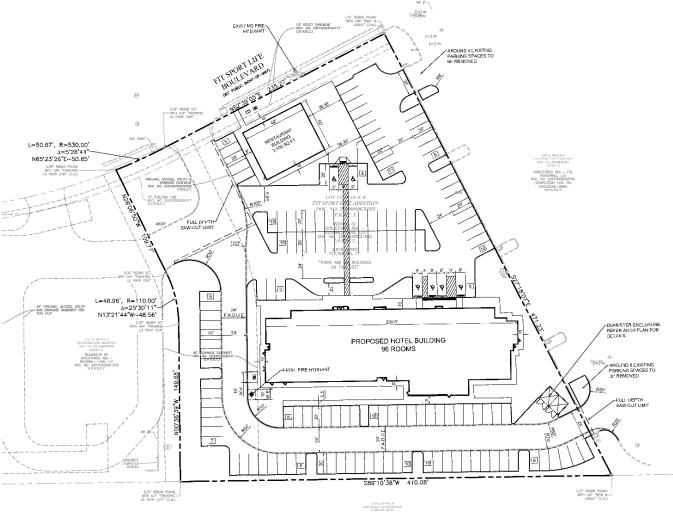


FIGURE 1. CONCEPT PLAN

The applicant has submitted a concept plan for a *Residence Hotel* and *Restaurant* (see *Figure 1*). According to the concept plan, the proposed hotel will consist of a four (4) story building with a 14,204 SF building footprint and a total of 96 guest rooms. The total proposed square footage of all the floors is 56,816 SF. In addition to the *Residence Hotel*, the concept plan (see *Figure 1*) also shows the location of the parking areas and a restaurant. The proposed facility will have access off of Fit Sport Life Boulevard and a cross access easement from the western and eastern properties (*i.e. the 7/11 Gas Station and the AmeriSports Facility*). Although a *Restaurant* is an allowed by-right land use within a Commercial (C) District, the applicant did include it within the *Concept Plan* provided by the applicant to verify that the parking met the City's requirements.

CONFORMANCE WITH THE CITY'S CODES

According to Article 13, *Definitions*, of the Unified Development Code (UDC), a *Residence Hotel* is defined as "(a) hybrid lodging establishment that combines the elements of traditional hotels with long-term residential accommodations. Residence hotels typically offer full furnished, apartment style units equipped with kitchens or kitchenettes, living areas, and separate bedrooms, providing guests with a home-like environment during their stay. These establishments cater to both short-term and extended-stay guests, offering flexible accommodations for travelers, corporate clients, and individuals in need of temporary housing solutions. Residence hotels often provide additional amenities such as housekeeping services, on-site laundry facilities, fitness centers, business centers, and communal spaces to enhance the guest experience." In this case, the proposed *Residence Hotel* will incorporate kitchen facilities, be fully furnished, and have internal corridors leading to the doorways for each unit. According to the *Permissible Use Charts* contained in Article 04, *Permissible Uses*, of the Unified Development Code (UDC), a *Residence Hotel* requires a Specific Use Permit (SUP) in a Commercial (C) District. The purpose of this requirement is to acknowledge that a *Residence Hotel* may <u>not</u> be appropriate within all areas of the City that are zoned Commercial (C) Districts. In addition, according to Subsection 07.03, *Non-Residential District Development Standards*, of Article 05, *District Development Standards*,

of the Unified Development Code (UDC), the maximum height for a building in a Commercial (C) District is 60-feet; however, the building height may be increased up to 240 feet if approved through a Specific Use Permit (SUP). In this case, the applicant is requesting a building height of 60-feet.

Staff should note that the provided concept plan currently conforms to the parking requirements for a *Residence Hotel* and *Restaurant*. Specifically, Article 06, *Parking and Loading*, of the Unified Development Code (UDC) requires that a *Hotel* provide one (1) parking space per each unit and 50.00% of the accessory uses provided in the *Hotel*. Based on the provided concept plan, the required parking for the proposed *Residence Hotel* is 116 parking spaces. Staff calculated this as follows:

Residence Hotel:

- 96 Guest Rooms (1/1) = 96 parking spaces
- Storage Uses (1/1,000 SF @ 348 SF) = 1 parking space
- Office (1/300 SF @ 713 SF) = 2 parking spaces
- Restaurant (1/250 SF @ 1,688 SF) = 7/2 (as Accessory Use) = 9 parking spaces
- Fitness Center and Pool [i.e. Health Club] (1/200 SF @ 2,898 SF) = 15/2 (as Accessory Use) = 8 parking spaces Restaurant: (1/200 SF @ 3,100 SF) = 31 parking spaces

TOTAL: 147 Parking Spaces

Currently, the concept plan shows the provision of 147 parking spaces which meets the required parking spaces for the proposed uses.

OURHOMETOWN VISION 2040 COMPREHENSIVE PLAN

According to the *Future Land Use Plan* contained in the OURHometown Vision 2040 Comprehensive Plan, the subject property is situated within the *IH-30 Corridor District* and is designated for *Special Commercial Corridor* land uses. This land use designation is defined as being "...intended to provide an area for commercial/retail and regional commercial/retail activity centers that are intended to support and serve the entire region..." According to the *District Strategies* for the *IH-30 Corridor District* properties designated for *Special Commercial Corridor* land uses "...will continue to be the City's primary retail corridor in the future..." and "...large commercial centers should incorporate green space or open space at the center of the development that can be used to provide amenity or break up large parking fields." In this case, the applicant is proposing a *Residence Hotel* that will complement the surrounding uses. Currently, there is an *Indoor Sports Facility* adjacent to the subject property that attracts many families form outside of the City through tournaments and league play. Based on this, the proposed facility appears to conform to the OURHometown Vision 2040 Comprehensive Plan.

STAFF ANALYSIS

The concept plan provided by the applicant generally meets the requirements of the Unified Development Code (UDC) with the exception of the submitted building elevations which do not meet the *General Overlay District Standards*. In addition, the applicant's request appears to conform to the OURHometown Vision 2040 Comprehensive Plan. Staff should point out that the applicant will be subject to the building and landscape requirements outlined in the *General Overlay District Standards* and Article 08, *Landscape and Fence Standards*, of the Unified Development Code (UDC) at the time of site plan approval. The applicant will also be required to provide building elevations at the time of site plan to allow the Architectural Review Board (ARB) and the Planning and Zoning Commission to make recommendations and approvals related to the design of the building. With this being said, a request for a Specific Use Permit (SUP) is a discretionary decision for the City Council pending a recommendation from the Planning and Zoning Commission. As mentioned previously, the *Restaurant* portion of this request is not a discretionary decision for the City Council since a restaurant is an allowed *by-right* land use within a Commercial (C) District. That being said, because the applicant chose to include it with the rest of the request, it does add intensity to the property and therefore becomes part of what must be considered under this case.

NOTIFICATIONS

On August 20, 2025, staff mailed nine (9) notices to property owners and occupants within 500-feet of the subject property. There are no Homeowner's Associations (HOA's)/Neighborhood Associations within 1,500-feet of the subject property participating in the Neighborhood Notification Program. Additionally, staff posted a sign on the subject property, and advertised

the public hearings in the Rockwall Herald Banner as required by the Unified Development Code (UDC). At the time this report was drafted, staff has not received any responses in favor or opposition of the applicant's request.

CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL

If the City Council chooses to approve of the applicant's request for a <u>Specific Use Permit (SUP)</u> for a Combination Limited Service/Residence Hotel on the subject property, then staff would propose the following conditions of approval:

- (1) The applicant shall be responsible for maintaining compliance with the operational conditions contained in the Specific Use Permit (SUP) ordinance and which are detailed as follows:
 - (a) The development of this property shall generally conform to the *Concept Plan* depicted in *Exhibit 'B'* of this ordinance for the development of a combination *Limited-Service Hotel* and *Residence Hotel*.
 - (b) The development of the subject property shall generally conform to the *Conceptual Building Elevations* contained in *Exhibit 'C'* of this ordinance; however, the proposed combination *Limited-Service Hotel* and *Residence Hotel* shall be subject to all of the *General Overlay District Standards* as stipulated by Article 05, *District Development Standards*, of the Unified Development Code (UDC). Review for conformance to these requirements shall be completed with the site plan submittal. In addition, a recommendation by the Architecture Review Board (ARB) shall be required prior to approval of the building elevations by the Planning and Zoning Commission. The approval of this Specific Use Permit (SUP) shall *not* constitute the approval of variances or exceptions to any of the standards stipulated by the Unified Development Code (UDC) with regard to the design of the combination *Limited-Service Hotel* and *Residence Hotel*.
 - (c) The maximum overall height of the combination *Limited-Service Hotel* and *Residence Hotel* shall not exceed four (4) stories or 60-feet as depicted in *Exhibit* 'C' of this ordinance.
 - (d) The room composition of the proposed *Limited-Service Hotel/Residence Hotel* shall be subject to the *Room Composition Table* depicted in *Exhibit 'D'* of this ordinance.
 - (e) In the event that the combination *Limited-Service Hotel* and *Residence Hotel* changes *Affiliation Name* as highlighted on the *STR Chain Scales* depicted in *Exhibit 'E'* of this ordinance, the new *Affiliation Name* shall be of a *Scale ID* of 1-5 as stated on the most recent *STR Chain Scale* contained in this exhibit.
- (2) The applicant will be required to submit a site plan with building elevations, a material sample board, a landscape plan, and photometric plan prior to the submittal of engineering plans or the issuance of a building permit.
- (3) Any construction resulting from the approval of this <u>Specific Use Permit (SUP)</u> shall conform to the requirements set forth by the Unified Development Code (UDC), the International Building Code (IBC), the Rockwall Municipal Code of Ordinances, city adopted engineering and fire codes and with all other applicable regulatory requirements administered and/or enforced by the state and federal government.

PLANNING AND ZONING COMMISSION

On September 9, 2025, the Planning and Zoning Commission approved a motion to recommend approval of the <u>Specific Use</u> *Permit (SUP)* by a vote of 7-0.

CITY COUNCIL

On September 15, 2025, the City Council approved a motion to remand the <u>Specific Use Permit (SUP)</u> back to the Planning and Zoning Commission by a vote of 7-0.

PLANNING AND ZONING COMMISSION

On September 30, 2025, the Planning and Zoning Commission approved a motion to recommend approval of the Specific Use Permit (SUP) by a vote of 4-3, with Commissioners Conway, Hagaman, and Schoen dissenting.

WHEREAS, the City has received a request from Kiew Kam of Triangle Engineering, LLC. on behalf of Conor Keilty, AIA of Structured REA-Rockwall Land, LLC for the approval of a <u>Specific Use Permit (SUP)</u> for a combination <u>Limited-Service Hotel</u> and <u>Residence Hotel</u> on a 2.819-acre portion of a larger 4.767-acre parcel of land identified as Lot 6, Block B, Fit Sport Life Addition, City of Rockwall, Rockwall County, Texas, zoned Commercial (C) District, situated within the FM-549 Overlay (FM-549 OV) District, generally located east of the intersection of FM-549 and Fit Sport Life Boulevard, and being more specifically described and depicted in <u>Exhibits 'A'</u> and 'B' of this ordinance, which herein after shall be referred to as the <u>Subject Property</u> and incorporated by reference herein; and

WHEREAS, the Planning and Zoning Commission of the City of Rockwall and the governing body of the City of Rockwall, in compliance with the laws of the State of Texas and the ordinances of the City of Rockwall, have given the requisite notices by publication and otherwise, and have held public hearings and afforded a full and fair hearing to all property owners generally, and to all persons interested in and situated in the affected area and in the vicinity thereof, the governing body in the exercise of its legislative discretion has concluded that Unified Development Code (UDC) [Ordinance No. 20-02] of the City of Rockwall should be amended as follows:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Rockwall, Texas;

SECTION 1. That the approval of this ordinance shall supersede all requirements stipulated in *Ordinance No. 24-48, S-348*; and,

SECTION 2. That the Unified Development Code (UDC) [Ordinance No. 20-02] of the City of Rockwall, as heretofore amended, be and the same is hereby amended so as to grant a Specific Use Permit (SUP) for a combination Limited-Service Hotel and Residence Hotel as stipulated by Subsection 01.02, Land Use Schedule, of Article 04, Permissible Uses, of the Unified Development Code (UDC) [Ordinance No. 20-02] on the Subject Property; and,

SECTION 3. That the Specific Use Permit (SUP) shall be subject to the requirements set forth in Subsection 04.01, *General Commercial District Standards*; Subsection 04.05, *Commercial (C) District*; Subsection 06.02, *General Overlay District Standards*; and, Subsection 06.13, *FM-549 Overlay District*, of Article 05, *District Development Standards*, of the Unified Development Code (UDC) [Ordinance No. 20-02] -- as heretofore amended and as may be amended in the future --, and with the following conditions:

3.1. OPERATIONAL CONDITIONS

The following conditions pertain to the operation of a combination *Limited-Service Hotel* and *Residence Hotel on* the *Subject Property* and conformance to these conditions are required for continued operations:

- (1) The development of this property shall generally conform to the *Concept Plan* depicted in *Exhibit 'B'* of this ordinance for the development of a combination *Limited-Service Hotel* and *Residence Hotel*.
- (2) The development of the subject property shall generally conform to the *Conceptual Building Elevations* contained in *Exhibit 'C'* of this ordinance; however, the proposed combination *Limited-Service Hotel* and *Residence Hotel* shall be subject to all of the *General Overlay District Standards* as stipulated by Article 05, *District Development Standards*, of the Unified Development Code (UDC). Review for conformance to these requirements shall be completed with the site plan submittal. In addition, a recommendation by the Architecture Review Board (ARB) shall be required prior to approval of the building elevations by the Planning and Zoning Commission. The approval of this Specific Use Permit (SUP) shall *not* constitute the approval of variances or exceptions to any of the standards stipulated by the Unified Development Code (UDC) with regard to the design of the combination *Limited-Service Hotel* and *Residence Hotel*.
- (3) The maximum overall height of the combination *Limited-Service Hotel* and *Residence Hotel* shall not exceed four (4) stories or 60-feet as depicted in *Exhibit 'C'* of this ordinance.
- (4) The room composition of the proposed *Limited-Service Hotel/Residence Hotel* shall be subject to the *Room Composition Table* depicted in *Exhibit 'D'* of this ordinance.
- (5) In the event that the combination *Limited-Service Hotel* and *Residence Hotel* changes *Affiliation Name* as highlighted on the *STR Chain Scales* depicted in *Exhibit 'E'* of this ordinance, the new *Affiliation Name* shall be of a *Scale ID* of *1-5* as stated on the most recent *STR Chain Scale* contained in this exhibit.

3.2. COMPLIANCE

Approval of this ordinance in accordance with Subsection 02.02, *Specific Use Permits (SUP)*, of Article 11, *Development Applications and Review Procedures*, of the Unified Development Code (UDC) will require compliance to the following:

(1) Upon obtaining a *Certificate of Occupancy (CO)* and/or building permit, should the business owner operating under the guidelines of this ordinance fail to meet the minimum operational requirements set forth herein and outlined in the Unified Development Code (UDC), the City may (*after proper notice*) initiate proceedings to revoke the Specific Use

Permit (SUP) in accordance with Subsection 02.02(F), *Revocation*, of Article 11, *Development Applications and Revision Procedures*, of the Unified Development Code (UDC) [Ordinance No. 20-02].

SECTION 4. That the official zoning map of the City be corrected to reflect the changes in zoning described herein.

SECTION 5. That all ordinances of the City of Rockwall in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance be, and the same are hereby repealed to the extent of that conflict.

SECTION 6. Any person, firm, or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be punished by a penalty of fine not to exceed the sum of *TWO THOUSAND DOLLARS* (\$2,000.00) for each offence and each and every day such offense shall continue shall be deemed to constitute a separate offense.

SECTION 7. If any section or provision of this ordinance or the application of that section or provision to any person, firm, corporation, situation or circumstance is for any reason judged invalid, the adjudication shall not affect any other section or provision of this ordinance or the application of any other section or provision to any other person, firm, corporation, situation or circumstance, and the City Council declares that it would have adopted the valid portions and applications of the ordinance without the invalid parts and to this end the provisions of this ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 8. That this ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage.

Concept Plan

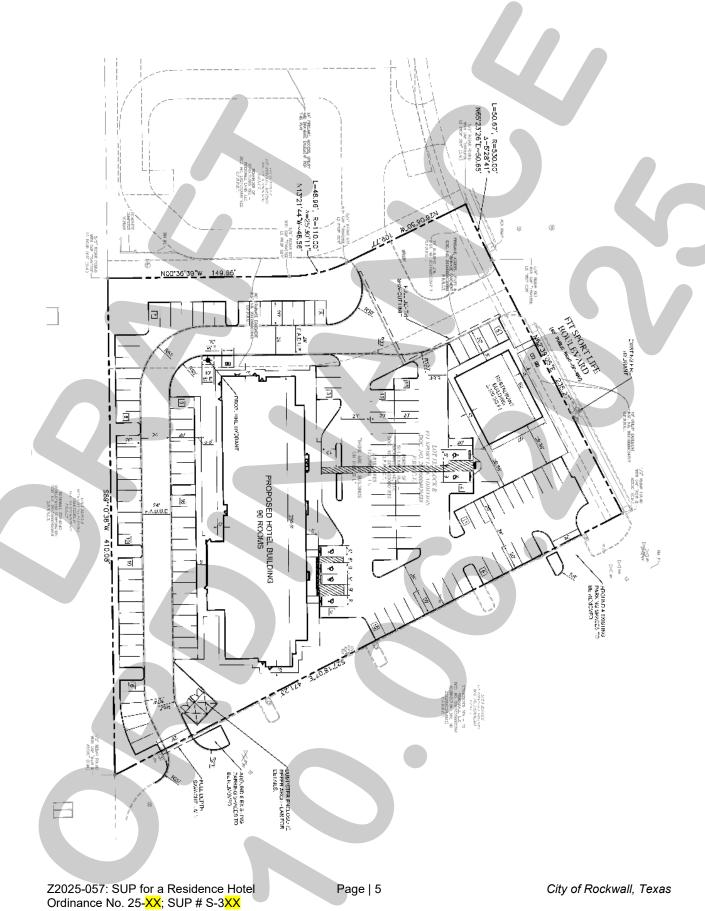
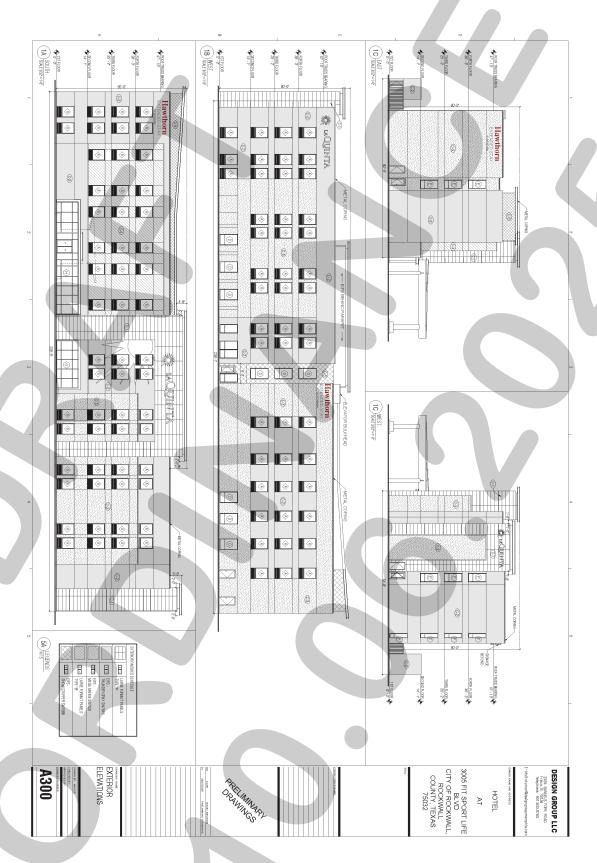


Exhibit 'C'Conceptual Building Elevations

SUBJECT: Z2025-059; Zoning Change (AG to PD)

On September 9, 2025, the Planning and Zoning Commission recommended approval of *Case No. Z2025-059* by a vote of 7-0; however, on September 15, 2025, the City Council voted 7–0 to remand the case back to the Planning and Zoning Commission. The purpose of this action was to allow the applicant additional time to incorporate revisions to the case that included: [1] a subdivision amenity package, [2] increased anti-monotony standards, [3] more substantial entry monumentation, and [4] the inclusion of side entry garages. Based on the feedback provided by the City Council, the applicant made the following changes to the proposed Planned Development District ordinance and concept plan:

- (1) The applicant has included a location for two (2) covered pickleball courts on the concept plan and provided an image showing what this site amenity will generally look like at the time of construction.
- (2) The applicant has provided increased anti-monotony standards that stipulate for every 25 homes constructed there shall not be more than one (1) matching building elevation. This means that the proposed development will only have the ability to provide two (2) of the same elevation throughout the subdivision. In addition, the anti-monotony standards have been changed to stipulate that four (4) differing elements -- as opposed to three (3) differing elements -- are required to determine if a home is substantially different.
- (3) The applicant has incorporated an exhibit of a more substantial entry monument sign into the Planned Development District ordinance than was previously provided.
- (4) The applicant has agreed to include side entry garage configurations into the Planned Development District ordinance.

On September 30, 2025 the Planning and Zoning Commission reviewed the changes to the Planned Development District and approved a motion to recommend approval of the zoning change by a vote of 7-0. Should the City Council have any questions, staff will be available at the *October 6*, 2025 meeting.

SUMMARY

Hold a public hearing to discuss and consider a request by William Andrew Solomon of KRE 15, LLC for the approval of a <u>Zoning Change</u> from an Agricultural (AG) District to a Planned Development District for Single-Family 1 (SF-1) District land uses on a 105.285-acre tract of land identified as Tract 4 of the J. R. Marrs Survey, Abstract No. 152, City of Rockwall, Rockwall County, Texas, zoned Agricultural (AG) District, situated within the SH-276 Overlay (SH-276 OV) District, generally located on the south side of SH-276 west of the intersection of SH-276 and E. FM-550, and take any action necessary.

BACKGROUND

The subject property was annexed on December 22, 2008 by *Ordinance No. 08-65* [Case No. A2008-003]. At the time of annexation, the subject property was zoned Agricultural (AG) District. There have been no changes to the zoning designation, and the subject property has remained vacant since annexation.

PURPOSE

On August 15, 2025, the applicant -- William Andrew Solomon of KRE 15, LLC -- submitted an application requesting to change the zoning of the subject property from an Agricultural (AG) District to a Planned Development District for Single-Family 1 (SF-1) District land uses. Specifically, the applicant is proposing to entitle the subject property for a 54-lot single-family, residential subdivision that will consist of two (2) lot sizes (i.e. [A] 44, 100' x 200' lots; and [B] 10, 150' x 250' lots).

ADJACENT LAND USES AND ACCESS

The subject property is generally located on the south side of SH-276, west of the intersection of SH-276 and E. FM-550. The land uses adjacent to the subject property are as follows:

North: Directly north of the subject property are the corporate limits for the City of Rockwall. Beyond this is SH-276, which is identified as a P6D (*i.e. primary arterial, six [6] lane, divided roadway*) on the City's Master Thoroughfare Plan contained in the OURHometown Vision 2040 Comprehensive Plan. Beyond this are properties located within the City of Rockwall's Extraterritorial Jurisdiction (ETJ).

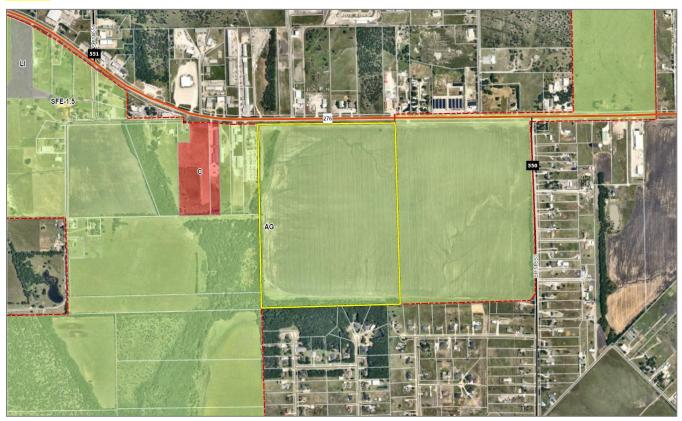
<u>South</u>: Directly south of the subject property are the corporate limits for the City of Rockwall. Beyond this are properties located within the City of Rockwall's Extraterritorial Jurisdiction (ETJ).

East: Directly east of the subject property is a vacant 105.925-acre tract of land (i.e. Tract 10-1 of the J. R. Marrs Survey, Abstract No. 152) zoned Agricultural (AG) District. Beyond this are the corporate limits for the City of Rockwall.

<u>West</u>: Directly west of the subject property are four (4) tracts of land (*i.e. Tract 1-5, 1-6, 1-7, & 1-9 of the J. H. Bailey Survey, Abstract No. 22*) that face onto SH-276, which are developed with non-residential land uses zoned Agricultural (AG) District. Beyond this is a 3.8725-acre parcel of land (*i.e. Lot 1, Block A, Rockwall Friendship Baptist Church*) developed with a *Church/House of Worship*, zoned Commercial (C) District. Following this is a vacant 11.8161-acre tract of land (*i.e. Tract 1-1 of the J. H. Bailey Survey, Abstract No. 22*) zoned Commercial (C)

District. To the west and south of these properties are several tracts of land that are either vacant or have a single-family home constructed on them. Beyond this is Zollner Road, which is identified as a M4U (*i.e. major arterial, four [4] lane, undivided roadway*) on the City's Master Thoroughfare Plan contained in the OURHometown Vision 2040 Comprehensive Plan.

CHARACTERISTICS OF THE REQUEST

The applicant has submitted a concept plan and development standards for the proposed residential subdivision. The concept plan shows that the 105,285-acre subject property will be divided into 84,228-acres of land consisting of 54 residential lots. and 21.057-acres of open space. The proposed 54 single-family residential lots will consist of two (2) lot types; [1] 44 Type 'A' lots that are a minimum of 100' x 200' with a minimum square footage of 43,560 SF, and [2] ten (10) Type 'B' lots that are a minimum of 150' x 250' with a minimum square footage of 63,340 SF. This translates to a gross residential density of 0.513 dwelling units per gross acre for the total development (i.e. 0.60 dwelling units on the net acre -- 105.85-acres - 15.89-acres of floodplain = 89.385-acres: 54 lots/89.385-acres = 0.60406 dwelling units per net acre). The minimum dwelling unit size (i.e. air-condition space only) will range from 3,000 SF to 3,250 SF. With regard to the proposed housing product, staff has incorporated the anti-monotony standards from the Unified Development Code (UDC) and masonry requirements similar to other Planned Development Districts into the proposed Planned Development District ordinance. Specifically, the ordinance will require a minimum of 100.00% masonry; however, the Planned Development District ordinance will also incorporate provisions that allow up to 80.00% cementitious fiberboard utilized in a horizontal lap-siding, board-and-batten siding, or decorative pattern to allow a more Traditional Neighborhood Design product (also referred to as Gingerbread or Modern Farmhouse -- similar to what is allowed in the Somerset Park Subdivision). The proposed subdivision will be subject to the land uses and density and dimensional requirements stipulated for properties within a Single-Family 1 (SF-1) District unless otherwise specified in the Planned Development District ordinance. The following is a summary of the lot composition and density and dimensional standards contained in the proposed Planned Development District ordinance:

GENERAL NOTES:

- 1: Lots fronting onto curvilinear streets, cul-de-sacs and eyebrows may have the front lot width reduced by 20% as measured at the front property line provided that the lot width will be met at the *front yard* and *rear yard building setback*. Additionally, the lot depth on lots fronting onto curvilinear streets, cul-de-sacs and eyebrows may be reduced by up to ten (10) percent, but shall meet the minimum lot size for each lot type referenced in *Table 1*.
- 2: The location of the front yard building setback as measured from the front property line.
- 3: The maximum height shall be measured to the eave or top plate (whichever is greater) of the single-family home.
- 4: The location of the rear yard building setback as measured from the rear property line.
- 5: Sunrooms, porches, stoops, bay windows, balconies, masonry clad chimneys, eaves and similar architectural features may encroach beyond the *front yard building setback* by up to ten (10) feet for any property; however, the encroachment shall not exceed five (5) feet on *side yard setbacks*. A sunroom is an enclosed room no more than 15-feet in width that has glass on at least 50% of each of the encroaching faces.
- 6: All *corner lots* that back to a lot that fronts onto the same street that the *corner lot* sides to (*i.e.* a *keystone lot*), shall have a side setback that is equal to the front setback of the fronting lot. in addition, no solid fence *shall be situated within this setback*.
- 7: Air-conditioned space.

The proposed concept plan shows that the development will consist of 21.057-acres of private open space -- where 15.89-acres are floodplain -- representing 20.00% (i.e. [15.89-acres of floodplain/2] + 13.36 = 21.057-acres/105.285-acres gross = 20.00%) of the site being dedicated to open space/amenity. This meets the total open space of 20.00% required by Article 10, Planned Development District Standards, of the Unified Development Code (UDC). In addition, the proposed development will incorporate a minimum of a 70-foot landscape buffer with an eight (8) foot meandering trail along SH-276. The concept plan also depicts the provision of an eight (8) foot trail system that will be provided throughout the development to connect the future residential lots with the private open spaces. All of these items have been included into the proposed Planned Development District ordinance and will be requirements of the proposed subdivision.

INFRASTRUCTURE

Based on the applicant's concept plan and the proposed density, the following infrastructure is required to be constructed to provide adequate public services for the proposed development:

(1) <u>Roadways</u>. All residential streets are required to be constructed to an R2 (*i.e.* residential, two [2] lane, undivided roadway) standard, which is a 29-foot back-to-back concrete street center within a 50-foot right-of-way with a minimum five (5) foot concrete sidewalk on either side of the street, unless otherwise required by the Planned Development District Ordinance. All residential streets are required to be curb and gutter. With regard to the Master Thoroughfare Plan contained in the OURHometown Vision 2040 Comprehensive Plan, the applicant will be required to construct the following:

(a) <u>Unnamed Roadway Extending along the Southern Property Line</u>. This unnamed roadway is identified as a <u>Minor Collector</u>, which is a 41-foot <u>back-to-back</u> concrete street center within a 60-foot right-of-way with a minimum of a five
 (5) foot concrete sidewalk constructed on either side of the roadway, unless otherwise required by the Planned Development District Ordinance.

All of these streets are required to be curb and gutter, and any medians are required to be curbed with the streets draining away from the medians. In addition to these roadways, the applicant will be required to perform a Traffic Impact Analysis (TIA) that is prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Engineering Department's *Design and Construction Manual*.

- (2) <u>Wastewater</u>. The applicant is requesting to utilize *On-Site Sewer Facilities* (OSSF) for this development. If the applicant is not approved for this request, the applicant need to provide sewer facilities in accordance with the City's Master Wastewater Collection Plan.
- (3) <u>Water</u>. At a minimum, the applicant will be required to loop an eight (8) inch water line on-site to the property lines, install a minimum 12-inch water line, and dedicate any necessary easements in accordance with the City's Master Water Distribution Plan. The City will also need a letter from *Blackland Water Supply Corporation* (WSC) stating that Blackland WSC can provide the City's required fire flows and pressures.
- (4) <u>Drainage</u>. The applicant shall be required to perform a flood study to delineate the fully developed 100-year localized floodplain for all ponds, creeks or streams, and draws on the subject property. Detention will be required and sized per the Engineering Standards of Design and Construction, and be situated <u>outside</u> the floodplain. The applicant will also be required to perform a Wetlands and Waters of the United States (WOTUS) study for any existing ponds and waterways on the subject property. Any changes to the existing floodplain will require approval from the City and FEMA. All residential lots shall be exclusive of the erosion hazard setback and the floodplain.

CONFORMANCE TO THE CITY'S CODES

The proposed Planned Development District conforms to the majority of the City's code requirements; however, it should be noted that the development standards contained within the Planned Development District ordinance deviate from the requirements of the Unified Development Code (UDC), the Municipal Code of Ordinances, and the Engineering Department's Standards of Design and Construction Manual in the following ways:

(1) <u>Alleyways</u>. The Engineering Department's Standards of Design and Construction Manual stipulates that "(a)lleys shall be provided in all residential areas and shall be paved with steel reinforced concrete..." The code does grant the City Council the ability to "... waive the residential alley requirement, if it is in the best interest of the City." [Page 14; Section 2.11 of the Standards of Design and Construction Manual]

<u>Applicant's Response</u>: In lieu of providing the required alleyways, the applicant is proposing to provide 100.00% *J-Swing* or *Traditional Swing* garages. As a compensatory measure the applicant is proposing to provide additional architectural elements into all garage configurations in the form of decorative wood doors or wood overlays on insulated metal doors with carriage style hardware.

With regard to the applicant's request for *On-Site Sewage Facilities* (OSSF), the City Rockwall has an Interlocal Agreement with Rockwall County for OSSF inspections. Per this agreement, Rockwall County will issue permits and perform OSSF inspections on new and existing septic systems per the County's *Rules for Regulation of On-Site Sewage Facilities*, which stipulates a minimum lot size of 1½-acres. According to Subsection 44-243(d) of Article IV, *Sewers and Sewage Disposal*, of the Municipal Code of Ordinances, "(n)o permit for the installation of an on-site sewage facility (OSSF) will be issued for property of less than 1½-acre, unless an exception is granted by the City Council on the grounds that undue hardship will be created if said lot is not connected to an OSSF." Staff should note that Rockwall County has stated that they will *not* inspect OSSF's that are on lots less than 1½-acres. It should also be noted that the City Council has granted OSSF systems for developments (e.g. Planned Development District 76 [PD-76], Planned Development District 78 [PD-78], and Planned Development District 104 [PD-104]) proposing lots less than 1½-acre in size, but greater than one (1) acre when the developer proposes [1] the OSSF systems are designed by a licensed OSSF professional (i.e. licensed engineer, sanitarian, etc.), [2] a stamped and signed copy of the OSSF plan indicating the full limits of the septic field be submitted to the City at the time of

building permit on a *lot-by-lot* basis, and [3] all OSSF are inspected by a City approved inspector. In this case, the applicant is requesting to install OSSF's on lots 1.00-acre and greater (*with the majority of the lots being less than* 1½-acre in size), and has included language generally in compliance with the aforementioned stipulations. In addition, the applicant has included language that will [1] ensure all *Septic Systems* shall be designed by a licensed *On-Site Sewage Facility (OSSF)* professional (e.g. licensed engineer, sanitarian, etcetera), [2] ensure that a stamped and signed copy of the *Septic System* plans indicating the full limits of the septic field shall be submitted to the city at the time of building permit on a *lot-by-lot* basis, and [3] all *Septic Systems* shall be inspected and approved by the City's chosen inspector. The applicant has stated the reason for the OSSF request is due to the availability of sewer.

CONFORMANCE WITH OURHOMETOWN VISION 2040 COMPREHENSIVE PLAN

According to the *Future Land Use Plan* contained in the OURHometown Vision 2040 Comprehensive Plan, the subject property is located within the <u>South Central Estates District</u> and is designated for <u>Commercial/Retail</u> and <u>Medium Density Residential</u> land uses. The plan defines <u>Medium Density Residential</u> land uses as residential subdivisions that are "... greater than two and one-half (2½) units per gross acre, but not higher than three (3) units per gross acre; however, a density of up to three and one-half (3½) units per gross acre may be permitted for developments that incorporate increased amenity and a mix of land uses." In addition, the Comprehensive Plan defines increased amenity as, "... developments that provide some

of the following: (1) open space beyond the required 20%, (2) a golf course and/or other comparable recreation facilities, (3) amenity/recreation facilities, (4) school site integration, (5) dedication or development of park land beyond the required park land dedication, (6) additional development of trails, (7) other amenities deemed appropriate by the City Council." In addition, according to Subsection 01.04, *Calculation of Density*, of Article 05, *District Development Standards*, of the Unified Development Code (UDC), "(t)he calculation of allowable density for residential developments shall be based on the *gross* site area including right-of-way, floodplain, open space and public/private parks that will be dedicated to the City or preserved and maintained by some other mechanism." In this case the applicant is proposing a total gross density of *0.513* dwelling units per acre [*i.e. 54/105.285* = *0.51289 or 0.513*]. Based on this, the applicant's request is in conformance with the required density for the *Medium Density Residential* land use; however, the applicant's request is *not* in conformance with the *Commercial/Retail* land use designation. Given that the density is less than two (2) units per gross acre, the proposed residential subdivision would be better classified as *Low Density Residential*. Based on this the applicant is requesting to change the land use designation of the subject property from *Medium Density Residential* and *Commercial/Retail* to *Low Density Residential*. This proposed change would constitute a change in the Future Land Use Plan, which is a discretionary decision for the City Council pending a recommendation from the Planning and Zoning Commission.

Looking at the pertinent *District Strategies* for the <u>South Central Estate District</u> and how the proposed concept plan conforms to these strategies, staff identified the following:

(1) <u>Suburban Residential</u>. This <u>District</u> has several large tracts of land that can support highly amenitized master planned communities. Any new <u>Suburban Residential</u> developments should include a mix of larger to mid-sized lots. In addition, newer subdivisions adjacent to existing larger lot subdivisions should provide a transition (e.g. larger lots or a large landscape buffer) adjacent to the existing subdivision. Due to the availability of infrastructure residential in this area may also be suitable for 1½-acre lots with septic systems.

<u>Staff Response</u>: The submitted *Concept Plan* does not provide any amenities for the subdivision, with the exception of the eight (8) trail network and the open space; however, these items are required by Article 10, *Planned Development Regulations*, of the Unified Development Code (UDC). In addition, the proposed lot mix does not provide a variety of larger to mid-sized lots. That being said -- *given that the proposed subdivision will have OSSF* -- this limits the ability to provide mid-sized lots. In addition, at their work session on August 26, 2025, the Planning and Zoning Commission requested that the applicant remove the enclosed amenity center and pool proposed by the applicant with the original

- request. Based on this direction from the Planning and Zoning Commission, staff has determined that the proposed *Concept Plan* can be considered to be conforming with this *District Strategy*.
- (2) <u>Commercial Land Uses</u>. Due to the anticipated alignment of the Outer Loop (*i.e. current alignment of FM-548*), the <u>Commercial/Retail</u> centers along SH-276 are ideal for larger scale retail businesses and restaurants that could support any office or residential development in the area. These areas could also provide neighborhood service uses intended to allow smaller commercial uses that can support adjacent residential land uses.
 - <u>Staff Response</u>: The proposed *Concept Plan* does <u>not</u> incorporate any <u>Commercial/Retail</u> zoning, and based on this is <u>not</u> considered to be conforming with this *District Strategy*.

With regard to the policies and goals for residential and commercial development contained in the Comprehensive Plan, the applicant's request incorporates the majority of the residential policies and goals (e.g. minimum of six [6] foot side yard setbacks on all lot types, traditional swing or J-swing garages, etc.); however, by virtue of not incorporating Commercial/Retail in the Concept Plan, the applicant's request does not meet any of the policies and goals set forth by the Comprehensive Plan for non-residential development. That being said, staff has identified the following residential non-conformities of the original concept plan and provided the following recommendations to the applicant:

- (1) <u>CH. 1; Section 2.02; Goal #2 | Policy #1 (Page 1-2)</u>. Where residential uses are proposed through a Planned Development District that abuts an existing residential development, the proposed lots should be the same or a compatible size as the existing lots or be buffered by open space, trails, sidewalks, natural screening, or a roadway.
 - <u>Staff's Response</u>: The residential subdivisions adjacent to the subject property are not located within the City of Rockwall; however, the proposed subdivision appears to be similar in design to the adjacent subdivisions.
- (2) <u>CH. 1; Section 2.02; Goal #2 | Policy #3 (Page 1-2)</u>. Existing development patterns and surrounding conditions (e.g. lot size, architectural style, public improvements, etc.) should be considered in conjunction with this Comprehensive Plan to determine the appropriate zoning designation for a property.
 - <u>Staff's Response</u>: The residential subdivisions adjacent to the subject property are not located within the City of Rockwall; however, the proposed subdivision appears to be similar in design to the adjacent subdivisions. In addition, the proposed concept plan appears to be generally compatible to other new large lot (*i.e. one [1] acre and greater*) subdivisions within the City of Rockwall.
- (3) <u>CH. 8; Section 2.02; Goal #1 | Policy #1 (Page 8-2)</u>. All new developments should include a range of high quality, well-constructed, and appropriately planned residential unit types.
 - <u>Staff's Response</u>: Based on the proposed *Concept Plan*, there is one (1) acre to 1½-acre lot product being proposed. The Planning and Zoning Commission and City Council will determine whether this represents an acceptable range of unit types.
- (4) <u>CH. 8; Section 2.03; Goal #1 | Policy #2 (Page 8-3)</u>. To maximize the value of properties that are directly adjacent to or across the street from a park and/or public open space, and should not back or side to the park and/or open space. If homes face onto a park and/or public open space and there is no public street, then the homes should be accessed via a mew-type street design.
 - <u>Staff's Response</u>: Homes adjacent to open spaces should face onto the open space -- instead of being oriented so that the side or rear yard faces the open space --, and be accessible by a single-loaded street. Currently, the proposed Concept Plan has two (2) lots facing onto open space and six (6) lots with the side yard facing the open space. Based on this, the proposed Concept Plan could do a better job of facing homes onto open spaces as opposed to siding the homes towards these open spaces.

Taking into account the applicant's concept plan and other submitted exhibits, the proposed density, and the development standards, the request *does* appear to be in conformance with the majority of the goals and policies of the OURHometown Vision 2040 Comprehensive Plan and the development standards of the Unified Development Code (UDC); however, the

changes to the Future Land Use Map and the nature of this Planned Development District makes this request a discretionary decision for the City Council pending a recommendation from the Planning and Zoning Commission.

NOTIFICATIONS

On August 22, 2025, staff mailed nine (9) notices to property owners and occupants within 500-feet of the subject property. Staff did not notify any Homeowner's Associations (HOAs), as there are not any HOAs within 1,500-feet of the subject property participating in the Neighborhood Notification Program. Additionally, staff posted a sign on the subject property, and advertised the public hearings in the Rockwall Herald Banner as required by the Unified Development Code (UDC). At the time this report was drafted, staff had not received any returned notices in regard to the applicants request.

CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL

If the City Council chooses to approve the applicant's request to rezone the subject property from an Agricultural (AG) District to a Planned Development District for Single-Family 1 (SF-1) District land uses, then staff would propose the following conditions of approval:

- (1) The applicant shall be responsible for maintaining compliance with the concept plan and development standards contained in the Planned Development District ordinance.
- (2) By approving this <u>Zoning Change</u>, the City Council will effectively be approving changes to the Comprehensive Plan and Future Land Use Map. Specifically, this will change the designation of the subject property from <u>Medium Density Residential</u> and <u>Commercial/Retail</u> to a <u>Low Density Residential</u> designation.
- (3) Any construction resulting from the approval of this <u>Zoning Change</u> shall conform to the requirements set forth by the Unified Development Code (UDC), the International Building Code (IBC), the Rockwall Municipal Code of Ordinances, city adopted engineering and fire codes and with all other applicable regulatory requirements administered and/or enforced by the state and federal government.

PLANNING AND ZONING COMMISSION

On September 9, 2025, the Planning and Zoning Commission approved a motion to recommend approval of the zoning change by a vote of 7-0, with the condition that all garages shall be a minimum of three (3) car, and Type A lots shall have a minimum home size of 3,000 SF and Type B lots shall have a minimum home size of 3,250 SF. Based on the conditions recommended by the Planning and Zoning Commission, staff has made the necessary changes to the case memo and the draft ordinance.

CITY COUNCIL

On September 15, 2025, the City Council approved a motion to remand the zoning change back to the Planning and Zoning Commission by a vote of 7-0. The purpose of this action was to allow the applicant additional time to incorporate the following requested revisions: [1] a subdivision amenity package, [2] increased anti-monotony standards, [3] more substantial entry monumentation, and [4] the inclusion of side entry garages.

PLANNING AND ZONING COMMISSION

On September 30, 2025, the Planning and Zoning Commission approved a motion to recommend approval of the zoning change by a vote of 7-0.

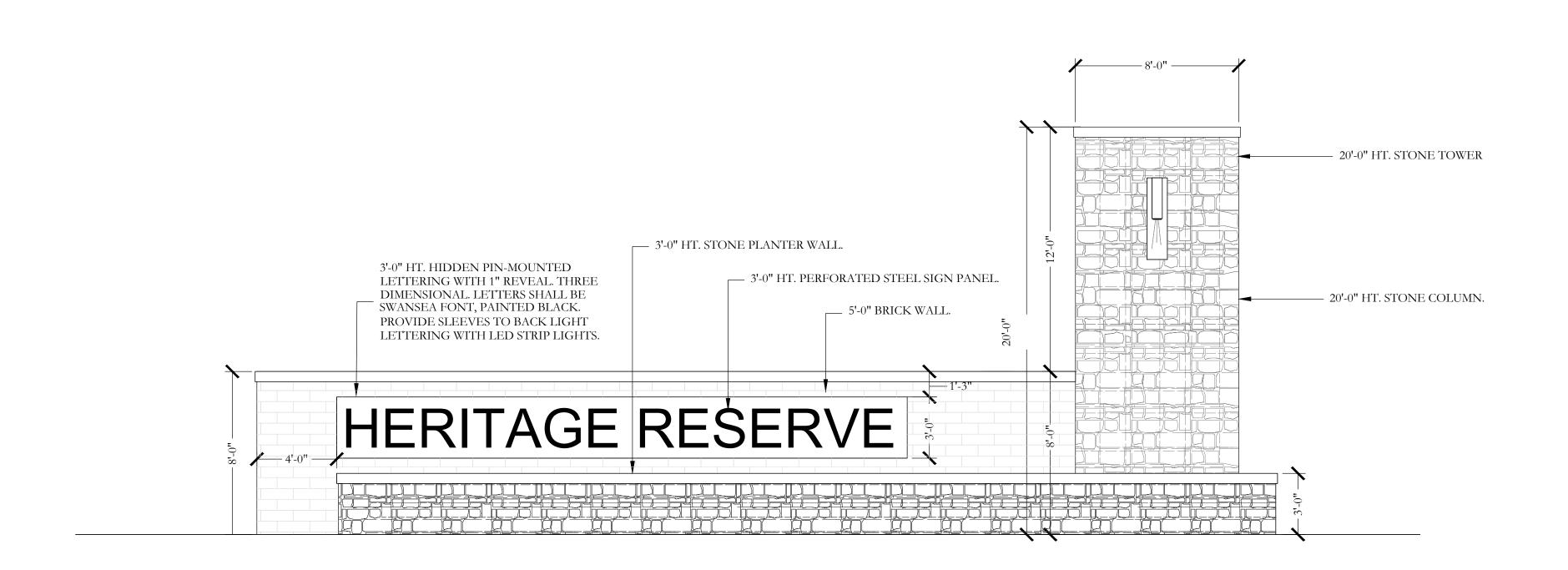

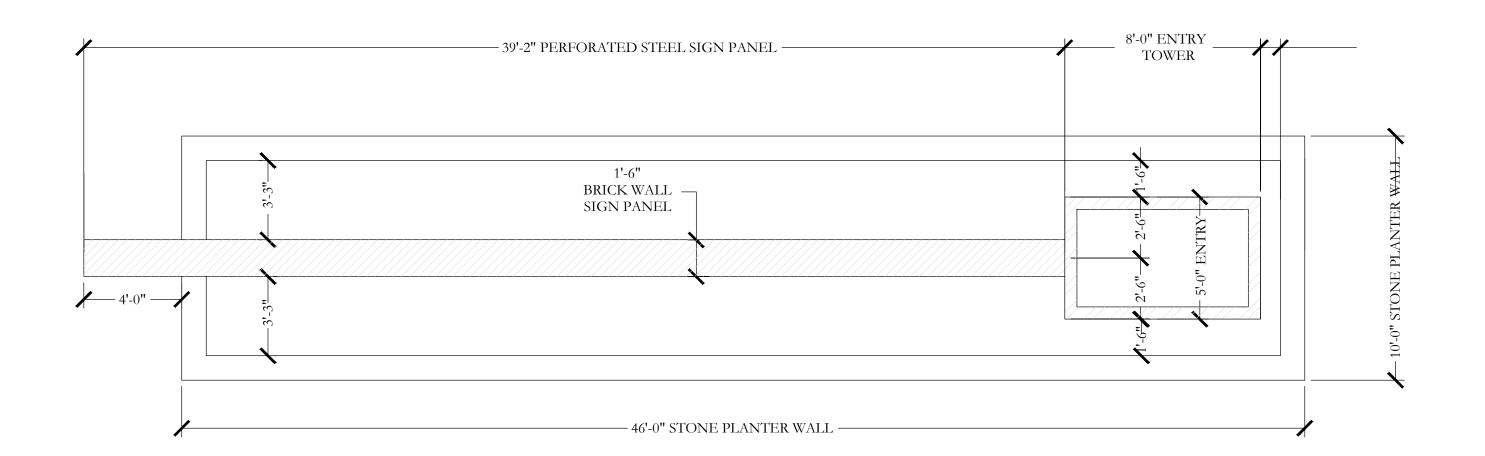

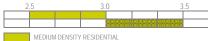

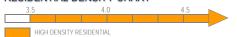

17 SOUTH CENTRAL ESTATES DISTRICT

DISTRICT DESCRIPTION

The South Central Estates District has the potential to have a mixture of land uses, but is currently relatively undeveloped. The district does have a low density (i.e. Equestrian Meadows) and a medium density (i.e. West View) subdivision situated within the southern portions of the district. Along SH-276, there are currently some transitional commercial land uses and residential homes situated on long narrow lots. This district is projected to transition to more intense commercial land uses along SH-276, but still maintain estate and rural residential land uses south of SH-276. Much of the areas along SH-276 will depend on the viability and alignment of the future Outer Loop.

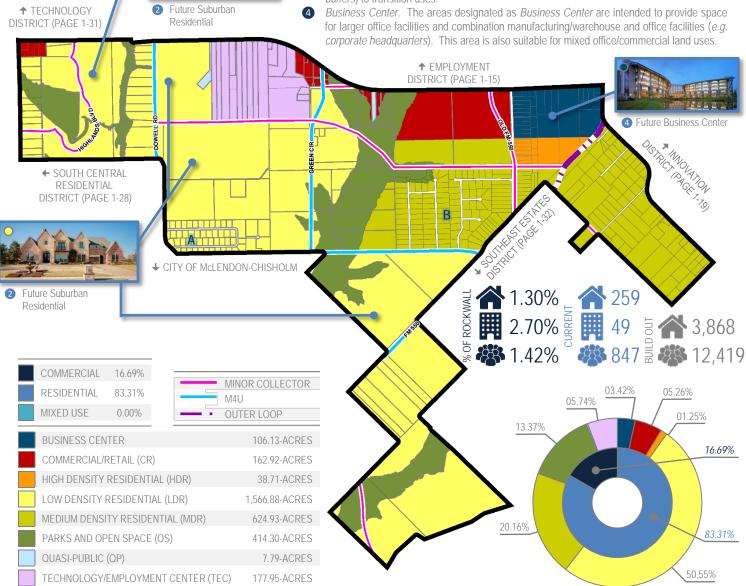

DISTRICT STRATEGIES

Taking into account that the *South Central Estates District* has a large amount of mostly vacant or raw land with limited access to infrastructure (*i.e. water and wastewater facilities*), the following are the recommended strategies for this district:

- ① Opportunity Zone (Intersection of SH-276 & FM-548). When constructed this intersection will be a major land use node in the district and have the potential to provide employment and professional campus land uses mixed with entertainment, restaurant and retail land uses that can create an "18-Hour" environment (i.e. an environment that provides the ability to live, work, shop and dine).
- 2 Suburban Residential. The district has several large tracts of land that can support highly amenitized master planned communities. Any new Suburban Residential developments should include a mix of larger to mid-sized lots. In addition, newer subdivisions adjacent to existing larger lot subdivisions should provide a transition (e.g. larger lots or a large landscape buffer) adjacent to the existing subdivision. Due to the availability of infrastructure residential in this area may also be suitable for 1½-acre lots with septic systems.
- 3 Commercial/Retail Centers. Due to the anticipated alignment of the Outer Loop (i.e. current alignment of FM-548), the commercial/retail centers along SH-276 are ideal for larger scale retail businesses and restaurants that could support any office or residential development in the area. These areas could also provide neighborhood service uses intended to allow smaller commercial uses that can support adjacent residential land uses. All commercial developments should incorporate appropriate screening (e.g. berms, landscaping and large buffers) to transition uses.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROCKWALL, TEXAS, AMENDING THE UNIFIED DEVELOPMENT CODE [ORDINANCE NO. 20-02] OF THE CITY OF ROCKWALL, AS HERETOFORE AMENDED, SO AS TO CHANGE THE ZONING FROM AN AGRICULTURAL (AG) DISTRICT TO PLANNED DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT XX (PD-XX) FOR SINGLE-FAMILY 1 (SF-1) DISTRICT LAND USES ON THE SUBJECT PROPERTY, BEING A 105.285-ACRE TRACT OF LAND IDENTIFIED AS TRACT 4 OF THE J. R. MARRS SURVEY, ABSTRACT NO. 152, CITY OF ROCKWALL, ROCKWALL COUNTY, TEXAS AND MORE FULLY DESCRIBED HEREIN BY EXHIBIT 'A' AND DEPICTED HEREIN BY EXHIBIT 'B'; PROVIDING FOR SPECIAL CONDITIONS: PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY OF FINE NOT TO EXCEED THE SUM OF TWO THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$2,000.00) FOR EACH OFFENSE: **PROVIDING** SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR A REPEALER CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City has received a request from William Andrew Solomon of KRE 15, LLC for the approval of a zoning change from an Agricultural (AG) District to a Planned Development District for Single-Family 1 (SF-1) District land uses on a 105.285-acre tract of land identified as Tract 4 of the J. R. Marrs Survey, Abstract No. 152, City of Rockwall, Rockwall County, Texas, more fully described in *Exhibit 'A'* and depicted in *Exhibit 'B'* of this ordinance, which hereinafter shall be referred to as the *Subject Property* and incorporated by reference herein; and

WHEREAS, the Planning and Zoning Commission of the City of Rockwall and the governing body of the City of Rockwall in compliance with the laws of the State of Texas and the ordinances of the City of Rockwall have given the requisite notices by publication and otherwise, and have held public hearings and afforded a full and fair hearing to all property owners generally and to all persons interested in and situated in the affected area, and in the vicinity thereof, and the governing body in the exercise of its legislative discretion, has concluded that the Unified Development Code [Ordinance No. 20-02] should be amended as follows:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROCKWALL, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That the *Subject Property* shall be used only in the manner and for the purposes authorized by this Planned Development District Ordinance and the Unified Development Code [*Ordinance No. 20-02*] of the City of Rockwall as heretofore amended, as amended herein by granting this zoning change, and as maybe amended in the future;

SECTION 2. That development of the *Subject Property* shall generally be in accordance with the *Concept Plan*, depicted in *Exhibit 'B'* of this ordinance, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as *Exhibit 'B'*, which is deemed hereby to be a condition of approval of the amended zoning classification for the *Subject Property*;

SECTION 3. That development of the *Subject Property* shall generally be in accordance with the *Density and Development Standards*, outlined in *Exhibit 'D'* of this ordinance, attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference as *Exhibit 'D'*, which is deemed hereby to be a condition of approval of the amended zoning classification for the *Subject Property*;

SECTION 4. That a *Master Parks and Open Space Plan* for the *Subject Property*, prepared in accordance with this ordinance and consistent with the *Planned Development Concept Plan* described in *Exhibit 'B'* of this ordinance, shall be considered for approval by the City Council following recommendation of the Parks and Recreation Board.

SECTION 5. That development of the *Subject Property* shall be in conformance with the schedule listed below (*except as set forth below with regard to simultaneous processing and approvals*).

- (a) The procedures set forth in the City's subdivision regulations on the date this ordinance is approved by the City, as amended by this ordinance [including Subsections 5(b) through 5(g) below], shall be the exclusive procedures applicable to the subdivision and platting of the Subject Property.
- (b) The following plans and plats shall be required in the order listed below (except as set forth below with regard to simultaneous processing and approvals). The City Council shall act on an application for a Master Parks and Open Space Plan in accordance with the time period specified in Section 212.009 of the Texas Local Government Code.
 - (1) Master Parks and Open Space Plan
 - (2) Master Plat
 - (3) Preliminary Plat
 - (4) PD Site Plan
 - (5) Final Plat
- (c) <u>Master Parks and Open Space Plan</u>. A <u>Master Parks and Open Space Plan</u> for the <u>Subject Property</u>, as depicted in <u>Exhibit</u> 'B' of this ordinance, prepared in accordance with this ordinance, shall be considered for approval by the City Council following recommendation of the Parks and Recreation Board.
- (d) <u>Master Plat</u>. A <u>Master Plat</u> for the <u>Subject Property</u>, as depicted in <u>Exhibit</u> 'B' of this ordinance, shall be submitted and shall identify the proposed timing of each phase of the proposed development. A <u>Master Plat</u> application may be processed by the City concurrently with a <u>Master Parks and Open Space Plan</u> application for the development.
- (e) <u>Preliminary Plat</u>. A <u>Preliminary Plat</u> for each phase of the <u>Subject Property</u>, as depicted in <u>Exhibit</u> 'B' of this ordinance, shall be submitted in accordance with the phasing plan established by the <u>Master Plat</u> and shall include a <u>Treescape Plan</u> for the phase being <u>Preliminary Platted</u>. A <u>Preliminary Plat</u> application may be processed by the City concurrently with a <u>Master Plat</u> and a <u>Master Parks and Open Space Plan</u> application for the development.
- (f) <u>PD Site Plan</u>. A PD Site Plan for each phase of the development of the Subject Property, as depicted in Exhibit 'B' of this ordinance, shall be submitted and shall identify all site/landscape/hardscape plan(s) for all open space, neighborhood parks, trail systems, street buffers and entry features. A PD Site Plan application may be processed by the City concurrently with a Final Plat application for the development.
- (g) <u>Final Plat</u>. Prior to the issuance of any building permits, a *Final Plat*, conforming to the *Preliminary Plat*, shall be submitted for approval.

SECTION 6. That any person, firm, or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be punished by a penalty of fine not to exceed the sum of *Two Thousand Dollars* (\$2,000.00) for each offense and each and every day such offense shall continue shall be deemed to constitute a separate offense;

SECTION 7. That if any section, paragraph, or provision of this ordinance or the application of that section, paragraph, or provision to any person, firm, corporation or situation is for any reason judged invalid, the adjudication shall not affect any other section, paragraph, or provision of this ordinance or the application of any other section, paragraph or provision to any other person, firm, corporation or situation, nor shall adjudication affect any other section, paragraph, or provision of the Unified Development Code, and the City Council declares that it would have adopted the valid portions and applications of the ordinance without the invalid parts and to this end the provisions for this ordinance are declared to be severable;

SECTION 8. The standards in this ordinance shall control in the event of a conflict between this ordinance and any provision of the Unified Development Code or any provision of the City Code, ordinance, resolution, rule, regulation, or procedure that provides a specific standard that is different from and inconsistent with this ordinance. References to zoning district regulations or other standards in the Unified Development Code (including references to the *Unified Development Code*), and references to overlay districts, in this ordinance or any of the Exhibits hereto are those in effect on the date this ordinance was passed and approved by the City Council of the City of Rockwall, Texas;

SECTION 9. That this ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage;

- (1) <u>Permitted Uses</u>. Unless specifically provided by this Planned Development District ordinance, only those uses permitted within the Single Family 1 (SF-1) District, as stipulated by the *Permissible Use Charts* contained in Article 04, *Permissible Uses*, of the Unified Development Code (UDC), are allowed on the *Subject Property*.
- (2) <u>Lot Composition and Layout</u>. The lot layout and composition shall generally conform to the Concept Plan depicted in Exhibit 'B' and stated in Table 1, which is as follows:

(3) <u>Density and Dimensional Requirements</u>. Unless specifically provided by this Planned Development District ordinance, the development standards stipulated by the Single Family 1 (SF-1) District, as specified by Article 05, *District Development Standards*, of the Unified Development Code (UDC) are applicable to all development on the *Subject Property*. The maximum permissible density for the *Subject Property* shall not exceed <u>0.513</u> dwelling units per gross acre of land; however, in no case should the proposed development exceed <u>54</u> units. All lots shall conform to the standards depicted in *Table 2*, which are as follows:

General Notes:

- 1: Lots fronting onto curvilinear streets, cul-de-sacs and eyebrows may have the front lot width reduced by 20% as measured at the front property line and the rear lot width reduced provided that the lot width will be met at the Front Yard and Rear Yard Building Setback. Additionally, the lot depth on lots fronting onto curvilinear streets, cul-de-sacs and eyebrows may be reduced by up to ten (10) percent, but shall meet the minimum lot size for each lot type referenced in Table 1.
- 2: The location of the Front Yard Building Setback as measured from the front property line.
- 3: The *Maximum Height* shall be measured to the eave or top plate (*whichever is greater*) of the single-family home.
- 4: The location of the Rear Yard Building Setback as measured from the rear property line.
- 5: Sunrooms, porches, stoops, bay windows, balconies, masonry clad chimneys, eaves and similar architectural features may encroach beyond the *Front Yard Building Setback* by up to ten (10) feet for any property; however, the encroachment shall not exceed five (5) feet on *Side Yard Setbacks*. A sunroom is an enclosed room no more than 15-feet in width that has glass on at least 50% of each of the encroaching faces.
- 6: All *Corner Lots* that back to a lot that fronts onto the same street that the *Corner Lot* sides to (*i.e. a Keystone Lot*), shall have a side setback that is equal to the front setback of the fronting lot. In addition, no solid fence shall be situated within this setback.
- 7: Air-Conditioned Space.

- (4) <u>Building Standards</u>. All development shall adhere to the following building standards:
 - (a) <u>Masonry Requirement</u>. The minimum masonry requirement for the exterior façade of all buildings shall be 100.00% (excluding dormers and walls over roof areas). For the purposes of this ordinance, the masonry requirement shall be limited to full width brick, natural stone, and cast stone. Cementitious fiberboard (e.g. HardiBoard or Hardy Plank) in a horizontal lap-siding, board-and-batten siding, or a decorative pattern (see examples below) may be used for up to 80.00% of the masonry requirement; however, administrative approval from the Director of Planning and Zoning may be requested for housing plans that utilize cementitious fiberboard in excess of 80.00% of the masonry requirement on a case-by-case basis.

- (b) <u>Roof Pitch</u>. A minimum of an 8:12 roof pitch is required on all structures with the exception of dormers, sunrooms and porches, which shall have a minimum of a 4:12 roof pitch.
- (c) <u>Garage Orientation and Garage Doors</u>. This development shall adhere to the following garage design and orientation requirements:
 - (1) All lots as depicted in *Exhibit 'B'* may be oriented in a swing (*i.e. traditional swing or j-swing*), side entry, or recessed front entry garage configurations as defined in Article 13, *Definitions*, of the Unified Development Code (UDC). In a swing garage configuration, a second (*single or double*) garage door facing the street is permitted if it is behind the width of the double garage door in the swing configuration. Side entry garage configurations shall require a minimum driveway width of 20-feet.
 - (2) All garage configurations not conforming to the aforementioned garage configurations shall meet the requirements stipulated by Article 06, *Parking and Loading*, of the Unified Development Code (UDC). In addition, all garage configurations shall have upgraded finishes that consist of the following architectural elements: [1] coach lighting, [2] decorative wood doors or wood overlays on insulated metal doors, [3] include two (2) of the upgraded or enhanced finishes from *Figured 6 & 7* below, and [4] driveways that are constructed with ornamental stamped concrete brick pavers, stained finished, or salt finished. [see *Figures 5 7* for examples of the aforementioned garage and driveway features].

(5) <u>Anti-Monotony Restrictions</u>. The development shall adhere to the Anti-Monotony Matrix depicted in *Table 3* below (for minimum spacing requirements for the same or similar homes see Figures 8 & 9 below); however, only one (1) home per 25 homes may utilize the same or a similar building elevation that does <u>not</u> meet the requirements of Subsection (5)(b) below.

- (a) Identical brick blends or paint colors may not occur on adjacent (*side-by-side*) properties along any block face without at least five (5) intervening homes of differing materials on the same side of the street beginning with the adjacent property and six (6) intervening homes of differing materials on the opposite side of the street.
- (b) Front building elevations shall not repeat along any block face without at least five (5) intervening homes of differing appearance on the same side of the street and six (6) intervening homes of differing appearance on the opposite side of the street. The rear elevation of homes backing to open spaces or roadways shall not repeat without at least five (5) intervening homes of differing appearance. Homes are considered to have a differing appearance if any of the following four (4) items deviate:
 - (1) Number of Stories
 - (2) Permitted Encroachment Type and Layout
 - (3) Roof Type and Layout
 - (4) Articulation of the Front Façade
 - (5) Garage Orientation
- (c) Permitted encroachment (*i.e.* porches and sunroom) elevations shall not repeat or be the same along any block face without at least five (5) intervening homes of sufficient dissimilarity on the same side of the street beginning with the home adjacent to the subject property and six (6) intervening homes beginning with the home on the opposite side of the street.
- (d) Each phase of the subdivision will allow for a maximum of four (4) compatible roof colors, and all roof shingles shall be an architectural or dimensional shingle (3-Tab Roofing Shingles are prohibited).

- (6) <u>Fencing Standards</u>. All individual residential fencing and walls shall be architecturally compatible with the design, materials and colors of the primary structure on the same lot, adhere to the *Concept Plan* depicted in *Exhibit 'B'*, and meet the following standards:
 - (a) Front Yard Fences. Front yard fences shall be prohibited.
 - (b) <u>Wrought Iron/Tubular Steel</u>. All lots shall be required to install a wrought iron or tubular steel fence as depicted in the *Concept Plan* in *Exhibit 'B'* of this ordinance. Wrought iron/tubular steel fences shall be six (6) feet in height. In addition, lots located along the perimeter of roadways (i.e. SH-276 or a roadway larger than a Residential Street) shall provide masonry columns evenly spaced along the side and/or rear property line with columns not exceeding 45-foot centers -- that begin at the rear of the property line.
 - (c) <u>Corner Lots</u>. Corner lot fences (*i.e.* adjacent to the street) shall provide masonry columns evenly spaced along the side and/or rear property line with columns not exceeding 45-foot centers -- that begin at the rear of the property line. A six (6) foot wrought iron fence shall be required between the masonry columns along the side and/or rear lot adjacent to a street. The property owner shall be required to maintain both sides of the fence.
 - (d) <u>Fence in Easements</u>. No fencing shall be constructed in or across a franchise utility or the City of Rockwall's easements.
- (7) Landscape and Hardscape Standards.
 - (a) <u>Landscape</u>. Landscaping shall be reviewed and approved with the *PD Site Plan*. All Canopy/Shade Trees planted within this development shall be a minimum of four (4) caliper inches in size, all Accent/Ornamental/Under-Story Trees shall be a minimum of four (4) feet in total height, and all shrubs shall be a minimum of five (5) gallons.
 - (1) <u>Landscape Buffer Adjacent to SH-276</u>. A minimum of a 70-foot landscape buffer shall be provided along SH-276 (*outside of and beyond any required right-of-way dedication*), and shall incorporate ground cover, an undulating *built-up* berm, and shrubbery along the entire length of the frontage. Berms shall have a minimum height of 48-inches each. In addition, three (3) canopy trees and four (4) accent trees shall be planted per 100-feet of linear frontage. A meandering eight (8) foot trail shall be constructed within the 70-foot landscape buffer. All residential lots backing to SH-276 shall also incorporate an additional row of evergreen shrubs adjacent to the wrought-iron fencing along the rear property lines in the landscape buffer.

- (2) <u>Landscape Buffer Adjacent to Minor Collectors</u>. A minimum of a 30-foot landscape buffer shall be provided along SH-276 (outside of and beyond any required right-of-way dedication), and shall incorporate ground cover, an undulating built-up berm, and shrubbery along the entire length of the frontage. Berms shall have a minimum height of 48-inches each. In addition, three (3) canopy trees and four (4) accent trees shall be planted per 100-feet of linear frontage. An eight (8) foot trail shall be constructed within the 30-foot landscape buffer. All residential lots backing to a *Minor Collector* shall also incorporate an additional row of evergreen shrubs adjacent to the wrought-iron fencing along the rear property lines in the landscape buffer.
- (3) <u>Landscape Buffer Adjacent to Amenity Center</u>. A minimum of a ten (10) foot landscape buffer shall be provided along the roadway adjacent to the amenity center. This landscape buffer shall incorporate ground cover and shrubbery along the entire length of the adjacent street frontage. In addition, one (1) canopy tree and one (1) accent tree shall be planted per 50-linear feet.
- (b) <u>Street Trees</u>. The Homeowner's Association (HOA) shall be responsible for the maintenance of all street trees and will be required to maintain a minimum of 14-feet vertical clearance height for any trees overhanging a public right-of-way. Street trees shall be planted a minimum of five (5) feet from public water, sanitary sewer and storm lines that are less than ten (10) inches in size, and ten (10) feet from public water, sanitary sewer, and storm lines that are ten (10) inches and greater. In addition, no street trees shall be allowed to be located within public right-of-way. All street trees shall be reviewed with the *PD Site Plan*.
- (c) <u>Residential Lot Landscaping</u>. Prior to the issuance of a Certificate of Occupancy (CO), any residential lots depicted on *Exhibit 'B'* shall be landscaped with a minimum of two (2), four (4) inch caliper canopy trees (as measured per Article 08, Landscape and Fence Standards, of the Unified Development Code [UDC]) within the front yard. In addition, corner lots shall be required to add a minimum of two (2), four (4) inch caliper canopy trees (as measured per Article 08, Landscape and Fence Standards, of the Unified Development Code [UDC]) within the side yard facing the street.
- (d) <u>Irrigation Requirements</u>. Irrigation shall be installed for all required landscaping located within detention areas, common areas, landscape buffers and/or open space. Irrigation installed in these areas shall be designed by a Texas licensed irrigator or landscape architect and shall be maintained by the Homeowner's Association (HOA).
- (e) <u>Hardscape</u>. Hardscape plans indicating the location of all sidewalks and trails shall be reviewed and approved with the *PD Site Plan*.
- (8) <u>Streets</u>. All streets (excluding drives, fire lanes and private parking areas) shall be built according to City street standards.
- (9) <u>Lighting</u>. Light poles shall not exceed 20-feet in total height (*i.e. base and lighting standard*). All fixtures shall be directed downward and be positioned to contain all light within the development area.
- (10) <u>Sidewalks</u>. All sidewalks adjacent to a street shall be a maximum of two (2) feet inside the right-of-way line and be five (5) feet in overall width; however, trails adjacent to residential

lots -- as depicted in Exhibit 'C' of this ordinance -- shall be eight (8) feet in width and shall be permitted to extend up to two (2) feet outside the right-of-way, inside the residential lot, in a pedestrian access easement.

- (11) <u>Buried Utilities</u>. New distribution power-lines required to serve the <u>Subject Property</u> and the existing power-lines adjacent to SH-276 shall be placed underground, whether such lines are located internally or along the perimeter of the <u>Subject Property</u>, unless otherwise authorized by the City Council. Temporary power-lines constructed across undeveloped portions of the <u>Subject Property</u> to facilitate development phasing and looping may be allowed above ground, but shall not be considered existing lines at the time the area is developed, and if they are to become permanent facilities, such lines shall be placed underground pursuant to this paragraph. Franchise utilities shall be placed within a ten (10) foot public utility easement behind the sidewalk, between the home and the property line.
- (12) <u>On-Site Sewage Facilities</u>. Septic Systems are permitted pending conformance to the following standards:
 - (a) All Septic Systems shall be designed by a licensed On-Site Sewage Facility (OSSF) professional (e.g. licensed engineer, sanitarian, etcetera).
 - (b) A stamped and signed copy of the *Septic System* plans indicating the full limits of the septic field shall be submitted to the city at the time of building permit on a *lot-by-lot* basis.
 - (c) All Septic Systems shall be inspected and approved by the City's chosen inspector.
- (13) Open Space. The development shall consist of a minimum of 20.00% open space (or a minimum of 21.057 acres -- as calculated by the formula stipulated in the Comprehensive Plan), and generally conform to the Concept Plan contained in Exhibit 'B' of this ordinance. All open space areas (including landscape buffers) shall be included in the open space calculation, and maintained by the Homeowner's Association (HOA).
- (14) <u>Trails</u>. A minimum of an eight (8) foot concrete trail system shall be constructed generally in the same location as the trail system depicted in *Exhibit 'C'* of this ordinance.
- (15) <u>Amenities</u>. Amenities shall be constructed in generally the same area as depicted in *Exhibit* 'C' of this ordinance. In addition, the proposed amenity -- as depicted in *Exhibit* 'C' of this ordinance -- shall include at a minimum two (2) covered pickleball courts that generally conform to *Figure 10*. All amenities provided with this development shall be maintained by the Homeowner's Association (HOA). The final design and layout of the proposed amenities shall be approved with the *PD Site Plan*.

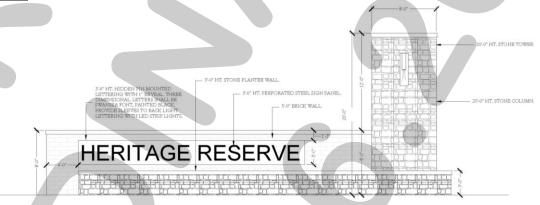

(16) <u>Neighborhood Signage and Enhancements</u>. Permanent subdivision identification signage shall be required at all major entry points for the proposed subdivision. Final design and location of any entry features shall be reviewed and approved with the *PD Site Plan*; however, the signage shall generally conform to *Figure 11* below. The developer shall provide enhanced landscaping areas at all entry points to the *Subject Property*. The final design of these areas shall be provided on the *PD Site Plan*.

- (17) <u>Homeowner's Association (HOA)</u>. A Homeowner's Association (HOA) shall be created to enforce the restrictions established in accordance with the requirements of *Section 38-15* of the *Subdivision Regulations* contained within the Municipal Code of Ordinances of the City of Rockwall. The HOA shall also maintain all private neighborhood parks, trails, open space and common areas (*including drainage facilities*), floodplain areas, irrigation, landscaping, screening fences, parallel parking and neighborhood signage associated with this development. These areas are required to be delineated on the *PD Site Plan*.
- (18) <u>Variances</u>. The variance procedures and standards for approval that are set forth in the Unified Development Code (UDC) shall apply to any application for variances to this ordinance.

SUBJECT: ART Commission Proposal - Mosaic Tractor for Rockwall

Purpose: The ART Commission proposes commissioning Rockwall County artist, Barbara Dybala, to create a mosaic tractor for the city of Rockwall. The project aims to enhance the city's visual appeal and draw visitors, reflecting our commitment to integrating art into the community. Ms. Dybala's Farm to Market themed mosaic tractor is designed to foster community interaction and has been successfully implemented in other venues, demonstrating its potential as a cultural landmark. After reviewing Ms. Dybala's extensive portfolio and visiting her Hidden Mosaic Studio, we are confident in her ability to deliver an outstanding piece on schedule and within budget.

Specs: The base is a Farmall H which is a medium-sized, two-plow, row crop tractor produced by International Harvester under the Farmall brand from 1939 to 1954. Several methods of fabrications will be used due to the three dimensionalities of the base tractor. The mosaic work will be created in the artist's studio on either fiberglass mesh backing, or double-indirect with an acrylic film face mounting. A majority of the work will be a direct mount to the tractor.

Project: The ART Commission would like to commission Rockwall County artist Barbara Dybala to create a mosaic tractor for the city of Rockwall. Ms. Dybala has provided a proposal for a Farm to Market theme mosaic tractor, which includes a detailed breakdown of costs.

Timeline: Proposed installation: May 2026, in time for the unveiling during Founders Day celebrations.

Installation Location: The Rockwall mosaic tractor will be installed near the museum at Harry Myers Park. The location will maximize visibility and interaction, contributing to the cultural vibrancy of the area.

Cost: \$56,200 includes tractor, design, materials, mosaic. We anticipate no more than \$5,000 for delivery, install, and location work. Total \$61,200.

Bio and Credentials: Barbara Dybala is a distinguished mosaic artist based in Rockwall, Texas. Her work includes large-scale mosaics and installations, with projects like Mosaic Orbs and Mosaic Murals widely recognized. She operates the Hidden Mosaic Studio and has contributed significantly to mosaic art education and practice. Ms. Dybala, an internationally acclaimed mosaic artist, has previously created three mosaic tractors, one of which was featured in the 2024 Mosaic Arts International juried exhibit.

BACKGROUND

Request for private business to enter into a concession agreement with City of Dallas and City of Rockwall for boat rentals on Lake Ray Hubbard off privately installed dock at The Harbor. This request went to Park Advisory Board on June 3, 2025 and September 8, 2025.

JUNE 3, 2025 / ORIGINAL REQUEST

- The City of Dallas has approved the request on Lake Ray Hubbard and has given permission to start the process of Rockwall looking into a concession agreement with the following stipulation from City of Dallas.
- No parasailing or traveling above the water in air.
- No units can dive under the water.
- Cannot store vessels at The Harbor.
- Fueling will have to be limited to dry land, or at the marina fueling center, not at individual slips. (Already a marina rule, no exceptions because he has a separate concession)
- Abide by all Marina rules regarding chemicals and fuel storage.

SUBJECT: Health Department permit fee adjustments in response to SB 1008

The recent passage of SB 1008 impacts the City's permit fee structure and specifically fees charged for food service establishments (FSE's).

Currently, the City issues a total of 307 food service establishments permits, consisting of restaurants, convenience stores and childcare businesses. These businesses are required to obtain one single FSE permit and pay the associated \$350 permit fee. In addition, 15 businesses exist that are required to obtain multiple FSE permits. Those businesses include grocery stores, hotels, hospitals and a golf and athletic club. These multi-department establishments have a combined total of 57 FSE departments, each requiring an FSE permit, with the city collecting our current FSE permit fee.

The challenge SB 1008 creates for us is it dictates a maximum fee a municipality can charge each establishment. That fee is now limited to \$773 annually. In addition, the bill prohibits Municipalities from requiring a permit or collecting a fee for alcoholic beverage permits, if the premises are a FSE and have already paid a fee to operate in our city. To more accurately recoup or cost, Council may want to consider amending our permit fee structure and the fees we charge for FSE's.

Staff is proposing additional adjustments to our Health Department permit fees. A survey was conducted of Cities, to evaluate fees they charge for FSE's. The proposed changes include raising our FSE permit fee to \$450. Making these adjustments will bring our FSE permit fees in line with our target cities. Staff is also proposing an increase in our Childcare establishment permits. I am providing you with an amended fee schedule for your consideration.

SB 1008 requires municipalities to notify stakeholders at least 60 days before a fee protocol is revised. To comply with this new law, staff plans to notify our FSE establishments following Council's decision on changes to our fee schedule. Staff will then plan to bring a fee resolution back to the Council after the 60 day period, for consideration to pass the resolution enacting the new fee amounts.

To All Taxing Entities,

Due to changes from the 88th legislative session, found in Sec. 5.13(d) of S.B. 2, <u>it is now time for the taxing units to appoint two (2) directors to serve a term of four (4) years.</u>

Texas Property Tax Code Sec. 6.0301(c) & (d): The Appraisal District is governed by a board of nine directors. Five directors are appointed by the taxing units that participate in the district in the manner prescribed by Section 6.03.

Texas Property Tax Code Sec. 6.03(d): The voting entitlement of a taxing unit that is entitled to vote for directors is determined by dividing the total dollar amount of property taxes imposed in the district by the taxing unit for the preceding tax year by the sum of the total dollar amount of property taxes imposed in the district for that year by each taxing unit that is entitled to vote, by multiplying the quotient by 1,000, and by rounding the product to the nearest whole number. That number is multiplied by the number of directorships to be filled.

Texas Property Tax Code Sec. 6.03(g): Each taxing unit . . . that is entitled to vote may nominate by resolution adopted by its governing body one candidate for each position to be filled on the board of directors. The presiding officer of the governing body of the unit shall submit the names of the unit's nominees to the chief appraiser before October 15.

Texas Property Tax Code Sec. 6.03(j): Before October 30, the chief appraiser shall prepare a ballot, listing the candidates whose names were timely submitted under Subsection (g) . . . alphabetically according to the first letter in each candidate's surname, and shall deliver a copy of the ballot to the presiding officer of the governing body of each taking unit that is entitled to vote.

Enclosed is a list reflecting each taxing unit's number of votes. Also included is an overview of the upcoming BOD election cycles, along with BOD member eligibility requirements.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS* FOR ROCKWALL CENTRAL APPRAISAL DISTRICT BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The Chief Appraiser has neither the authority nor the duty of investigating or judging the qualifications of nominees.

To be eligible to be a candidate for, or elected to, the Rockwall Central Appraisal District board of directors, a person must:

- 1) be a United States citizen;
- 2) be 18 years of age or older on January 1, 2025 (first day of term);
- 3) have not been determined by a final judgement of a court exercising probate jurisdiction to be:
 - a. totally mentally incapacitated; or
 - b. partially mentally incapacitated without the right to vote;
- 4) have not been finally convicted of a felony from which the person has not been pardoned or otherwise released from the resulting disabilities;
- 5) have been a resident of Rockwall County and must have resided in Rockwall County for at least two years immediately preceding the date the individual takes office on January 1, 2025;
- 6) on the date described by Subdivision (5), be registered to vote in Rockwall County; and
- 7) satisfy any other eligibility requirements prescribed by law for the office.
- 8) An individual who is otherwise eligible to serve on the board is not ineligible because of membership on the governing body of a taxing unit. (An employee of a taxing unit that participates in the district is not eligible to serve on the board unless the individual is also a member of the governing body or an elected official of a taxing unit that participates in the district.)

A person is ineligible to be a candidate for, or elected to, the Rockwall Central Appraisal District board of directors if the person:

- 1) is an employee of a taxing unit that participates in Rockwall County;
- 2) is related within the second degree of consanguinity or affinity, as determined under Chapter 573, Government Code, to an individual who is engaged in the business of appraising property for compensation for use in proceedings under the Texas Property Tax Code or of representing property owners for compensation in proceedings under the Texas Property Tax Code within Rockwall County;
- 3) owns property on which delinquent taxes have been owed to a taxing unit for more than 60 days after the date the individual knew or should have known of the delinquency unless:
 - a. the delinquent taxes and any penalties and interest are being paid under an installment payment agreement under section 33.02 of the Texas Property Tax Code; or
 - b. a suit to collect the delinquent taxes is deferred or abated under Section 33.06 or 33.065;
- 4) has engaged in the business of appraising property for compensation for use in proceedings under the Texas Property Tax Code at any time during the preceding three years;
- 5) has engaged in the business of representing property owners for compensation in proceedings under the Texas Property Tax Code in Rockwall County at any time during the preceding three years;
- 6) has been an employee of the Rockwall Central Appraisal District at any time during the preceding three years; or
- 7) has a substantial interest in a business entity that is party to a contract or the individual is a party to a contract with the CAD. This prohibition also applies to contracts with a taxing unit that participates in the CAD if the contract relates to the performance of an activity governed by the Tax Code (Tax Code Section 6.036(a)). An individual has a substantial business interest in a business entity if:
 - a. the combined ownership of the director and director's spouse is at least 10 percent of the voting stock or shares of the business entity; or
 - b. the director or director's spouse is a partner, limited partner or officer of the business entity.

WHEREAS, a taxing unit's entitlement is determined by dividing the total dollar amount of property taxes imposed in the district by the taxing unit for the preceding tax year by the sum of the total dollar amount of property taxes imposed in the district for that year by each taking unit entitled to vote, by multiplying the quotient by 1,000 and rounded to the nearest whole number; and

WHEREAS, according to the chart contained within the letter dated Sept. 5, 2025 and sent to the City of Rockwall via e-mail that same date by the appraisal district, the City of Rockwall will have <u>146</u> votes.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROCKWALL, TEXAS, AMENDING THE UNIFIED DEVELOPMENT CODE [ORDINANCE NO. 20-02] OF THE CITY OF ROCKWALL, AS HERETOFORE AMENDED, BY AMENDING SUBSECTION 06.05, SOUTHSIDE RESIDENTIAL NEIGHBORHOOD OVERLAY (SRO) DISTRICT, OF ARTICLE 05, DISTRICT DEVELOPMENT STANDARDS, EXHIBITS 'A' THROUGH 'E' OF THIS ORDINANCE; PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY OF FINE NOT TO EXCEED THE SUM OF TWO THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$2,000.00) FOR EACH OFFENSE; PROVIDING FOR A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR A REPEALER CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, an amendment to the City of Rockwall's Unified Development Code [Ordinance No. 20-02] has been initiated by the City Council in accordance with Subsections 02.01(B)(1) and 02.01(C)(1) of Article 11, Development Review Procedures, of the Unified Development Code (UDC) to make changes to the Southside Residential Neighborhood Overlay (SRO) District as contained in Article 05, District Development Standards, of the Unified Development Code (UDC) [Ordinance No. 20-02]; and,

WHEREAS, the Southside Residential Neighborhood Overlay (SRO) District was adopted on June 3, 1996 by *Ordinance No. 96-12* for the purpose of allowing "...flexibility necessary for the redevelopment [of the Southside Neighborhood] while protecting the integrity of the neighborhood ..."; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Rockwall has determined that changes to the Southside Residential Neighborhood Overlay (SRO) District -- *including changing the boundaries of the district* -- are needed to ensure the district continues to preserve the Southside Neighborhood while accommodating new residential infill development within the district; and,

WHEREAS, the Planning and Zoning Commission of the City of Rockwall and the governing body of the City of Rockwall in compliance with the laws of the State of Texas and the ordinances of the City of Rockwall have given the requisite notices by publication and otherwise, and have held public hearings and afforded a full and fair hearing to all property owners generally and to all persons interested in and situated in the city's corporate boundaries, and the governing body in the exercise of its legislative discretion, has concluded that *Ordinance No. 96-12* and the Unified Development Code [*Ordinance No. 20-02*] should be amended as follows:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROCKWALL, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That the approval of this ordinance shall supersede all requirements stipulated by *Ordinance No. 96-12*;

SECTION 2. That the current boundaries of the Southside Residential Neighborhood Overlay (SRO) District are described in *Exhibit 'A'* of this ordinance and depicted in *Exhibit 'B'* of this ordinance;

SECTION 3. That the Unified Development Code (UDC) [Ordinance No. 20-02] of the City of Rockwall, Texas, as here to fore amended, be and the same are hereby amended by amending the zoning map of the City of Rockwall so as to change the boundary of the Southside Residential Neighborhood Overlay (SRO) District as described in *Exhibit 'C'* of this ordinance and depicted in *Exhibit 'D'* of this ordinance;

SECTION 4. That Subsection 06.05, *Southside Residential Neighborhood Overlay (SRO) District*, of Article 05, *District Development Standards*, of the Unified Development Code [*Ordinance No. 20-02*] of the City of Rockwall, as heretofore amended, be and the same is hereby amended as specifically described in *Exhibit 'E'* of this ordinance;

SECTION 5. That the official zoning map of the City of Rockwall be corrected to reflect the changes in the zoning described herein;

SECTION 6. That all ordinances of the City of Rockwall in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance be, and the same are hereby repealed to the extent of that conflict.

SECTION 7. That any person, firm, or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be punished by a penalty of fine not to exceed the sum of *Two Thousand Dollars* (\$2,000.00) for each offense and each and every day such offense shall continue shall be deemed to constitute a separate offense;

SECTION 8. That if any section, paragraph, or provision of this ordinance or the application of that section, paragraph, or provision to any person, firm, corporation or situation is for any reason judged invalid, the adjudication shall not affect any other section, paragraph, or provision of this ordinance or the application of any other section, paragraph or provision to any other person, firm, corporation or situation, nor shall adjudication affect any other section, paragraph, or provision of the Unified Development Code [Ordinance No. 20-02], and the City Council declares that it would have adopted the valid portions and applications of the ordinance without the invalid parts and to this end the provisions for this ordinance are declared to be severable;

SECTION 11. That this ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage.

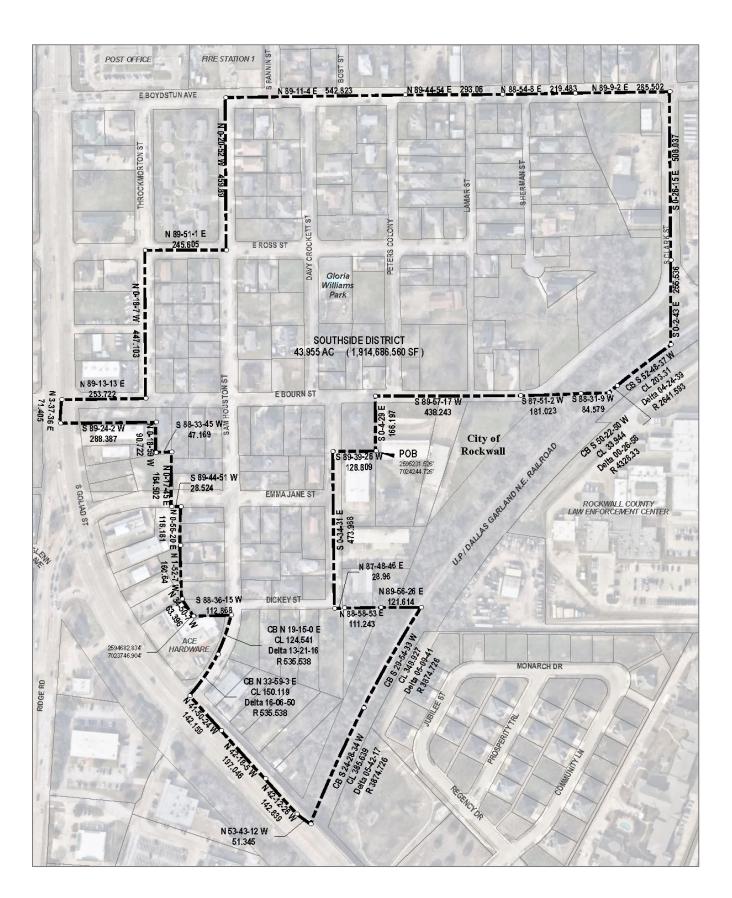

Overlay (SRO) District

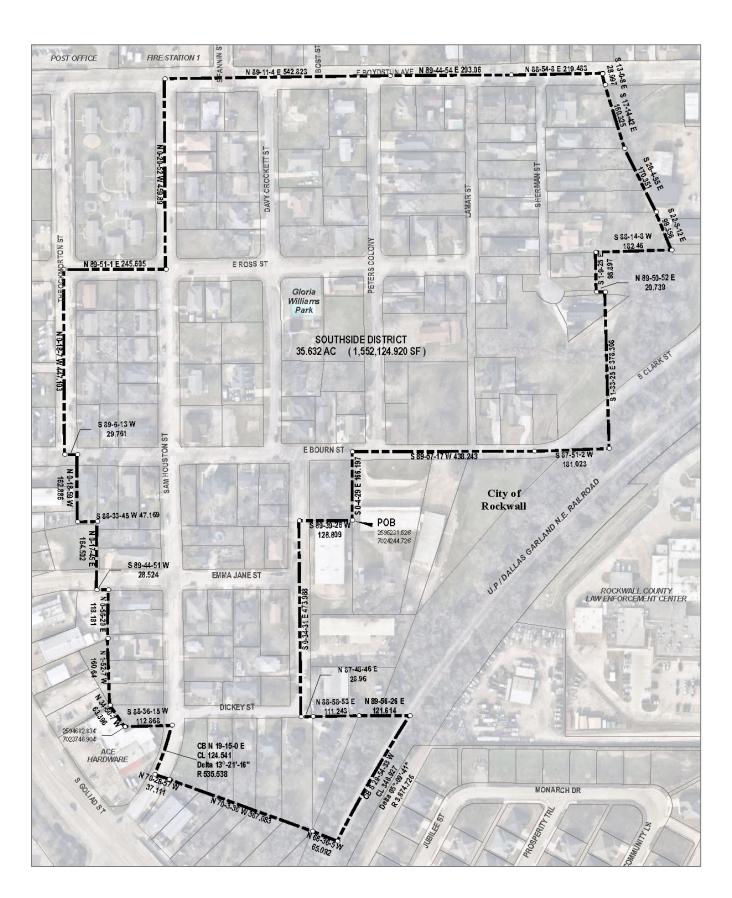

- (J) <u>Lighting Standards</u>. In addition to the requirements of the outdoor lighting requirements no light pole, pole base or combination thereof shall exceed 20 feet in the North Goliad Corridor Overlay District. All lighting fixtures shall focus light downward and be contained on the site. Lighting elements shall be incandescent, metal Halide, or halogen only. No HID or fluorescent lights (except fluorescent bulbs that screw into standard socket fixtures) may be used on the exterior of buildings. All street lighting shall meet the specifications for a B1 & B2 contained in <u>Subsection (I)</u>, <u>Streetscape Elements</u>, of Section 04.07, <u>Downtown (DT) District</u>, of the Unified Development Code (UDC).
- (K) <u>Variance</u>. The City Council may, upon request from the applicant, grant a variance to any provision of this section where unique or extraordinary conditions exist or where strict adherence to the provisions of this section would create a hardship. Approval of any variance to any provision of this section shall require City Council approval by a three-quarter majority vote of those City Council members present with a minimum of four affirmative votes.

SUBSECTION 06.05: SOUTHSIDE RESIDENTIAL NEIGHBORHOOD OVERLAY (SRO) DISTRICT

- (A) <u>Purpose</u>. The purpose of the overlay district is to provide the flexibility necessary for allowing infill and redevelopment of the Southside Neighborhood, while maintaining and protecting the character and integrity of the existing neighborhood.
- (B) <u>Other Requirements</u>. Any requirements not specifically stated in this section shall comply with the Single Family 7 (SF 7) District requirements.
- (C) Area Requirements.
 - (1) Minimum lot area: 5,000 square feet.
 - (2) Maximum number of single family detached dwellings units per lot: One.
 - (3) Minimum square footage per dwelling unit: 900 square feet.
 - (4) Minimum lot frontage on a public street: 50 feet.
 - (5) Minimum lot depth: 100 feet.
 - (6) Minimum depth of front yard setback: 20 feet.
 - (7) Minimum depth of rear yard setback: 10 feet.
 - (8) Minimum width of side vard setback:
 - (a) Internal lot: 6 feet.
 - (b) Abutting street: 15 feet.
 - (c) Abutting an arterial: 20 feet.
 - (9) Minimum distance between separate buildings on the same lot or parcel of land; ten feet.
 - (10) Minimum length of driveway pavement from the public right ofway for rear or side yards: 20 feet.
 - (11) Maximum building coverage as a percentage of lot area: 40%.
 - (12) Maximum building height: 32 feet.

- (13) Minimum number of paved off-street parking spaces required for:
 - (a) One single-family dwelling unit: Two (2) Parking Spaces. An enclosed garage shall not be considered in meeting the off-street parking requirements.
 - (b) All other uses: see <u>Article 06, Parking and Loading, of the Unified Development Code (UDC).</u>
- (D)(B) <u>Consideration of Special Request in Furtherance of Neighborhood Preservation</u>. The City Council may consider special requests in furtherance of neighborhood preservation and enhancement within the established neighborhood preservation overlay district. Such requests may include, but not necessarily be limited to neighborhood signage plans, the use of alternate building materials reductions in the building setbacks, or other requests submitted for consideration to the planning-Planning and zening Zoning departmentDepartment.

Upon receipt of such requests, the Planning and Zoning Commission shall review the case and forward a recommendation to the City Council for consideration. The City Council may approve special request. Any such approval shall preempt any other underlying zoning restrictions in the Unified Development Code (UDC). Such special requests may be denied by the City Council by the passage of a motion to deny.

Special requests shall \underline{not} include any request to change the land use of a property.

SUBSECTION 06.06: IH-30 OVERLAY (IH-30 OV) DISTRICT

- (A) <u>Purpose</u>. The intent of the IH-30 Overlay (IH-30 OV) District is to provide for consistent development of office, retail and commercial areas in concert with the most efficient and aesthetically pleasing appearance of the frontage, which serves as the initial impression to those visiting and passing through the City of Rockwall. In order to ensure that the visual impact of development does not detrimentally affect the area in which it is proposed, landscaping plans, building elevations and site plans are required. Architectural compatibility will be reviewed through the Architectural Review Board (ARB). These development requirements shall apply to non-residential and multi-family land uses only, single-family land uses shall be excluded from these standards except as otherwise stated.
- (B) Application and Boundaries. The IH-30 Overlay (IH-30 OV) District includes the entirety of all properties which adjoin or are located within 500-feet of the future right-of-way of IH-30. The IH-30 Overlay (IH-30 OV) District spans east to west along IH-30 from the eastern city limits (approximately 3,600-feet east of FM 549), west to the western city limit line along Lake Ray Hubbard. The standards and regulations set forth in the IH-30 Overlay (IH-30 OV) District are superimposed and shall supersede the standards and regulations of any underlying zoning district which are in conflict.
- (C) <u>Overlay District Standards</u>. If any portion of a property is situated within the boundaries of the IH-30 Overlay (IH-30 OV) District, the entire property shall be subject to the requirements of <u>Section 06.02</u>, <u>General Overlay District Standards</u>.

SUBSECTION 06.07: SH-205 OVERLAY (SH-205 OV) DISTRICT

WHEREAS, the Planning and Zoning Commission of the City of Rockwall and the governing body of the City of Rockwall, in compliance with the laws of the State of Texas and the ordinances of the City of Rockwall, have given the requisite notices by publication and otherwise, and have held public hearings and afforded a full and fair hearing to all property owners generally, and to all persons interested in and situated in the affected area and in the vicinity thereof, the governing body in the exercise of its legislative discretion has concluded that the Unified Development Code (UDC) [Ordinance No. 20-02] of the City of Rockwall should be amended as follows:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Rockwall, Texas;

SECTION 1. That the Unified Development Code (UDC) [Ordinance No. 20-02] of the City of Rockwall, Texas, as heretofore amended, be and the same are hereby amended by amending the zoning map of the City of Rockwall so as to change the zoning of the Subject Property from a Multi-Family 14 (MF-14) District to a Single-Family 7 (SF-7) District;

SECTION 2. That the *Subject Property* shall be used only in the manner and for the purposes provided for a *Single-Family 7 (SF-7) District* as stipulated in Subsection 01.01, *Use of Land and Buildings*, of Article 04. *Permissible Uses*; and, Subsection 03.01. *General Residential District*
